generally clear and safe from the beginning of the storm which moved in last week, but early Wednesday, snow began falling, and indications were that the low temperatures would continue and the new precipitation would cause worse driving conditions.

The temperature dropped to a low of 14 Tuesday night and climbed up to the low 20s Wednesday, as the snow began.

Other points in the county had had more snow earlier, and the Cisco schools were closed Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, while all others had classes each day.

Heaviest hit apparently in the January front was an area west of Cisco, in the Putnam area, where Int. 20 caused all kinds of travel problems, and the hotels and motels throughout this county were reported full over the weekend. Mrs. Faye Harbin of the Village Hotel reported that they were full Saturday night and had to send travelers to other sites.

Heating facilities appeared to be adequate with no cur-

tailment of gas service reported locally, although reports of curtailment in East Texas are being heard.

Mr. D.L. May, local Lone Star Gas Manager, reports that there has been no curtailment of services here to industry, and that gas pressure is adequate and that he expects it to remain so.

Police Chief John Morren reports that there have been very few accidents and that luckily none have been serious. A pickup truck went off a bridge at Lake Leon over the weekend but the driver was able to get out without injury. The pickup was pulled from the lake shore Tuesday.

Unrelated to the weather apparently was vandalism reported over the past weekend with window breakage at high school, city hall and a garage on East Main St.

Throughout the storm, which hit with its strongest force Saturday, there has been flurries of sleet and snow, but Wednesday's fallings were the heaviest to date.

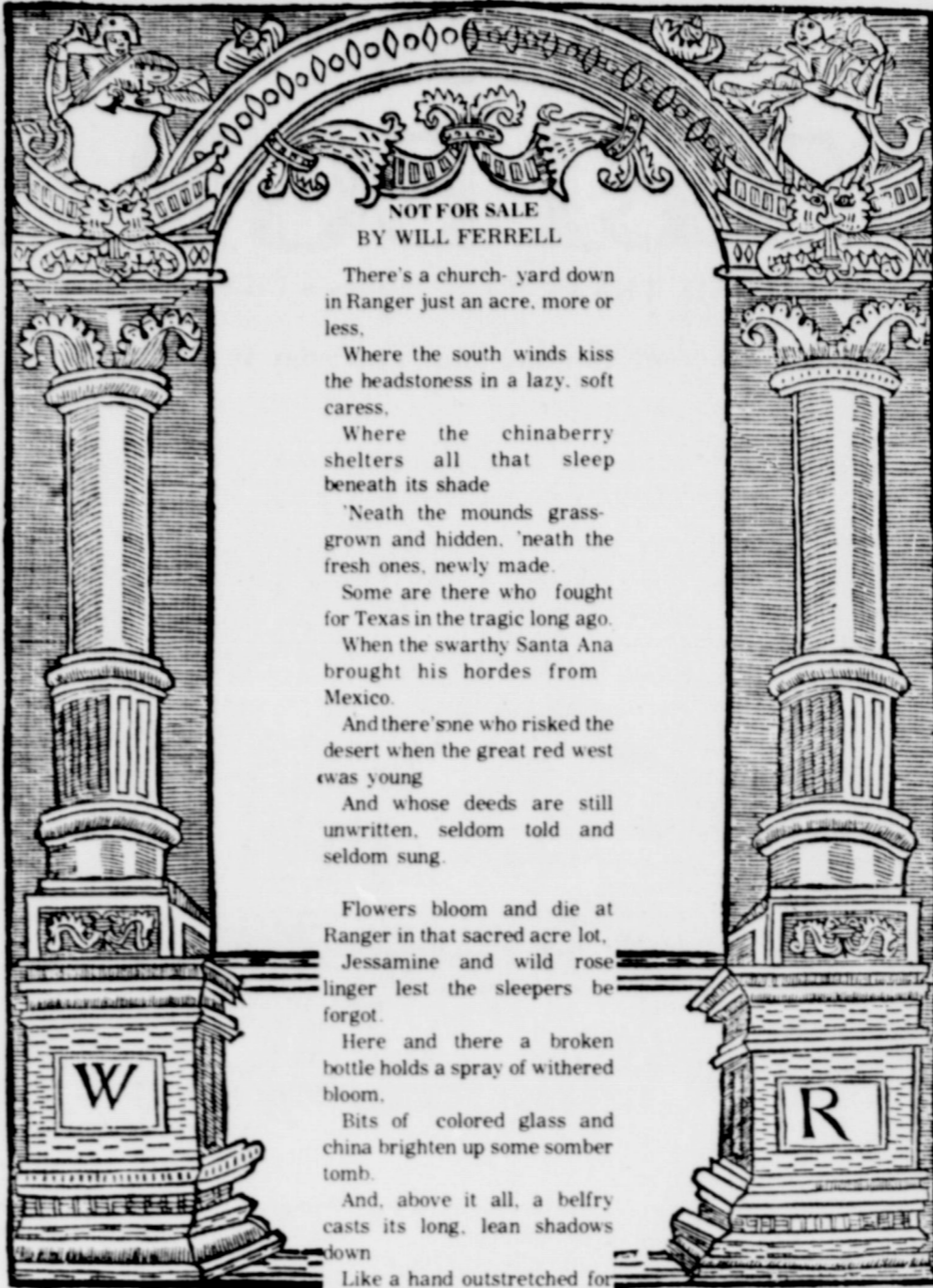

Dr. Johnson who has spent his life in this community is well known as one of our most enterprising young men, thoroughly equipped for his profession in which he stands at the very head. Besides this he is a great big man every way you take him—just the man to make a strong protector and affectionate partner for the intelligent woman he has won for life's companionship. The bride is one of the most charming and intellectual young ladies of the city, graced with all the beauty and accomplishments that go to make perfect womanhood.

May that happiness which ever blesses true unselfish love be theirs through life.

The principals you recognize as the parents of Verna Johnson. Her father began the practice of medicine here in 1897 and her mother was a

teacher of English and Latin in the Eastland School System. Her mother's mother was killed in the Cisco cyclone of April, 1893.
