

Out here in West Central Texas where there's not a lot of lettuce grown, at least commercially, many of us probably had question marks on our brows over the frequent mention of the "lettuce boycott", at the recent Democratic convention.

That's why this article from the Farm Bureau's mmonthly magazine, "The American Farmer", helped explain the situation. We quote:


"FELLOW LETTUCE BOYCOTTERS

The New Politics of the Mc Govern forces at the National Democratic convention gave a lot of exposure and support to but little explanation of the lettuce boycott. Involved is a jurisdictional

dispute between two unions - -Chavez's AFL - CIO United Farm Workers National Union with between five and fifteen percent of the California Arizona lettuce production under contract and the Teamsters Union which has more than 70 percent under contracts, some of which go back several years. About 90 percent of the lettuce grown in the U.S. comes from California and Arizona.

In supporting the Chavez boycott - - which attempts to exclude all but UFW lettuce - the McGovern forces have taken up the cudgel for an AFL - CIO union against the independent Teamsters and against thousands of small lettuce producers in the Atlantic states, upper Midwest, South, and the Rocky Mountain area where little hired labor is used and no labor disputes exist

account of the Santa Claus Bank Robbery in his new book "The Santa Claus Bank

Robbery. The book will be on sale at the bank by the author and he will be autographing the copies. Greene will be at the bank from 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon, 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. and from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. The public is cordially invited to attend.

The following is an account of the book by Leonard Sanders of the Fort Worth Star Telegram. Greene carefully points out that his account is not historical, but a "human reconstruction." At the edge of Cisco they stopped an oncoming family car driven by Woodrow Harris, 14, of Rising Star. Harris, his parents and grandmother were ordered out of the car at gunpoint. Harris compiled. But he thoughtfully locked the ignition and took the keys with him (and today carries an engraved watch presented to him by the bank's grateful insurance company)

Under fire from the posse, the bandits shifted hostages, money, and the dying Davis to the Harris car. After the discovery that they didnot have the keys, they shifted back to the Buick. The fatally injured bandit was left behind in the Harris car. In the excitement, so was the money (not a large loss; banker Jewell Poe had stuffed the sack mostly with non negotiables). A few miles farther on, the bandits abandoned car and hostages, and fled on foot

This was the opening chapter in what newspapers at the time termed the state's largest manhunt.
