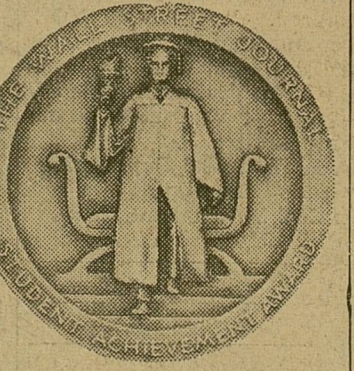

When "books are let out" at South and West Wards Friday afternoon, a long chapter of facilities service will be completed. Both schools are to be vacated and elementary students will march into the new building when classes take up in the fall.

County Livestock Feeders Dinner Is Held May 23

The annual Eastland County 4-H Livestock Feeders Banquet was held Saturday night, May 23, at the Cisco Junior College Cafeteria.

Kathy Kincaid, Morton Valley 4-H Club member, was mistress of ceremonies. J. M. Cooper, county agent gave the invocation and Clarence Dill, commissioner of precinct 4 welcomed those attending. Robert Harvin, Eastland 4-H Club, gave the response and thanked Cisco Junior College for the use of the facilities.

After the meal and recognition of guests, Sandra Warlick, Rising Star 4-H, presented a plaque to Robert Kincaid on behalf of the Eastland County 4-H Clubs in appreciation for the fine job he did as superintendent of the county livestock show.

Plans for the two buildings are to be announced by the school board it has been reported. The new building, located in the southwest part of town, south of Sadosa St., is expected to be completed by July 1st.

The old buildings have served their purpose well, a spokesman said, but all will

be happy to take advantage of the new modern facilities.

As is customary in Eastland there will be no formal ceremony marking junior high school completion.

At the end of the year there were 50 juniors, 72 sophomores and 72 freshmen reported.

New Infant Feeding System Adopted at Local Hospital

Eastland Memorial Hospital here has adopted a new system of infant feeding which eliminates the scrubbing, boiling, measuring, sterilizing, shaking, refrigerating, heating and testing-on-the-wrist at 2 a. m.

"We adopted this new system," says Nursing Supervisor Mrs. Mary Sue Lee, R.N. "as the latest step in our continuing efforts to insure that infants in our nursery get the best possible care."

The system was developed for hospital use by Wyeth Laboratories, manufacturers of pharmaceuticals and infant nutritional. The new system is disposable, ready-to-feed nurse consisting of a prepared formula in a pre-sterilized feeding bottle and a sterile nipple. Both are sealed inside plastic covering, and bottle and nipple can be discarded after a single use. No refrigeration is needed.

Inside the bottle is a unique formula, S-M-A, S-26, used in hospitals and homes throughout the world. The closest approximation ever made to the composition of human breast milk, the formula is widely prescribed for both premature and full term infants. Like human breast milk, the formula contains a higher level of lactalbumin, the so-called "booster" protein, than is available in other formulas or cow milk.

Using the new system, a nurse at the Eastland Hospital nursery can prepare a bottle for one of her fledgling

charges in something under ten seconds.

She opens a plastic envelope, loosens the lid on the bottle, and opens a packet containing a sterile nipple and a protective hood. Lifting the nipple by its hood, she places the nipple on the bottle without touching either.

As the formula has been stored at room temperature, she doesn't have to heat it and, in less time than it takes to tell, is ready to feed the baby. Bottle and nipple are disposable; but, if desired, the nipples can be sterilized and re-used.

"Having formula, always ready to feed, right in the nursery is a great convenience," says Mrs. Lee.

"In fact," she says, "we can store a supply of the new formula packages at the mother's bedside. Then when we bring her baby at the infant's meal time, the formula is right there, ready to go. If the baby is extra hungry, we simply open another bottle."

"We feel the formula itself performs just like human milk and therefore is well-tolerated by nearly every infant. Furthermore the formula and nipples have been thoroughly tested and we are sure that strict sterility is maintained right up to the moment the baby puts the nipple in his mouth.

