LOOK FOR the Eastland Chamber of Commerce is pretty new quarters now in the Perry Building on N. Lamar St., just south of the Majestic Theatre. Telephone ring is the same 629-2332.

A LITTLE SUNG industry in our county is the trucking business that adds a great deal to our population and economy. For instance did you know that there were 4502 trucks registered here in 1972? Total value of the trucks in use is \$6,167,740, with 1,621 persons employed with total earnings of \$12,201,267. So let's remember to tip our hats to the truckers. These figures are considerable above our neighbor Stephens Erath and Callahan county totals.

WOOL AND MOHAIR prices are inching upward again our scouts report indicating that there'll be more interest in these livestock activities once again.

Recent sales reports on wool prices should perk up the ears of former raisers hereabouts.

A 13,000 pound clip of 8-10 months ewe wool sold for \$1.25-5-8 grease at Wool Growers Central Storage CO. Wool Growers also sold an undetermined tonnage of lamb wool of various qualities ranging from feed lot to clean range wools prices 81¢ to \$1.16-5-8.

In Brady earlier about 7500 pounds of a light shrinking eight months clip sold for \$1.18¢.

In Sonora the 30,239 pound Rieck Ranch clip was sold (this wool had the bellies removed). The 18883 pounds of skirted staple sold for \$1.60¢, the 5948 pounds of skirted French \$1.495 the 1490 pounds of skirted clothing \$1.22¢, the 3918 pounds of bellies or "skirts" \$1.10. Also sold was a small tonnage of 12 months lamb at \$1.40.

Eastland's Assistant County Agent Paul Campbell submitted his resignation to the Commissioner's Court Monday March 26. He will leave Eastland the end of this month and will be moving to Magnolia Arkansas where he will manage a greenhouse operation which raises tomatoes.

### Judge Dalton Finishes Course

Judge L. W. Dalton of Eastland has successfully completed an advanced twenty hour In-Service Justice of the Peace Training course. The seminar was held in Midland, Texas from March 13-16, 1973.

Lamar University, College of Technical Arts has been contracted by the Texas Justice of the Peace and Constables Association to execute the Justice of the Peace In-Service Training Program.

Funds have been made available for this program through a grant from the Texas Criminal Justice Council and under the authorization of the federal Omnibus Crime Control Bill and Safe Streets Act.

Lamar University will conduct basic and advanced training programs throughout the state. Completion of the basic training course will certify a judge as required under Article 5972, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended by the sixty second legislature. The advanced training course is designed to improve the skills of those judges who have held the office of Justice of the Peace for more than one year.

