Cleve Walkup To Teach Course

A Farm Electrification Short Course for adult farmers will be held September 24 - 27 under the sponsorship of the Eastland

High School Vocational Agriculture Department, according to Mr. Siebert, Superintendent, and Mr. Griffin, Teacher of Vocational Agriculture.

The Short Course is being sponsored by the Vocational Agriculture Department of Eastland High School.

Mr. Cleve Walkup, Farm Electrification Specialist with the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Agricultural Engineering at Texas A&M University, will be instructing in the course. He is headquartered at Texas A&M University.

Mr. Walkup holds a B.S. Degree in Industrial Education and a M. Ed. Degree in Agricultural Education.

The Short Course at Eastland High School is scheduled to begin Sept. 24 at 7:00 p.m. in the Vocational Agriculture Building. Other meetings in the series of four will be held Sept. 25, 26, and 27th. During the dates the Short Course is in progress, Mr. Walkup will be available to assist farmers with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm instruction, according to Don Griffin.

Farmers interested in attending the short course should write or call the teacher of vocational agriculture, Mr. Don Griffin. An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged. Farm Electrification Short Course Certificates are to be presented to each farmer who attends all the training sessions.

Mr. Walkup states that the short course can be adjusted to

wishes and interests of the farmers enrolled, but that he expects to cover such subjects as safety, how to properly choose wire sizes and install motor circuits, how to choose, protect, and ground electric motors, how to reverse and change motors from 120V to 240V, and how to calculate the cost of operating electrical equipment. Demonstrations will be given and class enrollees will have the opportunity to perform the skills demonstrated.

Short courses in Farm Electrification, as well as in other areas, are now available to farmers throughout the state under the new cooperative program between the Texas Education Agency and Texas A&M University.

This cooperative program is designed to make the services of specialists available to conduct short courses under the supervision of public schools. Such a program will enable

\$1,000 Savings On Food Stamps

Eastland County Judge Scott Bailey told a group of grocers this week that the changeover to food stamps from the county's surplus food program will mean a savings of about \$1,000 per month to the county.

Bailey and Jack Steegle, head of the Abilene and Wichita Falls field offices of the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture's Food Nutrition Services, explained to the grocers from Eastland and Stephens counties how to become a food stamp center.

Under the new program, teachers of vocational agriculture to provide improved educational services to farm people.

Specialists are now available in the fields of beef cattle, farm management, farm electrification, farm arc welding, swine production, tractor maintenance, dairy science, oxy-acetylene welding and pasture.

which goes into effect Nov. 1 in Eastland County, qualified recipients will apply at the State Welfare Office in Eastland where they will be issued an identification card and a certificate. Judge Bailey said these documents must be submitted to the local post office, where the appropriate amount of stamps will be issued.

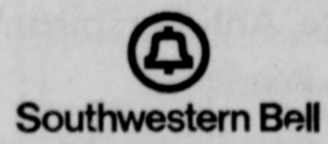
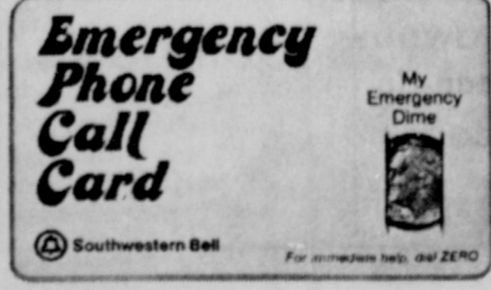

Phase 1 Construction Now 99 Percent Complete

Phase I construction is now 99 percent complete with final completion expected within ten days. Phase II construction has reached 76 percent completion and progressing on schedule. The Flatwoods - Carbon - Kokomo section should be operational this month and LaCasa should be complete by late October. The Corporation has

arranged with Mr. C.N. Adams of Carbon as the system operator. Mr. Adams holds a "C" license with the State Department of Public Health as a water system operator. He has three years experience as operator of the City of Carbon system, a job he will continue along with this job, with the Staff system. Mr. Adams has arranged for Mr. Glenn Allen

Wilson of Ranger to assist him as operator. The water samples have been approved by the State Health Department and as meters are installed the customers may begin using the water. Everyone is cautioned as to a requirement by the State Health Department and the Corporation that no cross connections are permitted between the Staff System and any private supply. In simple terms the customer may have his existing well or other supply for yard watering and other uses so long as there is no

physical connection between the two systems. Should any customer experience trouble with the system or who discover leaks may call Mr. Adams at 639 - 2460 or Mr. Wilson at 647 - 1357 to report the problem. Mr. Cecil Reeves, President of the Board of Directors, expressed the board's appreciation to everyone for any ill - convenience and ask their cooperation until any problem can be worked out. It is a good system capable of supplying an abundance of lake, high quality domestic water for many years to come.

