Telegram for Santa. We only asked for one thing as we want to share with the other tots. We had Christmas music on the stereo during December.


Mrs. Finley served the tots frosted cookies with dainty frostings and Christmas candy on Monday, with red punch.



Recipe for using electricity more efficiently for cooking.

When cooking foods in liquid — whether in an electric skillet, crock pot, Dutch oven or on your range — use the lowest heat setting that will maintain a boil.

Don't open the oven door unnecessarily. Opening the oven door when the oven is hot can cause heat loss and extended cooking time.

For toasting bread, use a toaster or portable toaster-oven instead of your range oven. The smaller appliances are more efficient for this job.

Reduce cooking time by thawing meats before cooking them. When recipes call for a preheated oven, don't turn it on too far in advance — usually 10 to 15 minutes will do.

Use flat-bottomed pans.

The flatter the pan, the better the contact with the electric unit. Be sure the pans have tight-fitting lids to reduce cooking time and moisture loss. Match pan size to unit size to avoid heat loss.

Plan one-dish meals that can be cooked in a portable electric appliance such as a skillet, deep fat fryer, Dutch oven or crock pot.

Holy Journey Made By Decree

Wise Men Follow Guiding Star to Jesus



JOURNEY OF THE MAGI — This symbolic tempera on wood by 15th century artist Sassetta of Siena, Italy, in part, depicts the rugged roads and methods of transportation during Biblical times. "And it came to pass in those days that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed." So begins the Bible story of the birth of Christ in Saint Luke's Gospel.

"All the world," of course, meant the Roman Empire of the time, and the "taxation" referred to was basically an "enrollment," according to biblical scholars, a census, leading ultimately to a land tax; so it was decreed that "All went to be taxed, every one into his own city."

And so, Saint Luke goes on to tell us, "Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, to be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child."

The Bible gives us little more than those bare facts about the journey which ended at a manger outside Bethlehem. It has remained for biblical scholars and archaeologists to try to fill in the details as best they can from facts known or guessed about the Palestine of that time and from other indirect evidence in the Bible itself.

Although Joseph was a Judean by ancestry, he lived and plied his trade as carpenter some 70 miles to the north in Nazareth in Galilee, where Jesus spent his early years thus becoming identified as Jesus of Nazareth.

There was a good road leading southward from Nazareth to Jerusalem and Bethlehem, for this was no "backwoods" area but one traversed by merchants and their caravans as well as functionaries of the Roman Empire, all following in the footsteps of invaders and travellers of many years.

A journey of some 70 miles over mostly hilly country without a car might give many of us pause today, particularly in view of Mary's condition. According to tradition, Mary rode a good part of the way on an ass, a common beast of burden and one certainly more appropriate to the task than either camel or horse, even had these been available to Joseph.

A journey of that distance, with Joseph walking and leading the ass, would be bound to consume several days, so it is likely that the travellers made provision for spending some nights along the way and, also, carried sufficient food and water in case supplies were not always available.

Although Nazareth was a fair-sized town, it was reported to have had only one good source of water, known today as Mary's Well, from which it would have been prudent to obtain a "canteen" before setting out on a journey. Wells and springs were to be found infrequently in the hills, particularly toward the end of the dry season, which historians believe was the most likely period for the trip of Mary and Joseph. As to food, there would have been no problem in procuring rations of bread, olives, and other provisions for the journey from an area as rich in agriculture as Galilee.

Arrival at their destination in Bethlehem did not bring an end to "roughing it" for the travellers, for there were so many who had preceded them that "there was no room for them at the inn." Therefore, this predicament led Mary and Joseph to the manger, a cattle shelter outside Bethlehem which symbolizes the birth of Jesus.

Bor Funds Split Local

AUSTIN—City and county recreation projects will receive almost \$5 million this year due to action by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission.

The commissioners voted to split federal money from the Land and Water Conservation fund on a 70 to 30 basis with local projects getting the lion's share of the money.

State parks will receive 30 percent of the 1975 fiscal year allocation from the fund.

In the same action the commission voted to review local projects semi-annually and support 14 new projects for Dallas, Fort Worth, Hedwig Village, Mansfield, Missouri City, Seabrook, Bedford, Carthage, Huntsville, the LCRA* Longview, Nixon, Smithville and Weatherford.

The commission also approved approximately \$215,000 in additional matching funds to complete neighborhood park sites and a greenbelt project in Dallas.

City Park Gets Federal Money

AUSTIN—A \$110,900 development project for Webster City Park in Webster has been announced by Gov. Dolph Briscoe. Half of the project will be paid for by the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation's Land and Water Conservation Fund, and half will be paid by the City of Webster.

The project includes construction of roads, parking areas, restrooms, ballfields, fencing, bleachers, tot lot, picnic units, tennis courts, volleyball standards, football goalposts and a jogging path.

