Speaking about the so called stock scandal in Austin, Hobby said he has directed several newspaper investigations into government corruption. One of those probes resulted in the award of a coveted Pulitzer Prize to a Houston Post reporter.

As a working newspaperman, Hobby said he knows how corruption in government

In his address here Monday, the candidate also cited the need for reform in all three branches of state government - executive, legislative, and iudicial.

The Governor should be able to appoint directly - - subject to approval of the Senate - - the heads of major departments. in this way can the Governor logically be held accountable for the efficient functioning of these departments, Hobby said.

Hobby also said he believes the power of conference committees should be limited to adjusting differences between the two houses of the

As it is, the conference committee functions as a "third house" of the Legislature. Hobby termed that practice "anti - cemocratic," and vowed he would work to

Hobby also cited the need for automobile insurance reforms. Insurance rates have risen beyond the ability of most Texans to pay, he said. He added that as presiding officer of the Senate, he will work to see that needed reforms are made to control the spiralling insurance rates.

The candidate also said he favors an amendment which would make it possible to revoke the bail of anyone indicted for a second felony while free on bond on another charge.

Hobby also pledged to work for laws making it harder for murderers to go free. He pointed out that Texas is the

only state that does not allow oral confessions to be admitted

Hobby said the state's court

system should be beefed up in the high crime areas to insure swift and sure punishment of

To alert Texas young people to the dangers of drugs, Hobby recommends a massive education program. For those

who sell drugs to our youngsters, he will demand stiffer penalties and strict enforcement.







3b. The election in the Eastland Precinct shall be held in the Eastland County Court House and Mr. Pat Crawford is hereby appointed Election Judge for said election and he shall appoint such other clerks as he deems necessary to assist him.

4. Only qualified voters residing in the Eastland County Water Supply District who own taxable property in said District and have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be entitled to vote at said election.

5. Mr. Charles Freyschlag, Mr. Willard Griffin, Mr. Dewey Cox, Jr., and Mr. Jess Weaver have made application to have their names printed on the ballots and such applications are hereby granted, the ballots, however, shall contain blank spaces to permit the writing in of other names.

6. The ballots for the Eastland Precinct shall have printed thereon the following: OFFICIAL BALLOT

I must commend you on your efforts to determine the wishes of Eastland Citizens in regard to the various capital improvement programs under discussion. All are good, and I would like to see a new community center with library combined, paving, sewer line extension to unserved areas in the city, city park development, voluntary annexation to both Int. 20 interchanges, and possibly other desirable projects.

I feel sure many of us are interested only in the projects that benefit us personally. 

Grocery Supervisor for Sherwood Foster Home at Stephenville, was in Eastland Friday, March 3, to pick up groceries, supplies, and cash valued at \$105.22, donated by the Plummer and Daugherty St. Church of Christ.

Meal - time is an important part of child - care, says Mr. Berryhill The Sherwood Foster Home presently cares for 42 children in four large cottages

are staffed with a family supervisor and meals are prepared by the house - mother and the children. Groceries are consumed by the four cottages at the rate of \$700 per month not including meats. A central storeroom is used for grocery storage supervised by Mr. Berryhill. From this room the house - mothers shop for daily meals. One item, sugar, is consumed at the rate of 200

is 12 years old and has a capacity of 48 children. The ages presently range from 6 -Mr. Dick Blythe, Superintendent, two secretaries, four house - families, of which two men serve in maintenance and grocery supervisor.

The needs of the home are supplied in a variety of ways. The Graham Street Church of Christ in Stephenville is the largest single contributor,

ending \$200 per month and the etal donation on "Foster Home hunday" each year. A Randol dills church furnishes large amounts of potatoes. A 30 acre pasture near the home is used to feed out beef - calves for the cottages' tables. A Stephenville Bank shares their printing press with the home for use in their advertising. Mr. Berryhill has a grocery - route to supply the weekly food needs of the 42 children. The total area covered is from Dallas to Sweetwater and from Wichita Falls to Austin. According to Mr. Berryhill, the average day will net about \$60 to \$100 in the grocery pickup. The \$105.22 from the Eastland church was an unusually large amount for one pickup

Urgently needed items are sugar and cleaning agents. Mr. Berryhill says a pickup truck is needed for use on the grocery route. Presently he uses the only passenger van owned by the home. Also needed is a walk in cooler for fruits and vegetables and a freezer for

Eastland church welcomes interested people to share with them in the grocery ministry to the Sherwood Foster Home. When sufficient amounts are collected in Eastland, a special station wagon load will be sent directly

to Stephenville. Anyone desiring to make a grocery donation may bring it to the church or contact Mr. J.E. Pennington, 307 S. Daugherty.

The children of the Sherwood Foster Home respond to the care shown to them. An eighth grade student in the home writes
