POOR GIRL

DEAN OF TEXAS POETS' FIRST **VOUME OUT ON 77TH BIRTHDAY**

Just 58 years ago on Monday, March 25, a certain Swedish vessel landed on Galveston bar, carrying on board a young second mate who later became known as "The Dean of Texas Poets." John P. Sjolander's twentieth anniversary also fell on the very day his ship came to anchor in Texan waters.

When the ship cleared for her return trip to Europe, the second mate was missing. It was not that he loved the sea less, perhaps, but the soil more Perhaps.

mate was missing. It was not that he loved the sea less, perhaps, but the soil more. Perhaps he was lured by the beauty of the Texas coast country. At any rate he filed inland to the spot that has been his home for more than a half century.

Who's Who in America lists Sjolander simply as a farmer and writer who resides at Cedar Bayou, Texas. Few Texans are aware of his romance-tinged life story for this extraordinary poet is distinguished for his modesty. It is only in his seventy-eighth year and upon the insistence of his friends that he has allowed his poems to be collected into his poems to be collected into book form, the Southwest Press of Dallas hawing recently issued his "Salt of the Earth and Sea."