Pecans Add Festive Flavor

COLLEGE STATION—Pecans may be expensive but there's a good reason and they are still a good value.

"This year's pecan crop is smaller than last year's and prices increase as supplies decrease."

COMPARE PECAN COSTS. Consumers can compare costs of shelled pecans versus unshelled pecans as one way of making them more economical.

In well-filled out pecans, about half the weight is nutmeats. So, at 89 cents a pound for pecans in shells, a pound of the pecan nutmeats costs about \$1.78.

Compare this with the cost of pecans already shelled to decide if the difference is worth the time and effort involved in shelling pecans.

Of course, half pound and one-pound packages of shelled pecans are better buys than the small packages of just two or four ounces, the specialist pointed out.

CHOOSING PECANS. For pecans in the shell, look for those that are clean and free of scars, cracks or holes. They should be well filled, so the kernel won't rattle.

For shelled pecans, look for plump, meaty kernels. Nutmeats should be crisp and brittle, and if they'll serve as garnish, they should be uniform in size and color.

STORING PECANS. Nuts in the shell keep better than shelled nuts, and unsalted nuts keep better than salted ones, the specialist noted.

As a rule, the lower the temperature, the longer pecans will keep.

ORANGE PECAN BREAD. 1 egg, 1 cup orange juice, 1 cup raisins finely cut, 1 Tbsp. grated orange rind, 2 Tbsp. shortening melted and cooled slightly, 1 tsp. vanilla, 2 cups sifted flour, 1 tsp. baking powder, 1/2 tsp. baking soda, 1/4 tsp. salt, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup pecans chopped.

Beat egg; stir in orange juice, raisins, orange rind, shortening and vanilla. Sift flour, baking powder, soda, salt and sugar into liquid mixture. Mix well. Stir in pecans. Pour into well-greased 5x9x2 1/2 inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

PECAN BALLS. 1 cup butter or marg., 1/2 cup confectioners sugar, 1/2 tsp. salt, 2 tsp. vanilla, 2 cups sifted flour, 2 cups finely chopped pecans, Cream butter or margarine and sugar. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Chill dough 2 hours. Shape dough into 1 inch balls and place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake 350 degrees.





What Is A Texas Drivers License?

AUSTIN--What is a Texas drivers license?

That small, laminated card that more than 7.4 million Texas residents carry is issued by the Department of Public Safety in Austin and is designed to certify that the holder has qualified and is eligible to share use of public streets and highways with others.

Roy (Butch) Petty, Drivers License Patrolman in Eastland County, says that's the only official purpose the license is designed to perform. "This is the only reason for such card to exist," he said.

However, he's quick to state, the Texas driver's license actually serves many secondary purposes. The license was never intended to "indicate to anyone that a person has money in the bank yet it's used in cashing checks;

"It was never intended to establish a person's age in order that the individual might purchase intoxicating beverages;

"Nor, was the drivers license designed to reflect the fact that the holder is a stable, conscientious person who is qualified to fill certain positions in life", Petty noted.

The DPS license on West

Main in Eastland is open Monday and Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Bonnie Ervin is Drivers License Clerk.

The license is used in these instances, and there are many other circumstances in which the Texas drivers license is utilized over and above its intended purposes. For example, some people put their license number on personal property for identification in the event of theft or loss.

Said Col. Wilson E. Speir, DPS director, "The licensing and the improvement of unsafe drivers may well be called the first line of defense in our overall traffic improvement program. Without knowledgeable and well-trained drivers, safety on the highways suffers.

"Driving in modern day traffic is no simple task. It can be easier, safer and more pleasant if everyone knows and understands the fundamentals of street and highway safety. Your survival may depend on your understanding and knowledge of driving and the laws which our department upholds."

Lt. Murry Peterson, a 23-year

veteran of the Drivers License Service, said there are three primary classifications of licenses issued by DPS. These include the operator's license, which authorizes the driving of passenger cars and light commercial motor vehicles that have a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity not to exceed 2,000 pounds; a commercial license that is used in the transportation of property; and the chauffeurs license for persons who drive motor vehicles for wages, compensation or hire, or for fare.

Perry said other licenses are also issued by the department. One is the instruction permit which permits a student driver to legally practice when accompanied by a licensed driver. The minimum age for such a permit is 15 with driver education or with approval of a hardship application.

Another type license is the motorcycle permit for the young at heart who operate a motorcycle, motor scooter or a motorized bicycle. This license may be issued as a separate, restricted license for motorcycle operation only, or as a "motorcycle also" endorsement on a license already held by the driver.

The minimum age for the two-wheeler license is 18 (16 with approved driver education courses). Another type motorcycle license allows 15 year olds to operate two wheelers that have an engine piston displacement not exceeding 100 cc. (Driver education is not required under this latter condition).

