But because they flow through the most fertile valleys on the planet, these rivers have millions of people along

and that must mean that one of two things is true. Either we have not been using the right tactics in our controll campaign-or the campaign is doomed to defeat by
the very nature of things, and we shall have disastrous floods every so often in spite of anything we may do. If the latter is the case, we can take it; we have so far,
at any rate, and we probably can go on doing so. But before we admit defeat, we might do well to study the whole problem from a new angle. Isn't th
attach that might lead to victory?

It may be that there is a way; a strategy by which we would look on the whole tremendous river system as a
unit, to be curbed by a great, coordinated campaign more far-reaching and thorough than anything we have ever tried.
We have a handy laboratory in the Tennessee valley, sine way. Under the Tennessee Valley Authority, it is not merely being turned to the production of electric power,
it is being made flood-proof and erosion-proof, chained with an indefinite network of dams, spillways, sluices, forests, terraced slopes, and similar works so that, when
the job is finished, the Tennessee and its tributaries will the job is finished, the Tenness
