following 10 guidelines were adopted by growers as desirable principles to be incorporated in any new peanut

program: 1. Peanuts are not to be included in the general farm bill. 2. We oppose any openended program.

3. Peanuts produced for domestic uses are to be supported at not less than 75 per cent of parity.

4. Peanut program legislation will make mandatory a sheller purchase program.

5. Shellers shall pay full support on commercial purchases of farmers stock peanuts. The difference between loan and support (\$14.52) shall be placed in a CCC fund to defray costs of supporting segregation , the purchase program and freeze damaged peanuts .

6. Proceeds from peanuts going under loan and subsequently redeemed and sold for edible use shall be distributed within the area by types to growers who participate in the loan program. 7. The 1.610,000 acres shall be maintained as the minimum acreage. Present farm acreage history shall be maintained.

8. Production shall continue to be controlled by acreage rather than poundage. 9. The use of Certificates


