In Brady earlier about 7500 pounds of a light shrinking eight months chip sold for \$1.181

In Sonora the 30,239 pound Rieck Ranch clip was sold) this wool had the bellies removed. The 18883 pounds of skirted staple sold for \$1.60-3x, the 5948 pounds of skirted French \$1.495 the 1490 pounds of skirted clothing \$1.22- 3x, the 3918 pounds of bellies or "skirts" \$1.10. Also sold was a small tonnage of 12 months lamb at \$1.40

### **Judge Dalton Finishes Course**

Judge L. W. Dalton of Eastland has successfully completed an advanced twenty hour In-Service Justice of the Peace Training course. The seminar was held in Midland, Texas from March 13- 16,1973

Lamar University, College of Technical Arts has been contracted by the Texas Justice of the Peace and Constables Association to execute the Justice of the Peace InService Training Program.

Mr. John O'Neal, 79, father of Mrs. Doug Underwood of Eastland, was buried in funeral services Saturday in An Angelo.


Mr. O'. Neal died suddenly at his home in San Angelo Wednesday. He lived in Eastland briefly

It was pointed out in the master plan made by the Parks and Wildlife agency and at the public hearing that the figures given are taken from a statewide sampling of contract bids and do not represent actual anticipated costs.

The program is designed for a five- year plan, and the city will be able to utilize in- kind work for its share of the 50- 50 costs. No bond issue is anticipated and it is felt by the commission that the project can be handled through regular operating funds over the fiveyear period, at a cost, even using the believed- to- be high stated figures of somewhere in the neighborhood of \$6,000 to \$7,000 a year. The Commission is definitely interesting in carrying out the plan but plans to stay with a close budget.
