HOSPITAL PROJECT GETS UNDER WAY

Enlargement and modernization of Eastland Memorial Hospital should begin about July 1 as the culmination of four long years of planning and preparations, it was announced this week.

Bids for the major renovation and expansion work which will be carried out in four major phases will be received beginning Monday, April 2 and opened May 3, Hospital Board Chairman Charles Freyschlag

announced Friday at a press conference in the hospital board room.

The 58-bed facility will be increased to 86 beds, with ancillary equipment sufficient to expand beyond that number

in the future. The board had hoped that the allocation might be in the 100-bed range, but the state regulating board, using federal guidelines, held that 86 beds is adequate for Eastland now.

"Compliance" has been and is the name of the game for the board, the medical staff and hospital administration and staff. Every effort has and is being made to make the hospital comply with all state

and federal regulations. Final approval and the announcements concerning the start of construction proves that all checkpoints are being realized.

PUBLIC INVITED

Hospital Administrator Mrs. Helga Tiner reports that the public will be invited to look at the architectural drawing of the proposed building and plans at an informal showing to be held between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m., Wednesday, April 4, in the board conference room.

Visitors to the room are urged to use the north-east door only, into the employee dining room.

Board members attended and/or made at least 60 trips during their planning stages, Mrs. Tiner said, showing the great amount of time spent in mapping plans for the hospital's future.

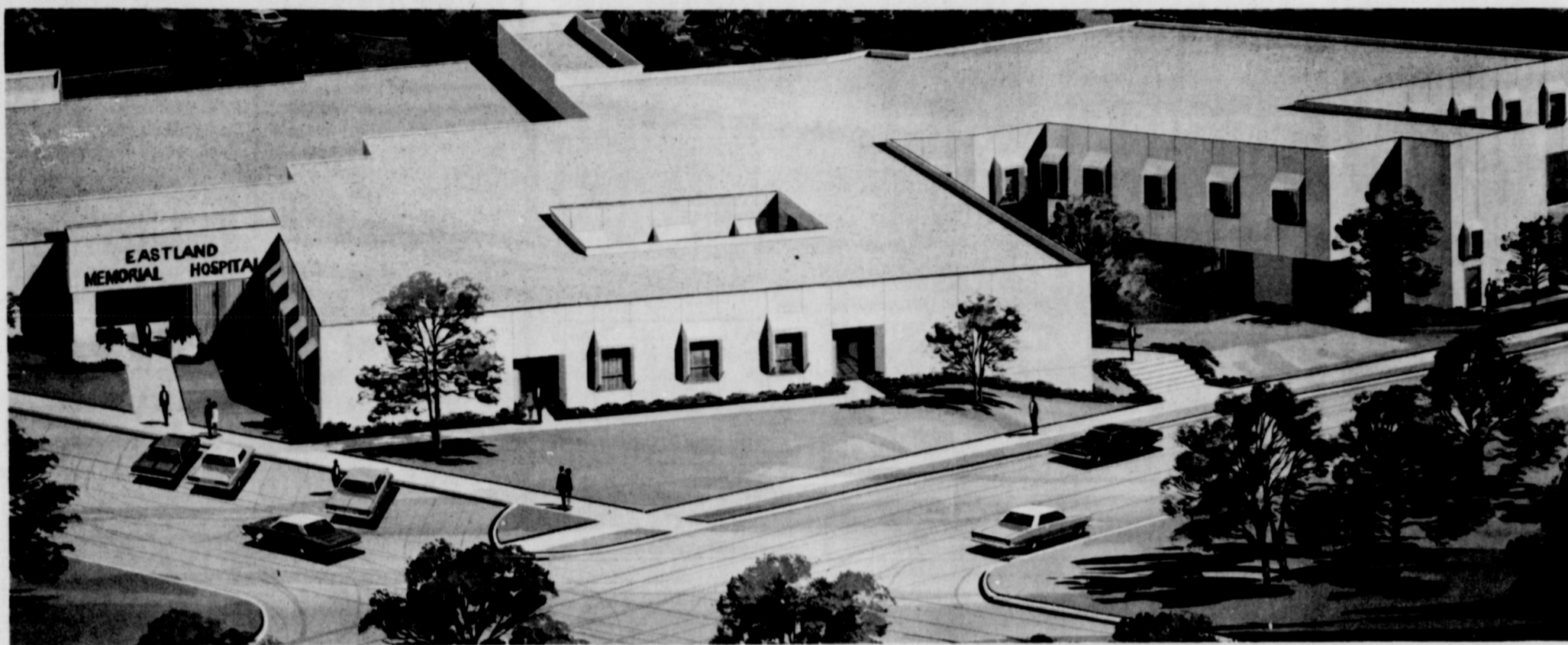
Eastland Memorial Hospital has been accepting patients since June, 1952. Saute onion in 1/2 cup margarine in saucepan 2 to 3 minutes. Blend in flour and seasonings. Gradually add

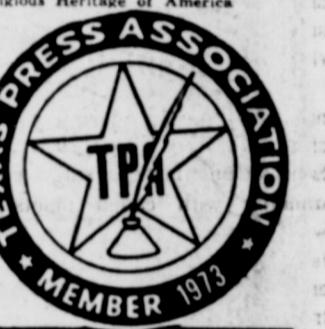

Are we going to have another freeze? That is a question a lot of people have been asking. And of course it's one that can not be answered.

