Obtains Consent To Buy Capital Stock of K. C. M. & O. Railway, Effective September 24th.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 29. Reorganization plans of the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient Railway were approved today by the Interstate Commerce Com-Railroad company to acquire con-trol of the properties of the Kan-sas City, Mexico and Orient R. R. by purchase of its capital stock.

The new company was authorized to issue 35,000 shares of capital stock without par value for the purpose of acquiring the properties of the old company and was permitted to assume liability for a \$2,500,000 note given by the receiver of the old company to the secretary of the treasury.


The reorganization is for the purpose of allowing the Santa Fe railway to acquire control of the Orient which becomes effec-tive September 24.




