TEXAS DEPT. Agriculture Commissioner John C. White issued a progress bulletin on the lesser cornstalk borer infestations in peanut fields in the central Texas area. The DeLeon Research Laboratory has reported a sharp increase in the numbers of lesser cornstalk borers found in the DeLeon area. Highest numbers of corn borers are in dry land fields and in fields which have yet to be irrigated. Some fields checked have been as high as 25 percent. Another area close to Comanche also has high infestations of corn borers. Generally throughout the other areas in Eastland, Erath, and Brown counties, population remain below the



Health. A new law has just become effective which eventually will lead to the use of flame resistant material in children's sleepwear and children's outer

At this time, children's slee wear in sizes 0 to 6X must be resistant to flames or have a warning placed on it that it is July this clothing must be flame resistant.

sleepwear gives manufacturers flame resistant fabrics. When a

flame resistant fabric, but on July 29, 1973, all children's sleepwear through 6X must meet the standard or not be sold, says the State Health Department


there's more than a good chance that the person will be burned - - sometimes horribly, sometimes fatally, but always painfully

Burns in the United States are killing and crippling more people than polio did in its peak epidemic year in 1954. In 1954, about 50,000 persons contracted polio and 1,500 died of it. In contrast, according to National Safety Council figures, 6,700 persons died in fires and of burn injuries in 1970, and 250,000 suffered disabling in-

In clothing, says the State Health Department's Bedding and Product Safety Division, it is the quick igniting fabric which causes the greatest human losses. These soft fabrics, usually highly -

When You Go Dancing

Whenever business was good at a suburban night club, the man-agement would "stretch" their space by putting extra tables and chairs on the edge of the dance floor. One night, a dancing couple

stumbled over a stray chair. The woman suffered painful injuries, and later sued the club for damages. She pointed out that the chair had been shoved several feet into the dancing area.

"If it was," countered the management, "some other customer must have done the shoving. We are not legally liable for what our customers do.'

But the court granted the woman's claim. The court said that by placing chairs directly onto the dance floor, the management had set the stage for trouble



ditions of reasonable safety. The dance floor, the lighting, and the furnishings should all be maintained in such a way as to mini-mize the chance of accidents.

PUBLIC NOTICE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER 4 ON THE BALLOT (HJR 61)

General Election November 7, 1972

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE LEGISLATURE O STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Article XVII, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding a Section 2 to read as fol-

'Section 2. (a) When the legislature convenes in regular session in January, 1973, it shall provide by concurrent re-solution for the establishment of a constitutional revision commission. The legislature shall appropriate money to provide an adequate staff, office space, equipment, and supplies for the commission.

b) The commission shall the need for constitutional change and shall report its recommendations to the members of the legislature not later than November 1, 1973. "(c) The members of the

63rd Legislature shall be convened as a constitutional convention at noon on the second Tuesday in January, 1974. The lieutenant governor shall pre-side until a chairman of the convention is elected. The convention shall elect other offi cers it deems necessary, adopt temporary and permanent rules, and publish a journal of its proceedings. A person elected to fill a vacancy in the 63rd Legislature before dissolution the convention becomes a member of the convention on

taking office as a member of the legislature. Members of the convention shall receive compensation, mileage, per diem as de-termined by a five member committee, to be composed of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and Chief Justice of the Court of Criminal Appeals.
This shall not be held in conflict with Article XVI, Section 33 of the Texas Constitution. The convention may provide for the expenses of its members and for the employment staff for the convention, and for these purposes may by resolution appropriate money from the general revenue fund of the state treasury. Warrants

shall be drawn pursuant to vouchers signed by the chair-man or by a person authorized by him in writing to sign them.
"(e) The convention, by resolution adopted on the vote

of at least two-thirds of its members, may submit for a vote of the qualified electors of this state a new constitution which may contain alternative articles or sections, or may sub-mit revisions of the existing constitution which may con tain alternative articles or sec tions. Each resolution shall specify the date of the election, the form of the ballots, and the method of publicizing the proposals to be voted on. To be adopted, each proposal must receive the favorable vote of the majority of those voting on the proposal. The conduct of the election, the canvassing of the votes, and the reporting of the returns shall be as pro-vided for elections under Sec-

on 1 of this article.

