

Democrats will have a longer ballot in this county. Both ballots have the "busing" referendum and the GOP also offers a voice on "Daylight Saving Time"



The new, best-selling Texas - Off The Beaten Trail, at over 500 pages in seven topical divisions, is a big book. It should be big; its preparation was a seven-year undertaking by Hill Country author - historian - columnist William Edward Syers of Kerrville.

Coverage ranges from the prehistory of Glen Rose's dinosaur valley to today's river runs of the Big Bend canyons. Geographically, its contents range from Old Tascosa's boot hill above Amarillo and from El Paso's white missions, to the "Old South" of Jefferson and to Dick Dowling's mud fort below Port Arthur, in the north and southeast tips of Texas. One reviewer called OBT "complete Texana from border to border and prehistory to yesterday.

Completely indexed and mapped, this complete onevolume edition is published in both hard and soft cover by Texian Press of Waco.

Over 500 pages - Indexed - Cloth cover - \$7.00 - Paper Cover - \$4.25