A publication, "Freeze Probabilities in Texas", tells us what has happened during the past years. For example, March 27th, is the average date of the last 32 degree temperature in Eastland County. However, there is still a 20 percent chance that the temperature will drop to 32 degrees as late as April 8th. There is still a 5 percent chance that we will have a freeze as late as April 16th.

We've heard several predictions of late freezes. One man said it thundered on February 20th so it will frost on April 20th. Another predicts a freeze on April 7th. Some of the oldtimers say it will not freeze after the mesquites leaf out and they have not begun to leaf yet. One thing for sure- if we have an Easter freeze it will surely damage a lot of vegetation.

Gardeners can produce a better crop of tomatoes by using wirecages.

A five-by-five foot section of six-inch mesh concrete reinforcing wire makes an excellent cage about 19 inches in diameter when bent into a cylinder and the ends are bent together. By snipping off the bottom rung, the cage can be pushed into the ground about six inches deep.

Push the cage over each plant. No suckering, pruning or training is necessary. The plant grows up through the cage with some of the leaves and stems coming through the six-inch squares of wire mesh, supporting the plant in an upright position.

Cages allow plants to develop naturally, providing adequate shade for ripening fruit. Sunscald and fruit cracking are minimal with caged plants when soil moisture is maintained at an adequate level and foliage diseases are controlled.

Plastic, paper, aluminum foil or heavy organic mulch on the soil in the cage will control weeds and reduce moisture loss. However, organic mulch should be used only after the soil has become warm, as it can slow plant growth if used during cool spring weather.

Six caged plants of the large fruited tomato varieties should provide plenty of tomatoes for a family of four or five during the normal harvest period. Some growers have obtained over 50 pounds of fruit per plant in cages.

about one inch of the sides above ground. Cut off the top of each can and perforate the bottom before placing it in the ground. Use two cans per plant or 14 cans for six plants. With tomato plants set two feet apart, place two cans about 16 inches apart between plants, starting with two cans on either end of the row. After plants start to fruit,

place one to two level teaspoons of a complete fertilizer in each can once a week. Fill the cans with water two to three times a week or as needed.

This method can also be used for producing fall tomatoes when seed are started in June. However, black plastic mulch should not be used for a fall crop.

F. Additional programs include minor and major surgery offered in Emergency Suite. Out-Patient services offer prenatal, well baby clinics, TB detection, inhalation therapy, nutrition, obesity and inoculation programs. These are presently being offered in the new medical clinic. A licensed vocational nurse training program is presently being offered by Cisco Junior College with Eastland Memorial Hospital being one of the affiliated hospitals. Fifteen student nurses are currently being trained under this program, with 10 student nurses receiving their clinical experience and instructions in Eastland Memorial Hospital. Minor orthopedics, urology, acute trauma patients, acute short term and extended care patients are being admitted. A significant factor in requesting the modernization program is due to the high average daily census occurring for the past five years. Ninety-three and one-fourth percent occupancy has been occurring since 1968. The average daily census has been 54.0 with an average occupancy of nine days per patient. The enclosed site plan describes the existing hospital building, showing the modernization to bring the total bed count to approximately 86.

The site contains approximately 1.92 acres. The new construction beds to be added are elevated, which works well with a nursing station to serve 47 medical-surgical beds and one ICU unit. The beds to be modernized will replace existing bedroom wings to be demolished. Additional beds can be added (approximately 38) at the lower level as the need arises. Future elevators can be added at this time. The parking areas adjacent to the site and located on the site will be adequate to handle the vehicular traffic to and from the hospital. Thirty seven additional parking spaces have been added on site. There is presently an additional fifty car parking lot across Daugherty Street.

The existing building, when modernized with the new patient wings, will be an asset to the area. The lower elevation property will be used more adequately than it now is being used. Access to the patient wings will be more easily approached from the parking areas.

The Eastland Memorial Hospital is being modernized to assure better patient care in the program of health being offered. Board of Directors include: Mr. Freyschlag,

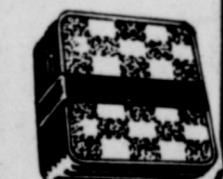

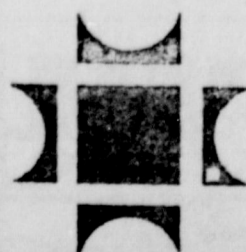