Occupational licenses are issued to persons whose licenses have been suspended, and who must drive in connection with their occupation. Perry said applications for this type of license must be made to the District Court Judge of the county of residence and if a need is found to exist, the court will authorize the Department to issue such license within the guidelines established by the court.

How, then, does one go about getting one of these handy little cards which has just one primary purpose, yet is so versatile that merchants in Texas seem to require one to ascertain certain traits about the holder?

When you or I initially apply for our drivers license, the first step at one of the 223 different statewide examination stations is to fill out the appropriate form. Applicants are required to list their full name and establish evidence of their legal date and place of birth. "A birth certificate is needed in order to accomplish this," Lt. Peterson added, or in the case of an out-of-state resident who is moving to Texas, his former valid drivers license is acceptable.

Peterson went on to add that once a newcomer to Texas has established his residency in the state for 30 days, then that person is required by state statute to acquire a valid Texas drivers license. "That's the law", he emphasized.

The application form, which is made a permanent part of your driving record, includes among other items, personal history information and your medical history.

Peterson said when the application form is completed a vision test is administered. This is followed by a written test, and then it's time for a behind-the-wheel examination with a DPS trooper riding in the front seat with you.

"The one exception to that is if you are applying for a motorcycle license. Then you are required to have another driver and passenger vehicle to

transport the examining trooper who will accompany you throughout the road test with a motorcycle. We use a horn signal system to indicate when the rider is to turn or make a simulated emergency stop", Peterson said.

After these steps are accomplished and all the requirements are fulfilled successfully, a color photograph is made and a temporary driving receipt issued. "After the required fees

are collected and the temporary permit issued, in about 27 to 30 days, you receive your drivers license by mail", he added.

But, behind the scenes are a multitude of people working to serve those Texans holding a Texas drivers license.

Film cassettes containing the color photographs and applications from each of the examining stations in the state, are

are processed. The film counter must agree with the number of applications and the fees collected must balance. "An audit trail has begun", he said. "At this point the applicant's permanent file is started from the basic application form and the film is taken to another area for processing and printing the actual license", he added. The division serves as the central repository for more than 8,000,000 drivers in the state and issues almost 3,000,000 licenses annually, in addition to other administrative tasks of the overall drivers license program. The Drivers License Service, consisting of some 375 uniformed troopers plus clerical

personnel in the field, conducts about 800,000 examinations for driver licenses each year, and carry out approximately 250,000 driver improvement actions annually. This field service is a unit of the DPS Traffic Law Enforcement Division, commanded by Chief Joe Milner of Austin.

But the supporting services offered by almost 300 full-time employees play a major role in getting your license to you. When the film processing of the license is completed and returned to another section within the division, each license is checked for accuracy and to ascertain that the supporting records correctly reflect proper status. When all is in order, the driver license is mailed to you at your permanent address.

As part of the total responsibility of licensing drivers, the DPS is required by state statute to maintain and up-to-date case history file on each licensed driver for use in identifying individuals who either cannot or will not share use of the public streets and highways with others in a reasonably safe and legal manner.

"We have a driver improvement and control bureau which is designed to improve identified problem drivers," Perry said. "We want to improve this type driver if possible. Otherwise, we must by law restrict or suspend his license," he emphasized.

A driver is defined by law as a "habitual violator" if the individual receives four or more convictions arising out of different transactions or offenses which occur within a 12 month period, or seven or more convictions during a 24 month period. Temple said that before the DPS can suspend a license an administrative hearing must be conducted by the judge of a traffic court (justice of the peace or municipal court) in the county in which the driver resides.

"The department's position at such a hearing is to present the records and facts in the case for use by the judge in determining whether or not the driving privilege is to be restricted or suspended," he said.

Driving records of individuals are maintained at the DPS headquarters by means of a third-generation computer system to make pertinent information readily available.

"All traffic convictions and reports of motor vehicle accident involvement are entered into the system", Petty said, and added, that "any subsequent application for renewal is checked to determine if that individual is entitled to a new license. We are a large volume administrative agency", he stressed, "and must utilize available high speed resources to properly serve public needs and provide reasonable safeguards to prevent unqualified and ineligible persons from obtaining licenses."

Automatically, certain entries in driving records are purged when they become five years old, Temple said. "The data processing system purges moving traffic violations and motor vehicle accident entries from a

driving record five years after the date of occurrence. An insurance company bases rates and establishes penalty points generally, on an individual's past driving history. However, the insurance rates and penalty assessments are on a driver's immediate past three-year history", he added.

Reasons for the driver improvement program, according to Temple, are to prevent the development of a bad driving record through early warning, to determine the causes of unsafe driving, to secure the cooperation of the drivers who cannot or will not be corrected.

All states in the United States require licensing of drivers. First licenses were issued in 1903 in Massachusetts while the last state in the US to require licensing of drivers was South Dakota in 1952.

