

"PAUL'S DEFENSE BEFORE

Acts 26 - 1 to 29.

By way of introduction Rev Wrye explained that Paul, then a prisoner at Jerusalem was brought to Cesarea under cover of the night 200 spearmen and 70 horsemen, following a dissension between the Pharasees and Sadusees. Which reulted in a band of Jews 40 in number banding themselves gether under a curse that they would neither eat or sleep until

they had killed Paul. Once safe in Caesera we find that Paul makes his own defense before Felix the governor, who trembling said "go thy way I will hear thee at a more convenient

Felix sent for Paul often and to do the Jews a pleasure left him bound for more than two years at which time Parcius Festus was made governor in Felix place. Shortly after Festus came into

the province he was visited by King Agrippa and his wife Bernice who came in all their pomp and splendor . Festus told the King of Paul the notorious prisoner and declared his cause unto him. Then Agrippa asked to hear Paul, and it was on this memorable occasion that we have recorded one of the most eloquent speeches of the Bible, "Paul's Defense Before

Bro. Wrye pointed out to the class the missionary spirit Paul That he a prisoner and bound, yet he thought not of his own freedom but of saving the souls of those to whom he spoke. Namely Festus-the governor of a province and yet heathen because he knew no God, and Agrippa a King, educated in the law of Moses and the Crophets but not a believer in Christ. Paul begins his defense by tell-

ing of his manner of life from his youth, his conversion, and later his preaching the gospel, for which gospels sake he was thrown in

As Paul spoke in this manner As Paul spoke in this manner his audience was moved. Festus, the heathen, cried out with a loud voice, "Paul thou art beside thyself, much learning lift he made thee mad" while Agrippa in a more reserved state of mind said unto Paul, "Almost thou persuadist me to be a Christian" Whether or not either of these men became Christians we do not know, but we do know that Paul the Mission. we do know that Paul the Mission ary did his part by making known unto them the gospel.


