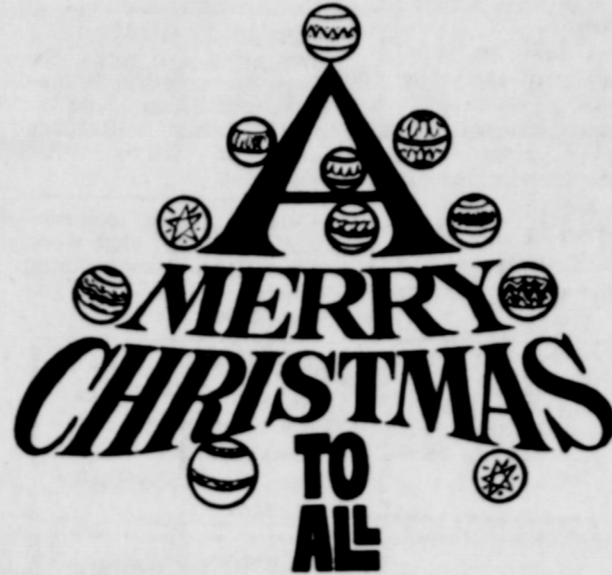

'Mail Early' Set by P.O.

Postmaster Marcus O'Dell announced today that Dec. 3 - 8 will be "Christmas Mail Early Week" in Eastland. The fuel energy crisis is a cause of great concern to the Postal Service as it affects the timely movement of Christmas mail. The curtailment in the number of air flights as well as the 50 mile-an-hour speed limit for vehicles makes Mail Early Week more important this year than ever before according to O'Dell.

"We are handling more mail this Christmas than in any previous year", Postmaster O'Dell said. "In order to get this mail to its destination by Dec. 25, we need your cooperation in mailing early."

Dr. Moreton Awarded Gold Medal

Dr. Robert D. Moreton, vice president for professional and public affairs at the University of Texas System Cancer Center at Houston, has been chosen to receive the Gold Medal of the Radiological Society of North America.

Dr. Moreton is also the vice president for professional and developmental affairs for The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston.

This award, the highest honor given by the Society, is accorded annually to a maximum of two members who have contributed unusual service to the science of radiology.

Gold medalists are selected by unanimous vote of the Society's board of directors. The Gold Medal will be presented to Dr. Moreton at the Society's 59th Assembly and Annual Meeting in Chicago, Illinois, Nov. 25 through 30.

Dr. Moreton previously served as assistant director at UT's M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute, a post he assumed in 1965. He is also a vice president of the UT Cancer Foundation.

A native of Brookhaven, Mississippi, Dr. Moreton received his M.D. degree from the University of Tennessee. He interned at Lloyd Memorial Hospital in Fairfield, Alabama, was a fellow in radiology at the Mayo Foundation, and later served as a staff radiologist at Scott & White Hospital and Clinic in Temple, Texas.

Before joining the Anderson staff, Dr. Moreton was chairman and director of the department of radiology at Harris Hospital and Fort Worth Children's Hospital.

Dr. Moreton was cancer coordinator for the Regional Medical Program of The University of Texas System. As chairman of the Commission of Cancer Management of the American College of Radiology, Dr. Moreton directed the development of the Mary Bird Perkins Radiation Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Dr. Moreton is a Texas delegate to the American Medical Association, a member of the Texas State Board of Health.

Most Texans, certainly those who drive in other states, are proud of our highway system, but too many are taking it for granted. It's being challenged and its funds are being sought for all manner of causes, in Washington and in Austin. Efforts are even being made to remove the "Good Roads Amendment" from the Texas Constitution.

There isn't space here to hand out all the bouquets which are due, but here are a few: - Texas has the lowest gasoline tax of any state - five cents a gallon - and one-fourth of it goes to the public schools.

- Cost of administration in Texas is slightly less than one cent of the highway dollar - one of the lowest relative expenditures in the U.S.

- Texas builds better highways more economically than most other states. The national average cost of new Interstate construction is about \$1.4 million per mile, while the average Texas cost is - 919 thousand.

- Best of all, here's a quote from a New York Times writer who made a survey last month: "Texas, where all of the design work for some \$450 million worth of new highways each year is done by state employees, has not had a highway scandal in 50 years."

The Times survey of six states - Florida Texas

California, Illinois, Massachusetts and New Jersey - shows only Texas and California appear free from taint.

In Texas, plans and specifications are drawn by Highway Department engineers, who also monitor actual construction work, and construction is by qualified private contractors, subject to sealed competitive bidding.

So, we've listed a few of the reasons why Texans should be intensely proud of their superb state highway system, and anxious and willing to protect and preserve it...

