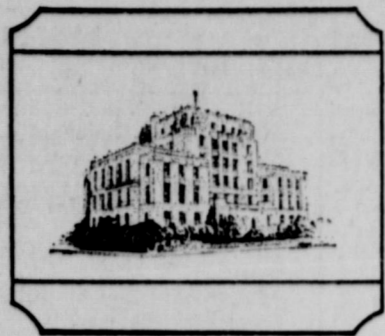

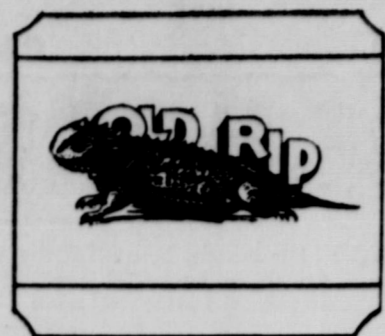

Commissioners Get Petition; Deposit Money

A petition asking the opening of a road to the Providence Cemetery near Lake Leon was presented to the County Commissioners Court this week, but no action was taken.

The petition brought by Mr. W. E. Hallenback carried several signatures. The road at the lake has been a matter of concern to many involved there for quite some time.

The commissioners also heard a recommendation from County Auditor C. H. O'Brien that \$50,000 in county funds be deposited in Eastland National Bank on time deposit to draw interest.

The bank recently offered the county an interest-bearing arrangement in their depository bid. It will mark the first time, at least in recent history, that county funds have drawn interest on deposit.

Plans Complete for County Stock Show Opening Today

Approximately 500 animals will be on exhibit at the Eastland County Livestock show to begin Thursday, (today) at the show ground northwest of Eastland.

The annual parade to formally open the show will be held Friday at 2 p.m., according to Bill Cagle, captain of the County Sheriff's Posse, who is sponsoring the parade. Many riding clubs and high school bands in the area are expected to participate in the colorful affair. Judges for the floats will be representatives of the five banks over the county.

Over \$1800 in cash prizes will be awarded to the youthful owners of the prize animals. Adults will compete for ribbons only. The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association, San Angelo will award medallions to the grand champion billy and the grand champion fine wool ram.

Rigid requirements and specifications dictate that every youngster "toe up" to win honors in this show.

All animals must be entered and in their places by 10 p.m., today (Thursday) according to show officials. Classifying, sifting and judging will start promptly at 8 a.m. Friday with a full schedule of activities until the auction of the fat lambs, pigs, and steers at the Eastland Sales Barn, a mile east on Highway 80 on Saturday night.

Sponsored by the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association, the show will be held at the association's modern facilities northeast of Eastland. The show grounds can be reached by turning north off West Main (at College Street) and passing Hollywood - Vassarette Co., the Haydite Plant and turning left to the area. Sam Kimmell, Cisco, is president of the association and Robert Kincaid, Morton Valley, is general superintendent.

Another feature will be a 4-H Club and FFA judging contest on Friday night. Banners and awards to high teams and individuals will be furnished by the Commercial State Bank, Ranger, according to Glynn Gilliam, banker, who is also vice-president of the livestock association.

The public has been extended a welcome to all phases of the show and there are no admission charges. Concession booths will be available.

The show animals of club boys and girls will be offered for sale at auction Saturday night at the Eastland Auction Sale ring, it was announced. This sale usually attracts a large crowd of buyers who pay premium prizes for the club animals.

JUDGING SCHEDULE

Schedule on judging for the Livestock Show this Friday and Saturday has been announced as follows:

Friday — 8 a. m., dairy animals; 10 a. m., Angora goats; 1 p. m., breeding classes of swine; 2 p. m., fat barrows and gilts; and 7:30 p. m., breeding classes of sheep.

Saturday — 8 a. m., fat lambs; 11 a. m., fat steers; 2 p. m., breeding classes of beef cattle; and 7 p. m., auction sale of fat barrows, fat lambs and fat steers.

The Livestock Parade, sponsored by the sheriff's posse, will begin at 2 p. m. Friday in Eastland.