Texas' program was begun with the creation of Senate Bill No. 15, that was approved Nov. 15, 1935. That act required each driver of a motor vehicle to possess either an operator's or a chauffeur's license on and after April 1, 1936.

Originally in the Lone Star State, the county tax assessor-collectors were designated as the Department's agents to handle the issuance of licenses, without examination.

The DPS became responsible for all functions in connection with the licensing of drivers on May 19, 1937. In order to properly administer the amended law, the DPS trained and assigned 32 troopers to the specific duty of examining applicants for original Texas licenses. They were assisted by other troopers and clerical personnel. The first real attempt to develop a driver improvement program through the suspension of driving privileges also came about in the same year.

Extensive progress was made in standardizing and improving examination procedures between the years of 1937 and 1941, Petty said.

The Regular Session of the 46th Legislature in 1941 passed the present Drivers License Law and for the first time prescribed a fee for the issuance of a driver's license. Operator's licenses were 50 cents; commercial licenses were one dollar and chauffeur's licenses were three dollars. Presently, drivers are levied a \$7 fee for a four-year operator's license; \$10 for a two year commercial license and \$13 for a two year chauffeur's permit.

In 1971, the Legislature authorized DPS to issue personal identification cards, occupational licenses and instruction permits. The ID card is issued for a four year period for \$5. Occupational licenses may be issued up to one year for a \$3 fee. An instruction permit has a minimum fee of \$2 and can be issued for up to one year from the applicant's next birth date. That handy Texas drivers license which about two thirds of the state's nearly 12 million residents have is backed and processed by hundreds of "professional public safety workers".

"The advice of a DL trooper is often sought on new and unusual problems in the safety field--which adds interest and incentive to the job. "Thus", he continued, "the driver license troopers continually add to their mental alertness, legal knowledge and social awareness--characteristics which automatically tend to prepare an individual for positions of greater responsibility."

"The work which our troopers do for every applicant may literally mean the difference between life and death. Therefore, a professional Drivers License trooper may take just pride in the feeling that he is serving in a position of trust and responsibility", Perry concluded.

Washington, D.C. -- Pago Pago, San Juan, St. Thomas, Guam! A travel brochure? No. A listing of communities hard at work on projects and programs commemorating the Bicentennial of the United States.

Along with all 50 States, each of these United States territories or possessions has an active Bicentennial Commission coordinating a variety of projects under national Bicentennial thematic areas of Heritage, Festival and Horizon.

In Pago Pago, American Samoa, the Bicentennial Commission is planning at least three major efforts for the island's population of 28,051.

The "Early Childhood Teacher Training Center" will be part of an education program currently sponsored by the Department of Education. School children in Samoa, a possession of the United States since 1900, generally hear the Samoan language spoken at home, but are taught in the official language -- English. The new facility for educating instructors in effective ways of teaching these children will be dedicated on July 4, 1976.

American Samoa's Bicentennial planning also includes an addition of an art gallery to the Museum of American Samoa and the creation of a botanical garden at the Government House. The garden project includes the collection, identification and cultivation of indigenous food, ceremonial, medicinal and ornamental plants for public exhibition, research and education.

"Return to Guam for Guamanians" is a Festival USA project sponsored by the Bicentennial Commission to encourage Guamanians living on the mainland to visit the Island during 1976 to participate in its year long celebration.

"Guam Park" is a project to develop a 4,000 acre conservation reserve into a wildlife and outdoor recreation area, including an artificial lake.

Other Bicentennial efforts on Guam include the creation of courses at the University of Guam covering "The History and Culture of Guam," and a "Cultural Revival" project featuring performances ranging from cultural renditions of the Pacific Islands to 20th century music.

Guam, because of its time zone, is "Where America's day begins," and the Island will hold the nation's first celebration on July 4, 1976. Guam was ceded to the United States by Spain in 1898. Its population is 87,000.

The Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has nine officially designated Bicentennial communities and is well underway in its planning of Bicentennial events.

Puerto Rico, population 2,712,500, was also ceded to the United States by Spain in 1898, and became a commonwealth in 1952.

The City of San Juan will restore the old "Casino de Puerto Rico" to serve as a meeting place for social occasions, exhibitions, concerts, seminars, lectures, etc.

Other Bicentennial plans include: International Congress of "Jeunesses Musicales": an international congress at young musicians from all parts of the world to convene in San Juan in 1976. Approximately 2,000 artists will come to the Island for 10 to 14 days to present concerts and learn the traditions and cultural background of Puerto Rico.

In the Virgin Islands, acquired by purchase in 1916 - 17 and now with a population of 63,000 the Bicentennial Commission hopes to develop a program in the event, American tourist visiting any of these sites during the Bicentennial era will find they have not left the commemoration of the nation's first 200 years being.


