Bell Book Due Out March 2

Unlike the dollar, there are no rules or regulations against writing in the directory; so a time saving device, highly recommended, is the underlining of frequently called numbers.

"In addition to emergency listings for fire, police, sheriff, and ambulance services, the directory contains an alphabetical index to its "yellow pages" classified section, and a complete call guide for placing local and long distance telephone calls," noted John McGowan, manager for Southwestern Bell. 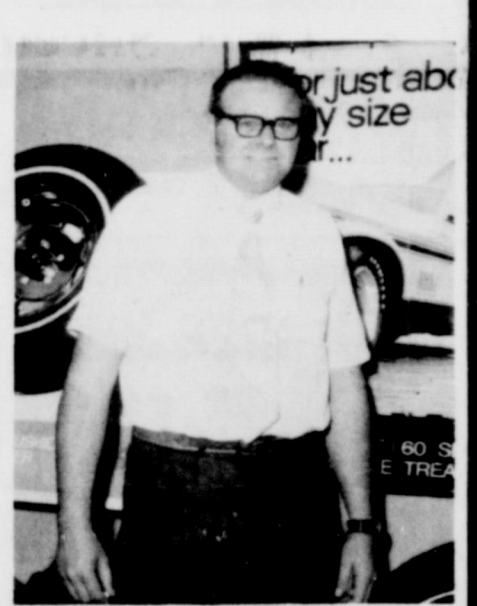