"We can expect our most successful educational and fund-raising campaign ever," the president said. Last year the Society's goal was \$2719, and the Society raised \$4447.18, which is the largest amount raised in Eastland County.

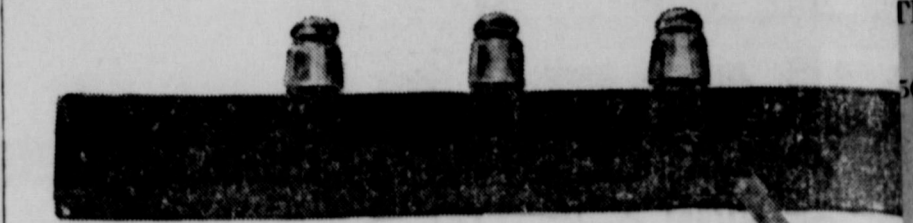

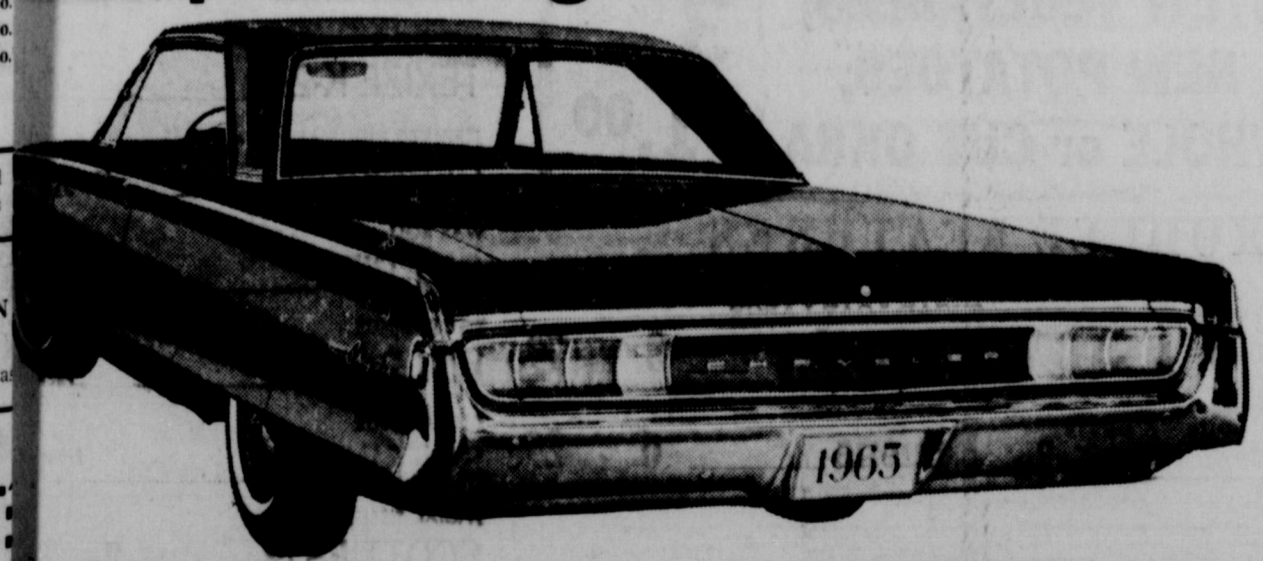

Announcement was made of the annual meeting of the Guild in Fort Worth on March 28. There were 36 women present and the Rev. Davenport, pastor.