'(f) The convention may be dissolved by resolution adopted on the vote of at least twothirds of its members; but it is automatically dissolved at 11:59 p.m. on May 31, 1974, unless its duration is extended for a period not to exceed 60 days by resolution adopted on vote of at least two-thirds of its members.

(g) The Bill of Rights of the present Texas Constitution shall be retained in full."

Sec. 2. The foregoing consti-tutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1972, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposi-tion: "The constitutional amendment providing for a constitutional revision commis-sion which precedes the conof the members of the 63rd Legislature as a constitutional convention in January 1974, for the purpose of sub-mitting to the voters a new constitution or revisions of the existing state constitution.

PUBLIC NOTICE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER 5 ON THE BALLOT (HJR 35)

General Election November 7, 1972

LEGISLATURE OF TEXAS Section 1. That Section 2, Article VIII, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:

IT RESOLVED BY

"Section 2. (a) All occupa-tion taxes shall be equal and uniform upon the same class of subjects within the limits of the authority levying the tax; but the legislature may, by general laws, exempt from taxa-tion public property used for public purposes; actual places of religious worship, also any property owned by a church or by a strictly religious society for the exclusive use as a dwell-ing place for the ministry of such church or religious socie-ty, and which yields no reve-nue whatever to such church or religious society; provided that such exemption shall not exsuch exemption shall not ex-tend to more property than is reasonably necessary for a dwelling place and in no event more than one acre of land; places of burial not held for private or corporate profit; all less than 10 percent and has at buildings used exclusively and tained the age of 65, or a dis owned by persons or associa-tions of persons for school purposes and the necessary furni-ture of all schools and property used exclusively and reason-ably necessary in conducting any association engaged in proany association engaged in promoting the religious, educational and physical development of boys, girls, young men or young women operating under a State or National organization of like character; also the endowment funds of such institutions of learning and religious. institutions of learning and reli-gion not used with a view to profit; and when the same are invested in bonds or mortgages, or in land or other property which has been and shall here-after be bought in by such in-stitutions under foreclosure stitutions under foreclosure sales made to satisfy or protect such bonds or mortgages, that such exemption of such land and property shall continue only for two years after the purchase of the same at such sale by such institutions and no

armed services of the United States who is classified as dis-abled by the Veterans' Administration or by a successor to that agency; or the military ser-vice in which he served. A vete-ran who is certified as having a disability of less than 10 per-cent is not entitled to an exemption. A veteran having a disability rating of not less than 10 percent nor more than 30 percent may be granted an exemption from taxation for property valued at up to \$1,500. A veteran having a dis ability rating of more than 30 percent but not more than 50 percent may be granted an exemption from taxation for property valued at up to \$2,000. A veteran having a disability rating of more than 50 percent but not more than 70 percent may be granted an exemption from taxation for property valued at up to \$2,500. A veteran who has a disability rating of more than 70 percent, or a veteran who has a disability rating of not consists of the loss or loss of use of one or more limbs, total blindness in one or both eyes or paraplegia, may be granted veteran's surviving spouse and children may be granted an exemption which in the aggregate is equal to the exemption to which the decedent was en-

titled at the time he died."
Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state such exemption of such land and property shall continue only for two years after the purchase of the same at such sale by such institutions and no longer, and institutions of purely public charity; and all laws exempting property from taxation other than the property mentioned in this Section shall be null and void.

"(b) The Legislature may, by general law, exempt property owned by a disabled veteran or by the surviving spouse and surviving minor children of members of the armed forces who lose their life while on active duty."