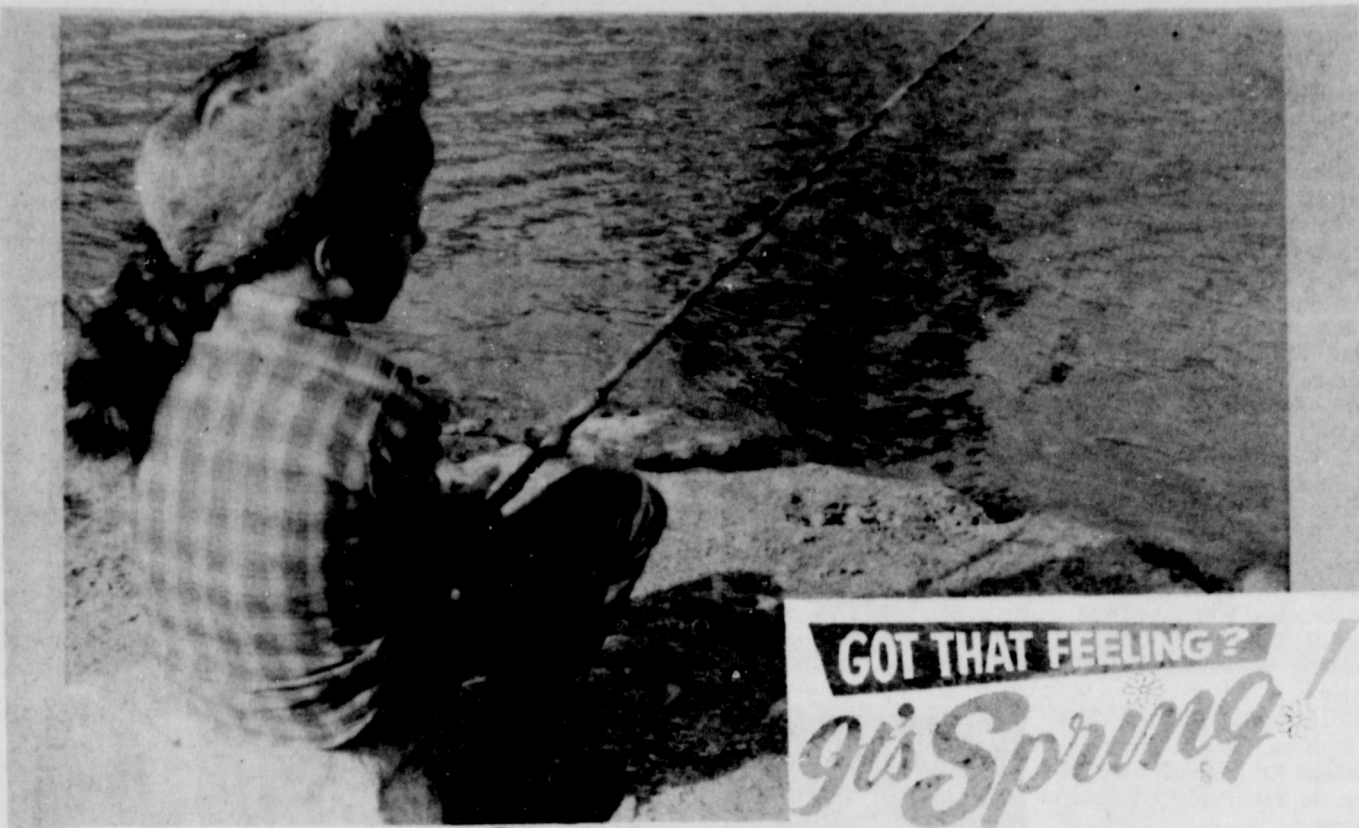

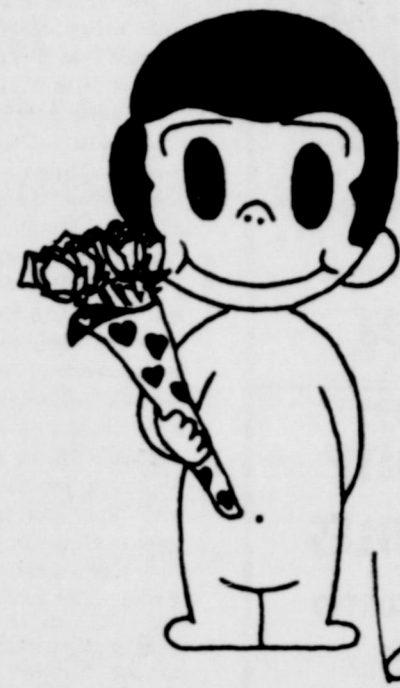

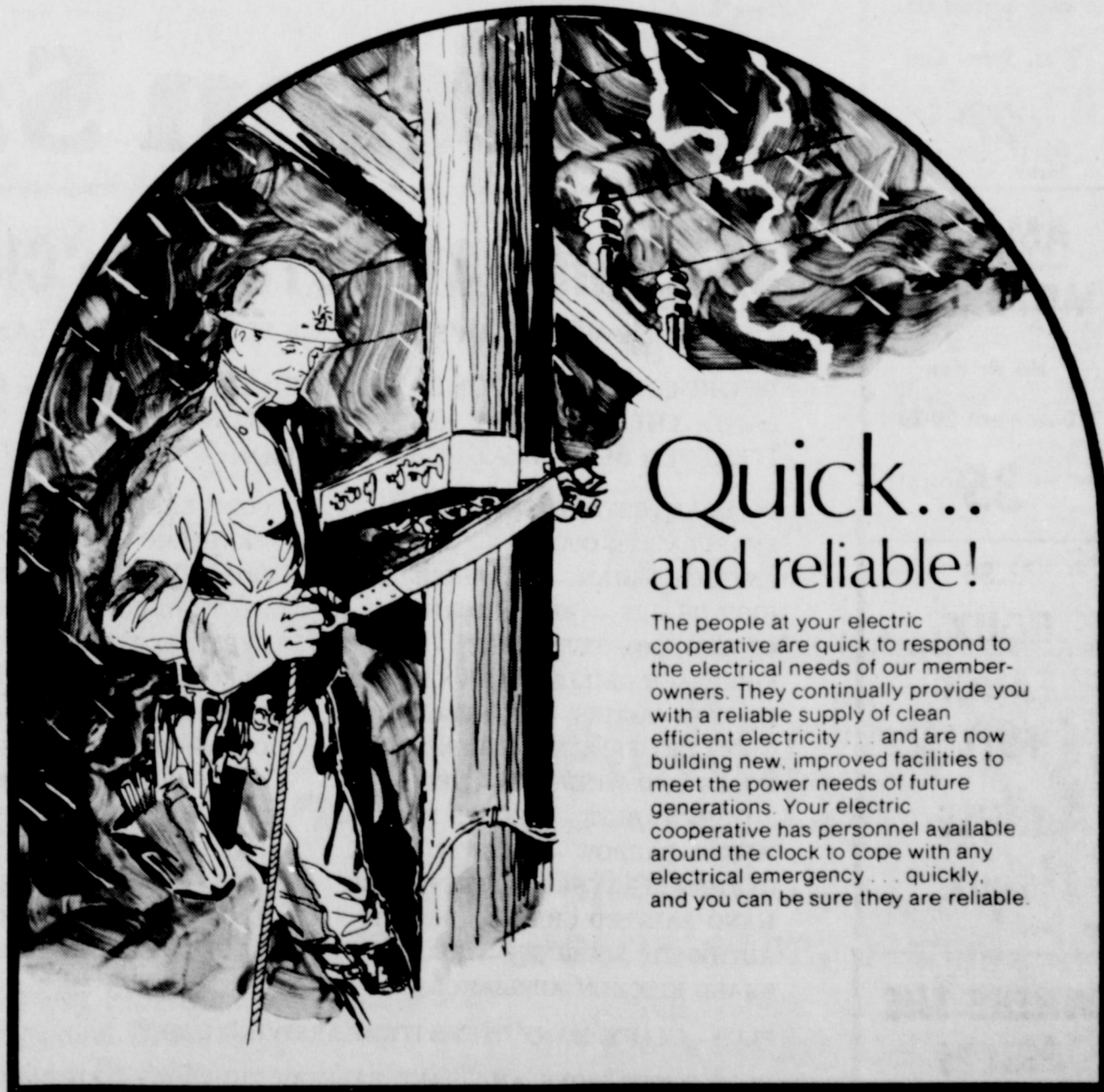

## Sales Tax Check Shows Growth For Eastland

Indicative of the city's continuing economic growth is the receipt this week of a check for \$13,000 representing Eastland's last quarter share of the sales tax, according to City Manager Lewis Tiner.

Speaking at the luncheon meeting of the Eastland Lions Club, he explained that the city's sales tax check continues to grow each quarter, showing that business continues to be good in Eastland.

He wasn't as cheerful however in reporting the status of the federal revenue checks received today. The two checks for the year 1972, totaled only about \$15,000, and he said that the city is still in the "questioning" stage, in as much as the two neighboring towns have each deposited checks for the same period in

the amount of \$47,000. "So far we haven't much further than the four letter stage" he said "but we're hoping that eventually, these figures will be corrected, and we'll get our fair share." There is one factor though that will affect Eastland's total: Eastland did not pass the local sales tax as early as did Ranger and Cisco, and part of the revenue sharing formula is based on local tax participation.

In other matters Manager Tiner explained briefly the city park plans and the work being done on the sewer line extension eastward to the new building Ramada Inn.

President Clint Bray presided and guests included Tom Stark of Cisco; Gary Pipkin of Eastland; and Prospective member Tommy Crowder.

The club announced plans for the annual light bulb sale to be held Tuesday, April 3 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Manager Tiner reported that good progress is now being made on the sewer line project after some slow starts due to water and rocks.

Another of our old ministers had just closed a sermon on "Cleanliness," and was asked the question, "Do you believe a man can chew tobacco and go to heaven?" "Well, I guess he possibly could, but he would have to go to hell to spit."

