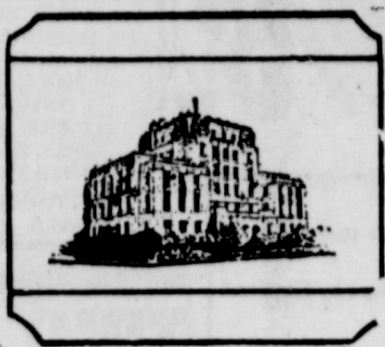

IT WAS A good day when the Don Barron family came to Eastland about ten years ago. And if it weren't for the importance of the task that takes them away, Eastlanders would feel worse about their going.
