WAGE CONTROL ON STATE WORK. Chairman W. R. Ely of the state highway commission, who is for the enactment of the 42nd legislature of a mini-mum wage law for laborers engaged on public work in Texas, has a champion in the person of the editor of the Victoria Advocate. Victoria has extensive public improvements un-der way. This is the attitude of the Advocate: "Many of the public improvements approved and pro-jected at this time are for the expressed purpose of relieving unemployment and attendant business depression. If con-tractors engaged in public works are to be permitted to take advantage of these projects to the extent of under-paying and over-working labor then the main purpose of expediting public improvements will be defeated."