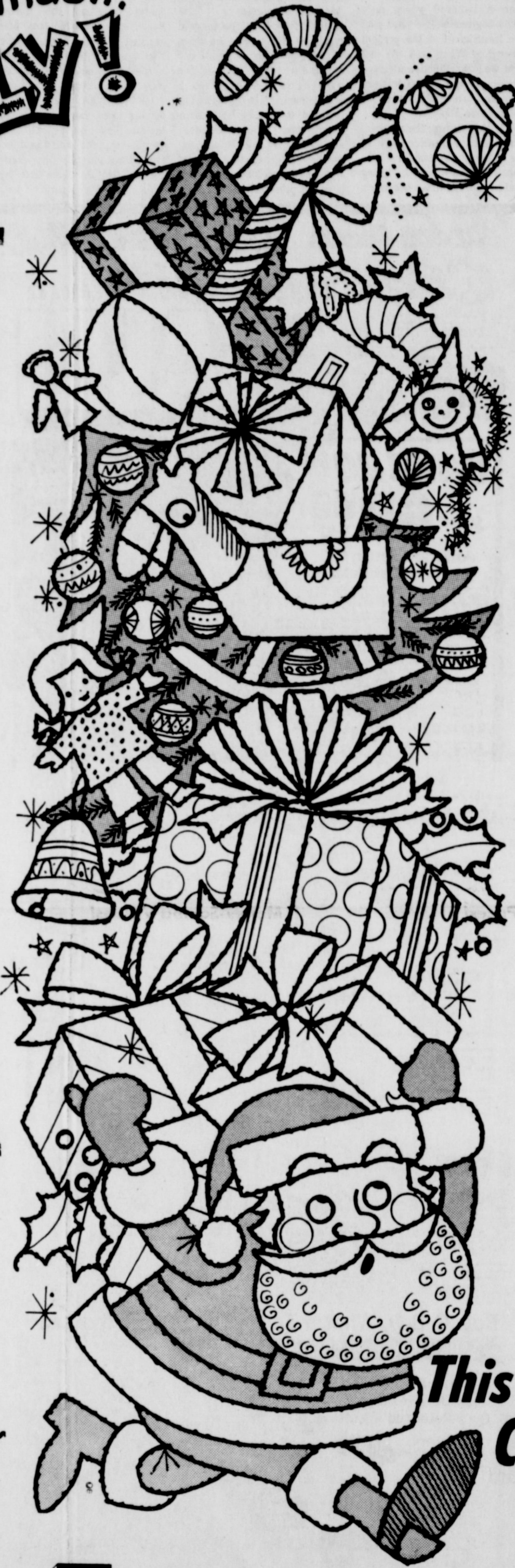

Major changes in the Social Security law will bring higher payments and greater protection to millions of Americans starting in 1973.

Social security benefits and insurance coverage will be presented at the second session of the Estate Planning and Family Business Seminar scheduled for the public on Tuesday, Nov. 27th. The session will be held in the Texas Electric Reddy Room in Eastland. The meeting will

begin at 1:30 p.m. Mrs. Faye Grant, of the Regional Social Security Office in Abilene; and Buddy Aaron, Farm Bureau Insurance Representative, will present the program.

Mrs. Grant will discuss the major changes in the social security laws. The changes include increased benefits for many widows, a new way of figuring retirement benefits for

men, a more liberal earnings test, a special credit for people who delay their retirement past age 65. In addition to these changes, the most recent

amendments also set up a new Federal program of supplemental security income for eligible needy people who are 65 and over, or blind, or

disabled. Major changes in Medicare have come about as a result of a new law. The law also has broadened Medicare coverage to include a wider range of health care services. Mrs. Grant will discuss these new changes in the Social Security program and answer

your personal questions. Buddy Aaron, well-known Eastland County Insurance Agent, will discuss insurance as an important tool in estate

planning and family business management. Mr. Aaron will explain H R 10 type of insurance which is a retirement insurance for self-employed

people. Also, Aaron will discuss insurance to cover legal work in the transfer of an estate. The Estate Planning and Family Business Seminar is

being sponsored by the Eastland County Extension Service. Previous programs have been presented on wills, types of trusts, and estate taxes and property valuation.

AUSTIN - - Once the deer is down and field dressed, what must the hunter do to get his venison ready for the oven, legally?

First, he must attach the proper tag from his hunting license to the deer.

If the hunter has bagged an antlerless deer then he is also required to attach an antlerless deer permit or special tag that

he receives from the landowner to the foreleg of the deer. Then it can be transported

directly to the hunter's home or to a commercial plant.