"Now that our nurses don't have to prepare bottles, nipples and formula," she said, "they are able to spend more time caring for our babies. We all like that."

Mrs. Lee said that, although the new system is presently available only to hospitals, the formula can be purchased in powder or liquid form at many drug stores. And, she said, the hospital makes available a container of the new ready-to-feed bottles to mothers leaving the hospital with their babies.

"It eliminates formula preparation and helps tide them over the first few days at home when there are so many other demands on their strength," Mrs. Lee said.

Open Saturday

Most businesses in Eastland will be open Saturday, Memorial Day, according to a survey made by the Eastland Telegram.

Of the number contacted, 27 will definitely be open for business as usual, seven were undecided at press time, and three will be closed.

To be closed are the Post Office, Eastland Memorial Hospital business office and Alma's Beauty Shop.

The initial budget, made up of estimated annual askings of ten organizations or programs to be included in the United Fund group was set at \$2,130 and would be accomplished in one drive.

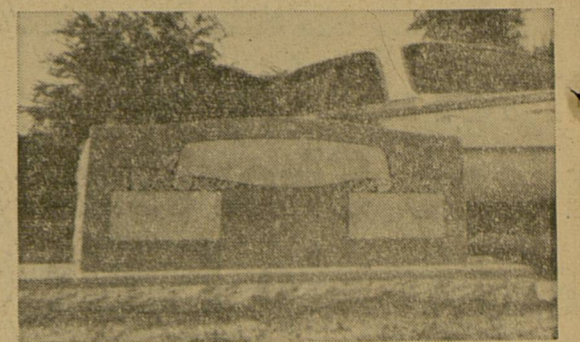
Long Branch To Have Homecoming

Tahiti at Easter-Time

Papeete, Easter March 29, 1964
 Today's trip on the island of Tahiti was by bus which left the ship at 9:15 on a day of alternating sunshine and rain. Our guide, a native named Emily, gave us valuable information throughout the trip.
 There is a main road that follows the shore all the 85 miles around the island, and our trip followed this route part way around. Flowers were everywhere, and the tall graceful coconut palms were majestic as they waved in the wind. Being Sunday there was lots of traffic, bicycles, and small cars, and many pedestrians. We noticed many churches — Catholic, Protestant, Mormon and Seventh Day Adventist.
 We noticed that after leaving Papeete we saw no homes except those of one story. The older homes have thatched roofs, while some of the more modern ones are roofed with sheet steel. Tahiti is fast becoming a fashionable dwelling place and many of the newer homes are very beautiful and most have followed the old custom of construction and have elegant roofs thatched with matting woven from palm leaves. Our guide pointed out houses that are now, or have been, the homes of famous people, including the writers of the South Seas, James Norman Hall and Charles Nordhoff; the French painter, Paul Gauguin who lived on the island from 1896 to 1901; and the well known star actor Marlon Brando.
 As we rode along in our comfortable bus we observed several interesting things. One was a man sun-bathing while stretched out on top of a bus that had been parked beside the road. Roadside signs which warn that a school is nearby show the figures of a boy and a girl walking with books under their arms. We overtook and passed a girl who drove an auto and was delivering long, thin delicious looking loaves of French bread. She simply stuck them into mail boxes.
 Our trip took us to historic Point Venus, where on June 23, 1767, Captain Wallis commanding His Majesty's Ship, "Dolphin" discovered the island by accident. Two years later Captain Cook in H.M.S. "Endeavour" came to this spot

on an assignment by the Royal Society of London to observe the passing of the planet Venus across the sun. The name Point Venus was given to commemorate that visit. Today there is a lighthouse there.

A stop was made at the tomb of the last king of Tahiti, King Pomare V. He died a drunkard and on top of his elaborate stone tomb there is a large stone replica of an abrinthe bottle.

Before we had lunch at the Hotel Tahiti Village we made a side trip of the main road to visit one of the several open-air temples of the old Polynesian religion. There we found a stone platform made of wet lava and coral where high priests and idol-bearers conducted services which occasionally included human sacrifices.
