the modern center, located in the White Elephant Building on West Main St.

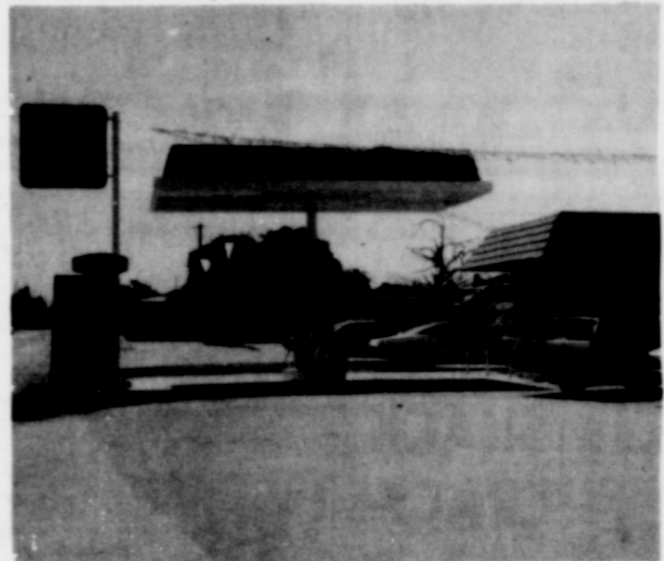
Among the many features of the Open House are special value prices throughout the grocery section, and free prizes to be given away.

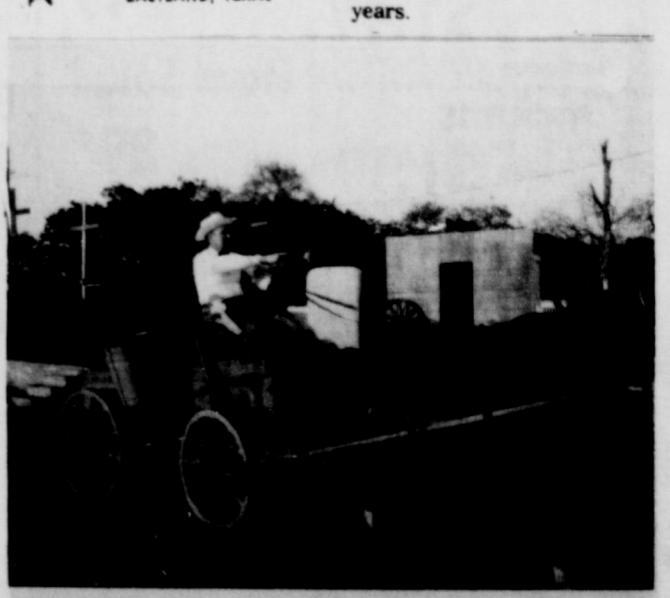
## Laminack
