The 1973 - 74 School Year will officially begin in Eastland Monday, Aug. 20, when approximately eight hundred students are expected to report to classes in three schools and a Kindergarten.

The first day will be a full day of instruction with classes beginning at 8 a.m. at the Junior and Senior High Schools and at 8:15 in the Elementary School and Kindergarten.

The Kindergarten, first, second and third grades will be dismissed in the afternoon at 2:30 p.m. and the 4th, 5th and 6th grades at 3:15 p.m. High School and Junior High School students will be dismissed at 3:30 p.m.

Monday, September 3 (Labor Day) will be the first scheduled school holiday of the new school year.

Two teachers who will be new to the Eastland system have been named to the faculty for the coming year, Mrs. Linda Guttman, Speech Therapist, and Mrs. Loy's Allmand, elementary teacher.

NO INCREASE
All school cafeterias, under the direction of Mrs. Louise Stansell will be in operation on the first day.

No increase in the price of school lunches will be made at this time, although it is anticipated that a price increase will be forthcoming during the school year to offset the rising cost of lunchroom operation.

NEW DRESS CODE
At the regular monthly board meeting this month, the board approved a new Dress Code for students attending the Eastland Public Schools:

Students attending the Eastland Public Schools are expected to dress in a manner that is consistent with good grooming and proper taste.

Boys are not permitted to wear a beard, mustache or hair that is unreasonably long or unkempt.

Hair should not extend over the eyes in front, below the ear lobe on the side, or below the bottom of the conventional shirt collar in the back when the individual is in a standing position.

Sideburns should not be extreme in design nor should they extend beyond the bottom of the ear lobe.

Shorts and cut-off jeans are not regarded as proper school attire.

"Tank Tops", fishnet or similar attire are not regarded as proper unless they are worn with a suitable undergarment with sleeves.

"Halter - tops" or other garments exposing either bare midriff or bare backs are not acceptable.

Above the knee culottes, pedal pushers, and bermuda shorts are acceptable attire. The wearing of footwear is required.

PRINCIPALS TO DECIDE
The building principal is authorized to render decisions relative to school dress not specifically outlined in the code, and is authorized to temporarily suspend from school any student that, in his opinion, is not properly dressed.

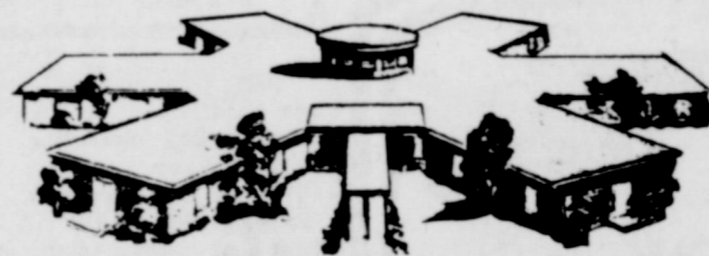

Food Stamps To Be Issued November 1, 1973

The first food stamps in Eastland County will be issued November 1, 1973. But before the statewide food stamp program is implemented here, there is much work to be done.

Commodities is the food assistance program currently operating in this county. The 62nd Texas Legislature appropriated \$7.7 million for a statewide food stamp program to replace all county food stamp programs and com-

modity food distributions. By November 1973 the 254 counties in Texas will be operating the statewide program administered by the State Department of Public Welfare.

Before the first stamps are issued here, extensive preparation must be completed. Current commodity recipients will be notified that food stamps will replace the present food assistance program. Most commodity

recipients should be eligible for food stamps also as well as others who might not receive commodity foods.

Certification for food stamp eligibility will begin at a later date. All persons who don't make much money or who are unemployed are encouraged to apply at that time. Welfare recipients aren't the only ones who can qualify for food stamps.

Local issuance offices will

sell the food stamps to all who are certified eligible to receive them. Participating households will be able to buy their stamps at the issuance office nearest them and at their own convenience. The long waiting lines which are now a problem at commodity distribution centers should be eliminated.

Food stamps, which can be used for the purchase of most foods and food products, will be accepted by many of the local grocers. Payment is made by tearing the necessary amount

of food stamps from the coupon book at the time of purchase. Tobacco, alcoholic beverages and imported items cannot be purchased with food stamps.

Grocers can deposit food stamps just as they do money. Local bankers then send the stamps to the United States Department of Agriculture for redemption.

Food stamps are good for everyone. The community enjoys increased economic activity, new jobs are created and low-income households

All retailers who have received these kits are encouraged to bring them to the meeting.

The meeting will be held September 10, 1973, District Courtroom, Eastland, at 7:30 p.m.

It is important that all retailers and wholesalers in Eastland attend this meeting.

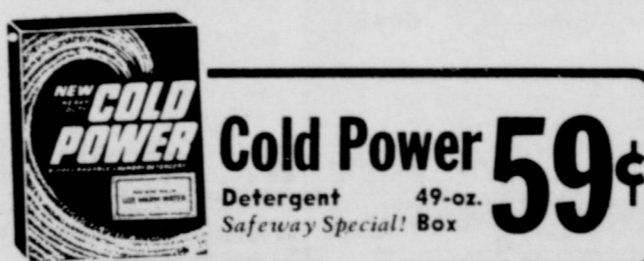

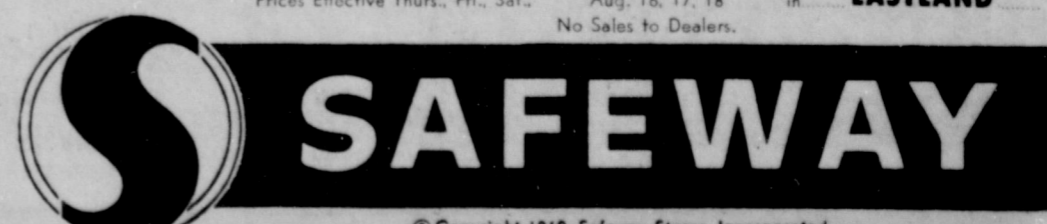
