

The festival is a contest strictly for elementary and junior high bands, orchestras, and choral groups. It includes events in concert, sightreading, solos, ensembles, and twirling. Organizations winning first division, or "superior" ratings in concert and sight-reading receive trophies, and individuals and smallensemble winners receive award medals

The Cisco Junior High Choir will be in concert at 11:15 Thursday and the Junior High Band will participate in the festival at 8:20 Saturday.