A dear old colored preacher was asked how he arranged and delivered his sermons. He replied, "Well, fust I tell em what I'm gonna tell em, then I tells em, then I tell em what I done tole em." His breed are not all colored, and many of them survive.

The most impressive statement I ever heard in a sermon was from a black preacher in Port Arthur.

He said, "All the room I need in this world is room to kneel down and pray and stand up and preach."

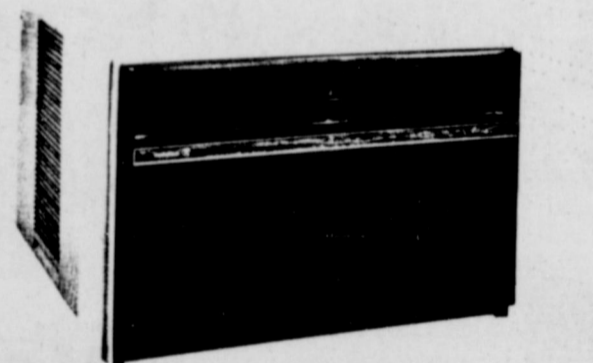

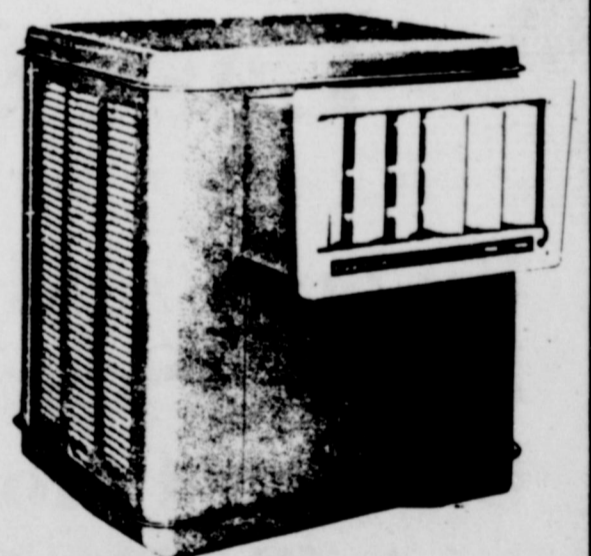

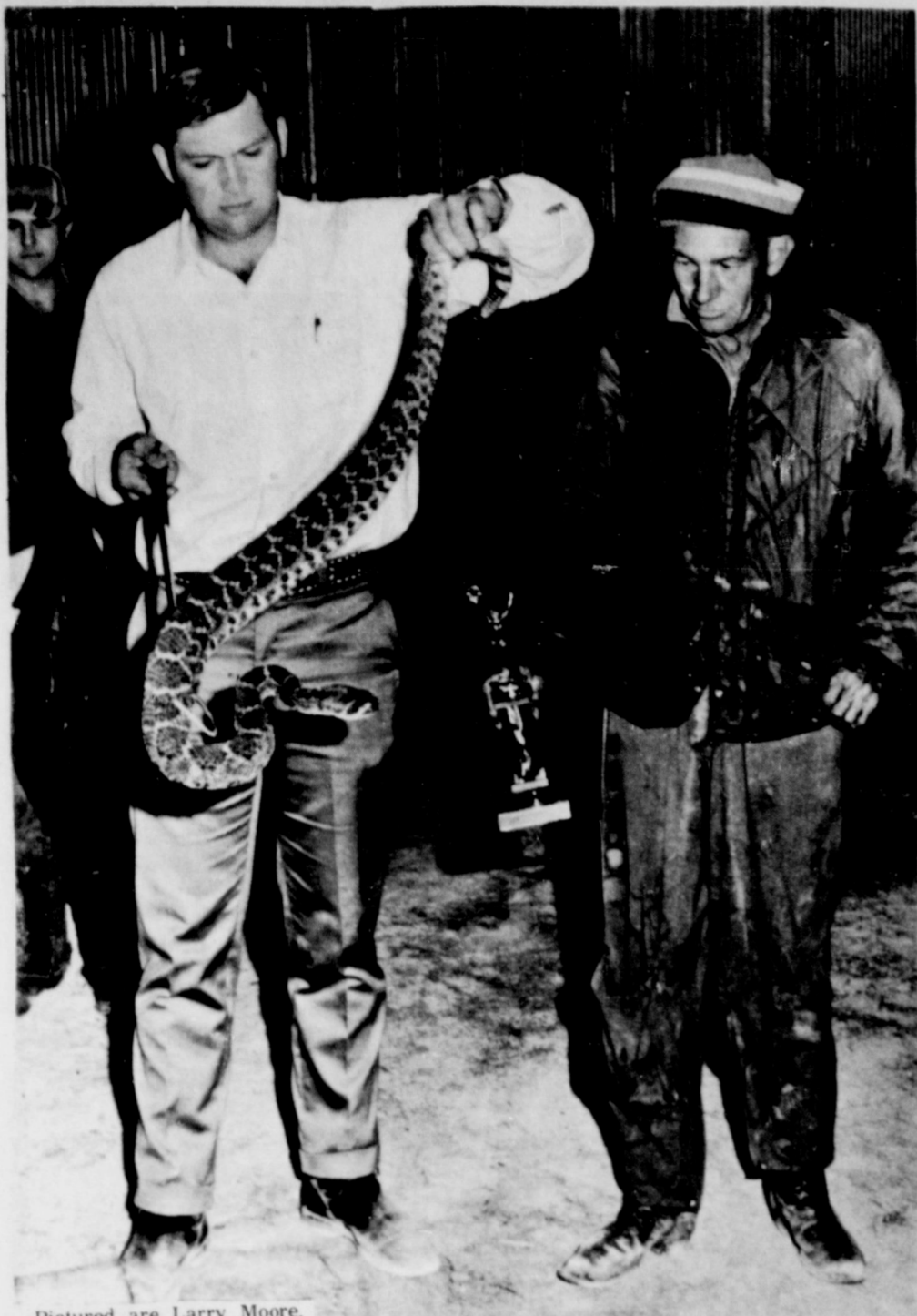

## Priorities Next Step In Park Project

Nailing down priorities and making formal application appears to be next step for members of the Eastland City Commission in their effort to modernize City Park Hill under a Parks and Wildlife project. No objections were raised at a public hearing held

Monday, attended by three citizens during which details of the project were explained. Mayor Durel Reid presided and Project Chairman H.V.O'Brien and Local Soil Conservation Supervisor Lynn Gibson explained the plans which

was drawn by the Parks and Wildlife Dept.

Funds would come from the Parks and Wildlife Bureau of Outdoor Recreation, with the details for application and assistance provided by the Leon-Bosque Resources Development program.

Citizen Curley Maynard pointed out that an earlier request for an additional roque court would not be necessary since declining interests now permits national tournaments to be held on two-court sites. This will save the cost of the additional court, and the two present courts will be improved.

Larry Rollins, president of the Eastland Jaycees, attended the hearing for that club which has taken an active part in helping improve the park facilities. The club recently

painted and repaired playground equipment there. Also attending was Mrs. James Dabney.