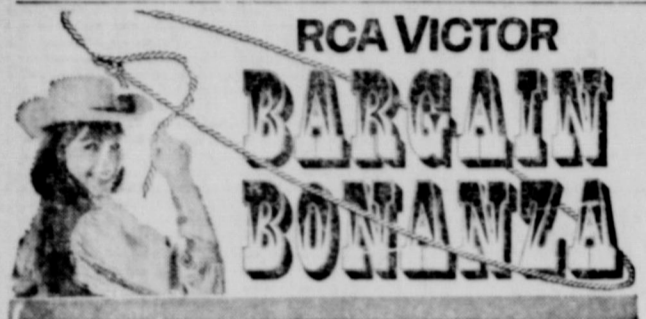

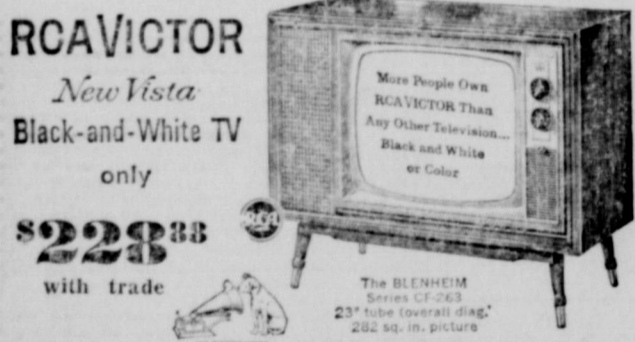

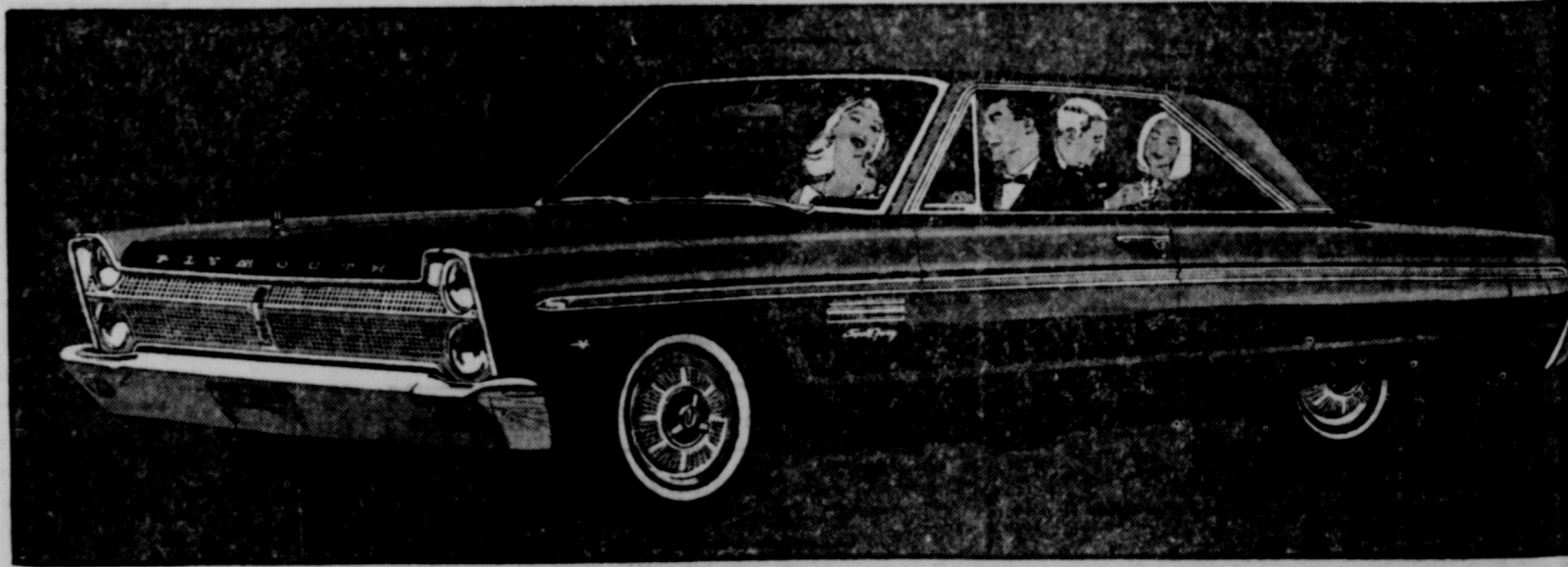
