Peopel who are old, blind, or totally disabled and live on a fixed income each month may be eligible for more money through a program called Supplemental Security Income (SSI).

Project Supplemental Security Income- Alert is a nationwide effort to inform the elderly, blind, or disabled that they may be eligible for additional monthly income.

The Taylor County Chapter of Red Cross has been asked by the Governor's Council on Aging to lead this project and assist the District Social Security office by locating those needing supplementary help. We need the help of volunteers in each of our fifteen counties: Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Jones, Haskell, Kent, Mills, Nolan, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, and Taylor

Judge and Mrs. Clyde SSI assistance will be available to eligible persons who live alone and make less than \$160.00 a month; a couple making less than \$230.00 a month may be eligible.

"You are probably eligible if your income is less than this, and you own very little property or have few other resources", said Miss Olsen in giving further explanation.





The Consumer Alert

by John L. Hill Attorney General

Ever wonder what happend when you call the Attorney General's office with a complaint about what you consider an unfair business practice?

The Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division staff has worked out as system that has allowed us to receive and process more than 4,932 consumer complaints since I took office in January, 1973.

We have recovered more than \$232,000 for defrauded consumers in that time. And, in many more ases, complaints were settled before a consumer actually lost money

Our office in Austin alone averages 225 telephone calls bout consumer problems every week, and about 85 written complaint forms come in during the same time span. The Attorney General's regional offices in Dallas, Houston, San Antonio, Lubbock, and El Paso also receive many calls an-

dletters each week. Legal work on such a scale requires that our system be efficient, or else compalints might go unanswered or be delayed for weeks or months. Here is how we go about

handling the calls and letters we get regarding consumer problems:

Wehn a complaint is received by letter or telephone, a standard comlaint form is sent for the consumer to complete. It gives us the basic facts about the business transaction and provides space for the consumer to describe what he feels

Copies of contaracts, sales receipts, advertisements, or other pertinent documents relating to the matter should be enclosed withthe complaint form. If it is difficult for a person to get copies, weask them to send us the originals, which we duplicate for our use, and return to them.

If the returned form indicates that there may have been a deceptive business practice, misrepresentation of a guarantee or warranty, or false or misleadin advertising, the case is assigned to one of our Consumer Protectiond Dvision staff members, a file is opened, and preliminary analysis is begun.

We realize that tm someone with a problem, even a fee days seems like a long time to wait, so the same day we receive the complaint form, we send a postcard acknowledgment. This lets the consumer know ee have begun to work on his problem.

If examination of a complaint shows that another agency is the one to assist the consumer, or that the Attorney General simply does not have jurisdictio in the matter, we supply the name and address of the appropriate agency to contact. Often we suggest that a private attorney could be of help with

lgal advice, which by law we cannot give to private individuals.

A complaint received from an area of the state covered by one of our regional offices is referred to that office for handling.

After analyzing the consumr's complaint, the lawyer assigned to the case notifies the company or individual of the compalint that has been lodged and sends a copy of the compalint form so the nature of the problem isfully understood.

We ask that they get in touch with the consumer, and try to work the problem out tiwhint two weeks. In many cases, the difficluty will be resolved to the mmutual satisfaction of both parties. Often, we consider

sumer and businessman tosolve their problem through mutual cooperation. If a matter cannot be settled, my staff investigates further. listens to boh sides of the story,

our complaint process suc-

cessful when we can serve as a

go- between to get the con-

and tries tosolve the difficulty through informal negotiations. Once again, our role ideally is to get the two parties talking.

But if no mutually satisfactory solution is reached, assistant attorneys general confer with the head of the Consumer Protection Dvision and with me personally to decide if it is necessary to go to court.

Most complaints wer receive however, are settled without th need forlitigation.

Most complaints My staff members follow up every comlaint we receive until some type of settlement is rached, at which time our fils are closed.


