## County Officers, 7 Newly-Elected, Will Be Sworn in Friday, January 1

### UP-DATING OF APPEALS COURT QUARTERS IS DUE AFTER JAN. 1

Renovation and modernization of the 11th Court of Civil Appeals' quarters on the fifth floor of the Eastland County Courthouse is expected to be taken under close consideration soon after the first of the year.

The two major improvements will be air conditioning and expansion of the court's library space. Both of these items have been target for attack by out-of-townsmen who have in the past suggested moving of the court because of these inadequacies.

Estimates are that the work can be handled for some \$35,000 to \$40,000. A native son, Raymond Thomas, formerly of Cisco, and now of Sherman, is studying the proposed needs and will probably make recommendations to the County Commissioners Court soon after Jan. 1.

Mr. Thomas has suggested that library space can be doubled by building "up." The top-floor site of the court has extremely high ceilings and it has been suggested that the center library area could be expanded upward, utilizing either rolling ladders or special metal elevated flooring to raise searchers up to more shelves. This would necessitate no structural changes.

The library area is surrounded by offices of the court justices, the clerk's and stenographer's offices and the court hearing room. Ceilings in these could be lowered, it is believed by officials, to allow the installation of adequate ducting for air conditioning.

Judge Clyde Grissom is chief justice of the court and Judge Cecil C. Collings and Judge Esco Walter are associate justices.

Homersmith is court clerk; Carmen B. Verhetsel, deputy clerk; and Oleta Moseley, stenographer.

The court serves a 23-county area made up of Baylor, Borden, Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Dawson, Eastland, Erath, Fisher, Haskell, Howard, Jones, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Palo Pinto, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall Taylor and Throckmorton counties.

County Commissioner C. B. Dill of Cisco will likely be one of the leaders in the project in that traditionally overseeing operation and maintenance of the courthouse falls to the Cisco commissioner.

Cost of the modernization of this key Eastland County asset can probably be handled through time warrants, it is reported, without the necessity of a bond issue.

## Money-Wise, Eastland County Is In Good Shape For Coming Year

Money-wise, Eastland County will enter 1965 somewhat like the old man who claims: "Never felt better, and had less in my life."

The county's finances are in good shape — even though certain indications point to the fact that things aren't what they used to be. It's no secret of course, that population is down, and for the first time in several years, county tax valuations are down, too.

Assessed valuations for 1964 are \$21,164,040 — considerably below last year's \$21,871,540. The county traditionally shows a superior record of collections, however, and even with a meager 80 cent on the hundred rate, the county coffers are in bright form because of decreasing debt requirements.

Eastland County owes a total of \$93,286, with \$15,235 in the sinking fund ready to be paid on the debt. So, actually, the outstanding obligation amounts to only \$88,049. This is made up of \$42,000 of general obligation debt (to which

the \$15,235 interest and sinking fund money will be paid) and \$51,284 for a floating debt for machinery, which will be paid out of the various road and bridge funds.

Taxes are now in process of collection and the traditional one per cent discount is available through Dec. 31. After Jan. 31, interest and penalty are charged.