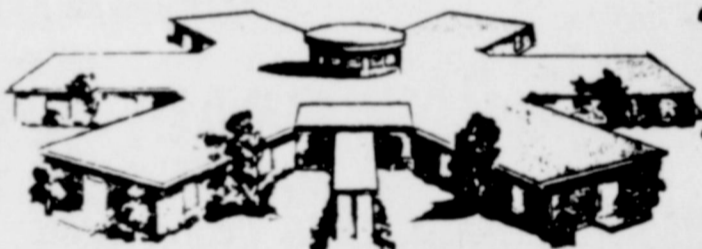

Increasing Complaints Of Dumping Trash And Debris on Roadways And Lakes

Various public officials in Eastland County are receiving increasing complaints regarding people who are dumping their trash and debris along the roadways and around the lake, rather than take it to any one of the several free public dump grounds provided by the five cities in the County. In addition to the members of the Sheriff's office, and the Texas Department of Public Safety, the Constables, the various City Policemen in the County, County Commissioners, and the Texas Highway Department, there are also numerous landowners and other interested citizens

concerned about this matter not only because of the unsightly appearances such trash and debris causes but also because of the health, safety, and fire hazards, which are generally created, and the expensive task of maintaining clean roads and parks. There is a state law which makes it unlawful for anyone to dump, deposit, or leave any refuse, garbage, rubbish, or junk on any road, streetway, thoroughfare, bridge, public beach, or park in this State, not privately owned or controlled, when any part thereof is open to the public for vehicular traffic or as a public

recreation area. To violate this law is a criminal offense and subjects a person convicted of such violation to a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00. In this connection, Constable Bill Hunter of Eastland reports that he has filed three criminal cases within the last 10 days charging persons with dumping their household trash on roadways and he and other law enforcement officers report that they are checking into other alleged violations. Law enforcement officers, along with other public officials, and interested citizens of the County are asking for the assistance and cooperation of all citizens in the County to help alleviate this problem. One way to help is to make sure that one's refuse, garbage, rubbish, and junk is taken to

any one of the free public dump grounds maintained by the five cities in the County; a second way to help is to avoid the littering of the roadways with refuse such as beverage cans and bottles, etc., while driving down the road; both of these will save the state and County tax money in picking up the debris and also help the ever-increasing battle against pollution. Another important way for an interested citizen to help is to make a note of the vehicle license number and anyone who is observed littering and violating the law, and to immediately relay such information to a law enforcement official, a County Commissioner, or to the Texas Highway Department. Remember that a part of each tax dollar you save in helping to maintain clean public

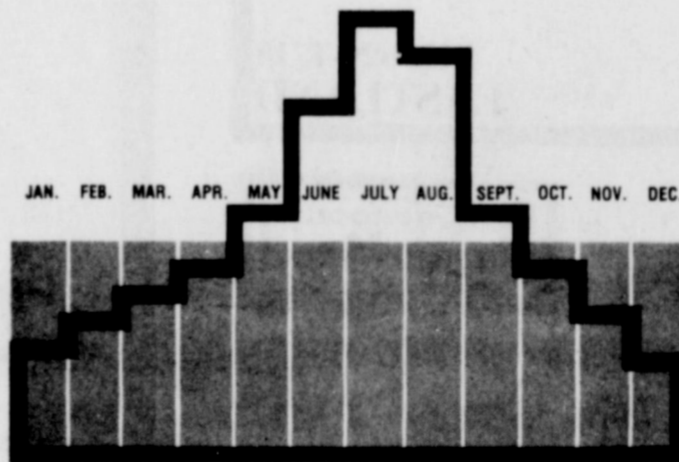