If the venison is to be shared, a legible note signed by the person who killed the deer must be attached to each portion given to other persons. The note must also list the address of the one who killed the deer, date of kill, hunting license number and name of ranch and county where killed.

This signed document must remain with the carcass or any portion of it until the deer is finally processed and delivered to its ultimate destination, in the home or a commercial

processing facility.

Do not remove the head of any deer until the carcass has been processed and delivered to its final destination. But you

may skin the deer if you wish and remain within the law.

The final destination is defined as a person's home or a commercial processing facility where the deer is finally processed.

It is lawful for a hunter to process a deer in camp as long as he keeps the proper tag from his hunting license, the proper antlerless permit or antlerless tag with the processed meat until such meat is delivered to a

commercial locker plant or the residence of the person killing the deer.

Purpose of these regulations, according to the Parks and Wildlife Department, is to insure that all legally taken deer can be identified by game wardens and still permit a person to properly care for the meat thereby insuring some fine steaks, roasts, chili and sausage during the coming season.

This tour was made possible through the Triple A.A.A. Club in Dallas.

Hotels, trains, buses, cabs, food, and guides were paid for

in advance.

The Talleys spent some time seeing the Big Bend Country.

Their two nights in Presidio, leaving their car in storage and going by cab to Ojimaga, getting Crestom papers, boarding the Chihuahua Pacific and riding four hours, reaching Chihuahua.

They were met by guides and taken to Hotel Victoria.

After leaving bags in rooms, they were then taken to a steak house for a steak dinner. They then came to the tour of the city with beautiful churches, Methodist, Baptist and Catholic.

They saw the Cathedral by the Governor's home who serves six years and no more. They went by fountains, the Federal Pen, saw the dome where Pancho Villa shot people. The holes are still in the sides of the dome. There were

beautiful homes, marble buildings.

Chihuahua is a city of 280,000 people, was founded in 1709, is the capital of the state of Chihuahua.

After they visited Chihuahua they boarded a train for Las Moches, a city of 90,000 or more, founded in 1903 by an American, Mr. Benjamin Johnson from Brooklyn. They were met by a guide and taken to Hotel Santa Anita. This hotel had 135 beautiful rooms, tile baths, barber shop, nice dining area. They toured this city - sugar cane factory and all the beautiful homes and a nice school.

Mr. Johnson, his wife and twin sister built this factory, the school and all the homes. There were tropical trees of all kinds. They went sailing seeing large birds, seagulls, large sea lions, porpoises turning over in the water.

After their sailing excursion they returned to the dining room for a deep sea dinner.

Next day they went by bus to Mazatlan, a city of 80,000 or more. Their rooms at the Cautamar Hotel faced the Pacific Ocean. Here they waded in the ocean, met and talked to people from all over the world. The dining room there served all kinds of sea

food and the guests were entertained by a four piece Mexican band. One of the young men wore two large guns around his waist like a law, and did a dance slinging his guns out as he danced. The guide this time was a white man and had attended one of our universities in Dallas He had met Mr. Grissom of Eastland. He asked about Mr. Grissom.

We traveled to this place by bus seven hours. Bus drivers changed half way. I noticed one driver as he climbed behind the wheel. He made a cross on

himself before ever taking hold of the wheel. The highway was a good one, but one curve after another. The bus lights were bad. The extra driver turned the spotlight on at times to see the bad curves but when meeting approaching cars the spotlight was turned off.

We returned back the way we went, taking 14 hours by bus then back to Chihuahua by train from Los Noches. Before reaching Chihuahua the air hoses broke. We were delayed 45 minutes. Then 30 miles from Chihuahua the air

hoses broke again This locked the wheels for 3 hours and 30 minutes. Men climbed telegraph pole, cut the wire and sent for help. An engine was sent out. This engine pushed our train in. We traveled on this train going and coming 32 hours. We went through 87 tunnels, crossed 47 bridges. We met a Mr. Taylor from Fort Worth. They were on a tour too. Mrs. Taylor is a sister to L.R. Pierson Jr. of Ranger. We had a wonderful time but

Texas was so beautiful when we were on our way home and Eastland and Olden looked so very beautiful to us.