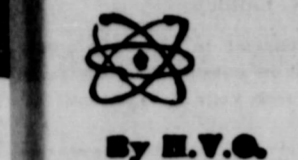

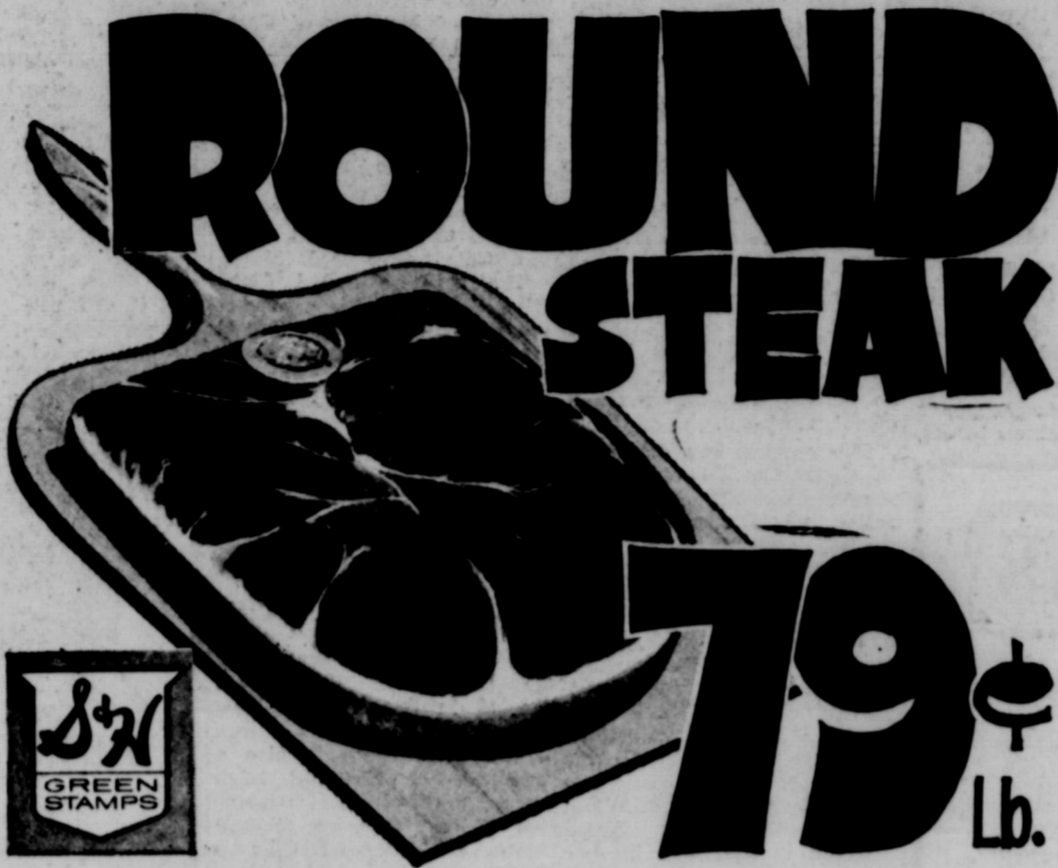

### FIRST PATRONAGE CAPITAL REFUNDED BY COUNTY REA

The Comanche County Electric Cooperative has mailed "Patronage Capital" refund checks to some 2,000 members and former members for the return of capital contributed during the years 1939 through 1943.

The membership equity including operating capital and reserves is furnished by the members as a part of the electric service bill which they pay each month.

At the end of each year, all funds which are in excess of actual operating expenses are credited to the members' capital accounts. In keeping with the ideals of a cooperative, non-profit operation, it is the aim of the management and the board of directors to return this capital as soon as it is financially possible to do so.

This year it was felt that the Cooperative could begin to refund the oldest capital and have prepared checks to 2,000 members totaling \$28,000. Most of these were mailed last week and the others are being mailed as correct addresses can be found.

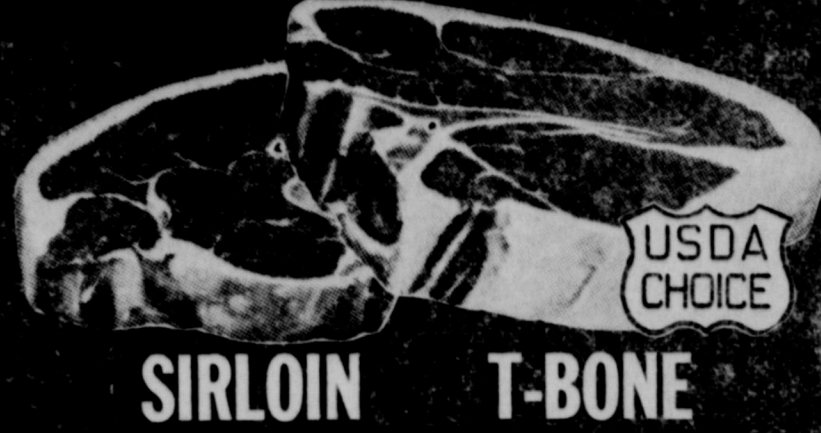