In the matter of priorities, the commission has generally agreed that restroom renovation should be among the first steps taken. Other first-choice items would be the basic park improvement features which should be done before other items. These would include installation of utilities, drives, sidewalks and other physical developments, upon which other park improvements could be made.

It was pointed out in the master plan made by the Parks and Wildlife agency and at the public hearing that the figures given are taken from a statewide sampling of contract bids and do not represent actual anticipated costs.

The program is designed for a five-year plan, and the city will be able to utilize in-kind work for its share of the 50-50 costs. No bond issue is anticipated and it is felt by the commission that the project can be handled through regular operating funds over the five-year period, at a cost, even using the believed-to-be high stated figures of somewhere in the neighborhood of \$6,000 to \$7,000 a year. The Commission is definitely interested in carrying out the plan but plans to stay with a close budget.

Among the first things which will be recommended will be the restroom renovation and the P&W plan "guesses" a maximum of \$2,350. A reputable local contractor guesses that the work can satisfactorily be done for half that amount.

In other areas to be considered in the first priorities:

### UTILITIES

Water System, 240 lin. ft at \$2 ft., for an estimated cost of \$480. (NOTE: This does not represent a sprinkler system which the P&K Plan and the Commission agrees would be too expensive to consider). 1,350 lin. ft. at \$3 ft. underground electrical system for \$4,050; 40 lin. ft. at \$5 ft. sewage lines for \$200; and 5 units at \$150 ea. area lighting for \$750 and a grand total utility cost of \$5,480.