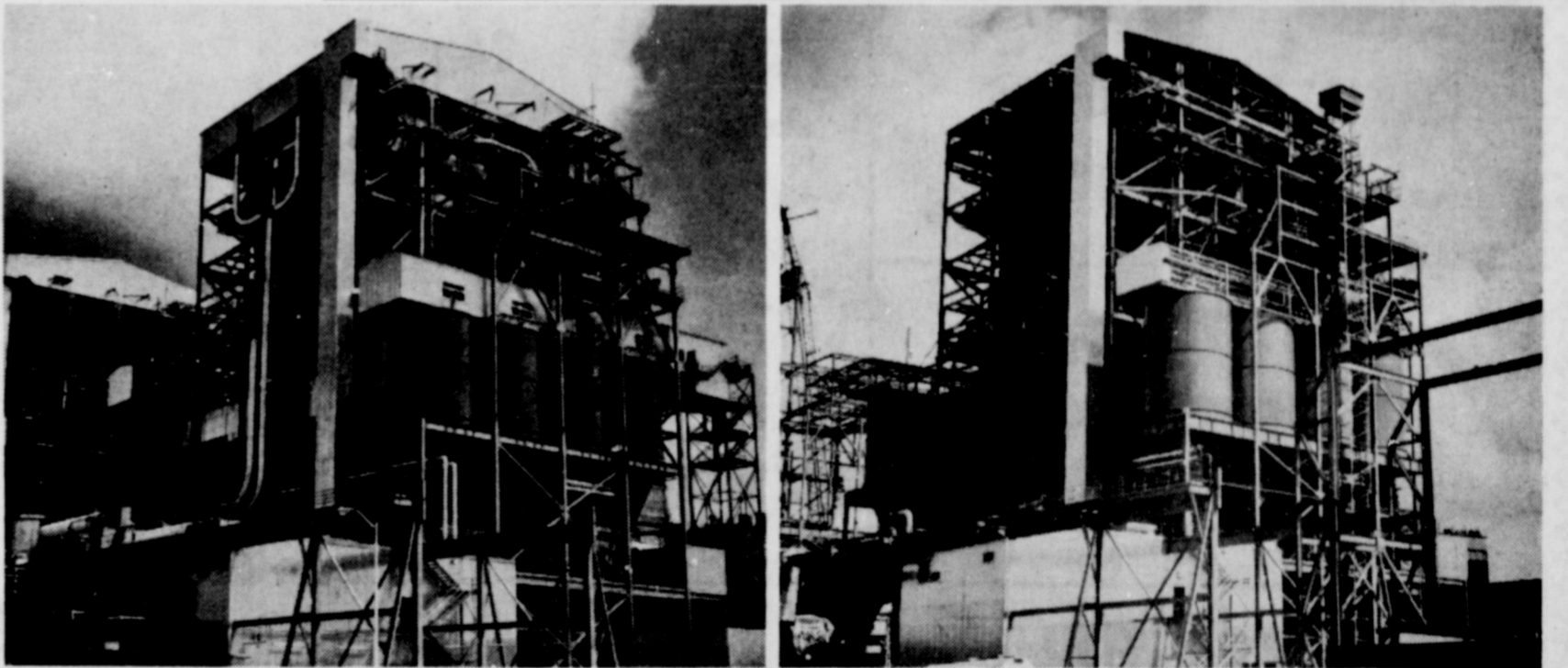
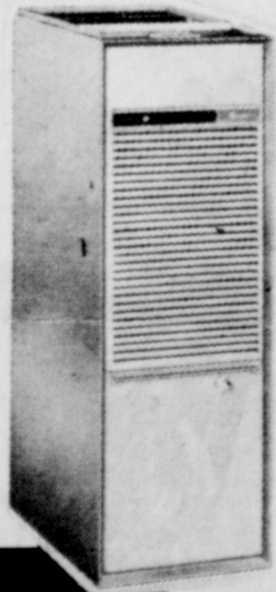

In November, 1971, the first unit of the lignite coal-fired Big Brown generating plant near Fairfield began producing electricity.

It added 575,000 kilowatts of power to the generating capability of Texas Electric and two other electric utility companies who cooperated in building the plant.

The first unit of the new lignite-fired Monticello plant will become operational in 1974. It duplicates the first unit at Big Brown, right down to the last kilowatt.

But there'll be one major difference — the cost. Equipment for the Monticello unit was ordered only three years after Big Brown. But during that period the cost of the same equipment had increased 25%.

We need these new lignite plants because supplies of natural gas and oil, our traditional boiler fuels, are becoming

increasingly difficult to obtain.

To diversify our fuels even further, we're planning to have our first nuclear power plant, near Glen Rose, operational by the early 1980's.

Unfortunately, lignite plants now cost about twice as much as traditional gas/oil-fired plants. Nuclear plants cost more than three times as much.

But, clearly, we have to build them if we are going to meet the increasing needs for electricity. We must spend \$230 million on new construction in the next two years alone.

We're working to supply the electricity you need, but it's costing more to make it all the time.