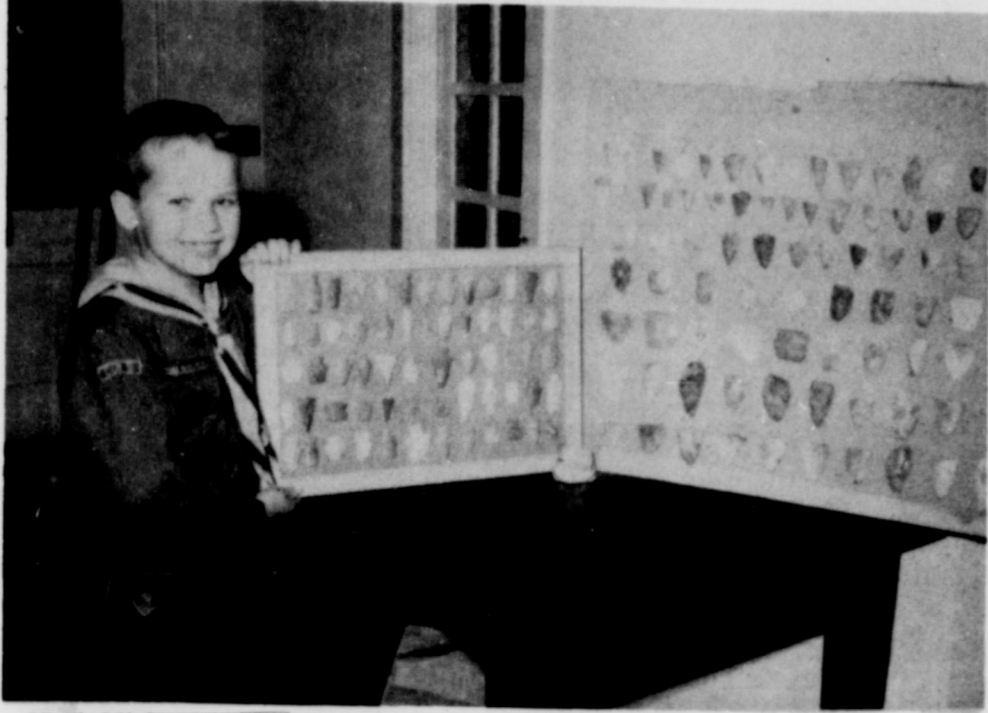

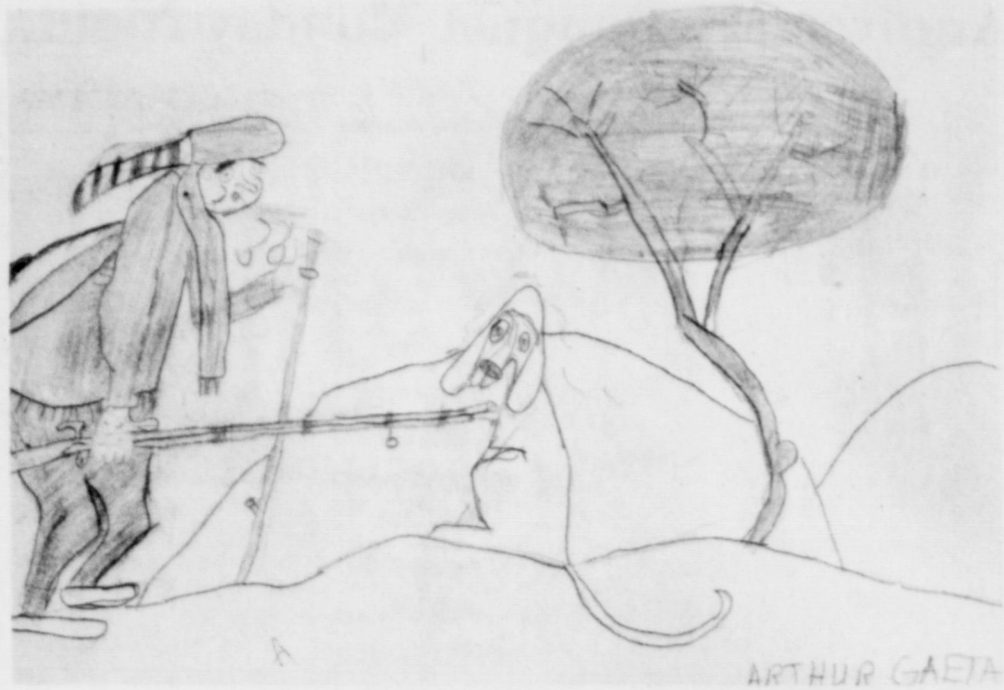

A great deal of confusion and misunderstanding has resulted from the new regulations issued by USDA to exclude peanuts from skip - row planting. This pertains to skip - row planting only and not strip - row. The skip - row planting pattern is peanuts alternated with idle land. The strip - row planting is peanuts stripped with a competitive crop. The current rules on strip - row planting remain unchanged.

This has been thoroughly checked with the compliance department in Washington, and any reports to the contrary are erroneous. For further information or clarification, check with your local ASCS office.

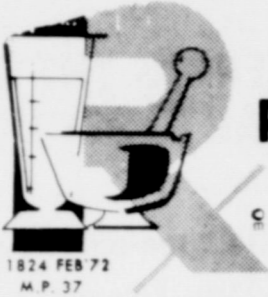

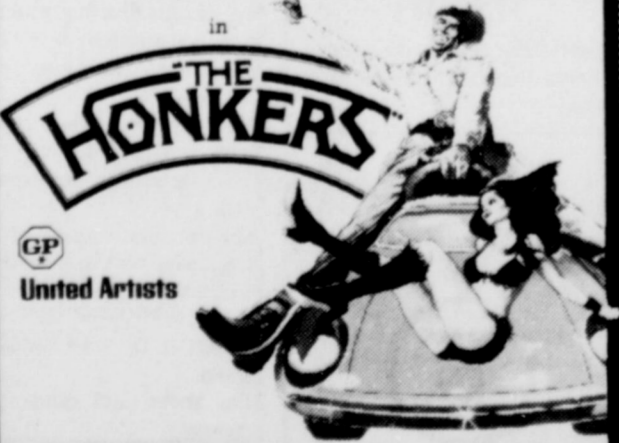
