Millenium to Be Ushered In War God Mars has been a ter ror since the very beginning of recorded history. Man has been a fighting brute since his first appearance on the surface of the earth. Now the millenium is to be ushered in by the tribes of man.

That remarkable document known as the Kellogg-Briand treaty for renunciation of war was proclaimed July 24 by Pres. Herbert Hoover at a simple House ceremony.

Speaking of the treaty the pres ident said "it suggested a new step in international law, and repra sented a platform from which there is instant appeal to the public opinion of the world as to specific acts and deeds."

And then in conclusion the president added that "he would dare predict that the influence of the treaty for the renunciation of war during the school period. will be felt in a large proportion of all future international acts."

He announced that the "laying down of three American cruiserwould be suspended until there has been an opportunity for full consideration of their effect upon the final agreement for parity with Great Britain that I expect to be reached."

Prime Minister Ramsey Mac Donald of the British empire on the other side of the Atlantic was in the picture at the same time that Pres. Hoover was proclaiming to the world the treaty for renunciation of war.




