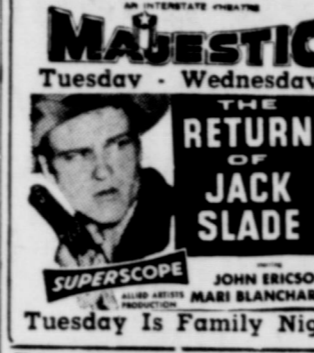

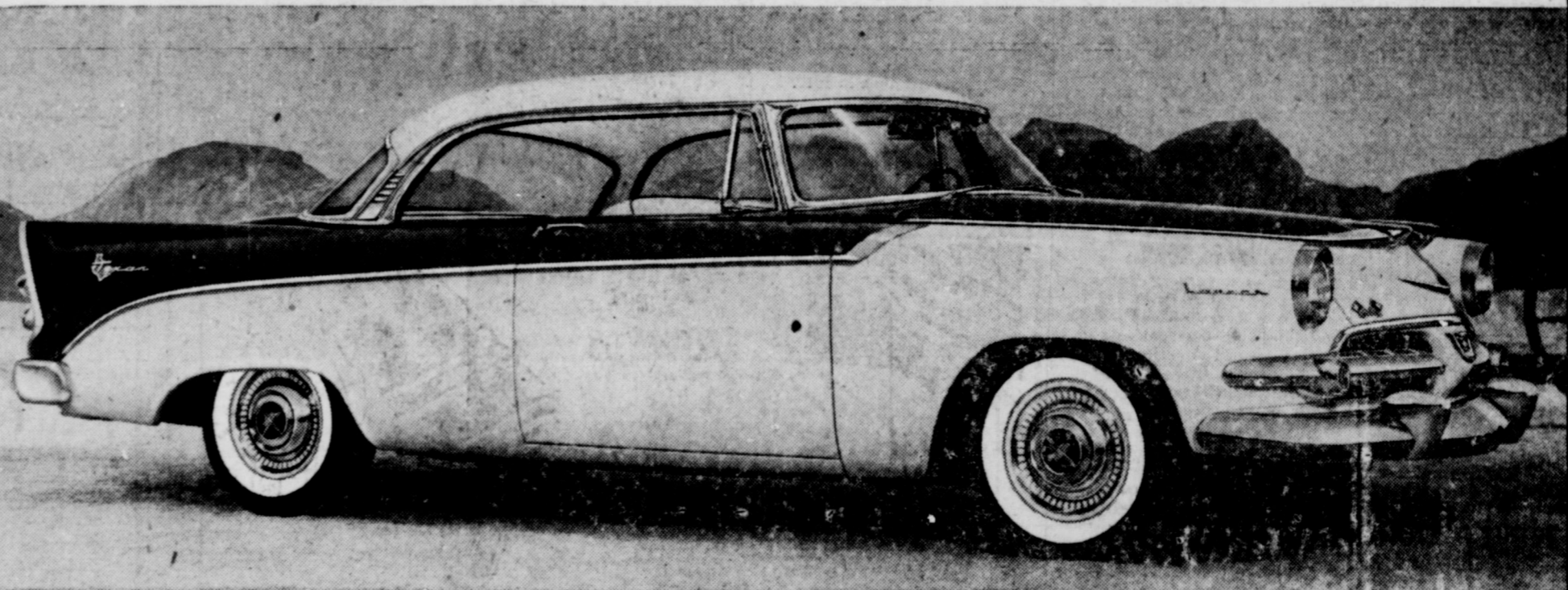

Baked like a custard, and served warm on a crisp, snappy day, these melt-in-the-mouth Coconut Pompadour Puddings are a delightful combination of smooth coconut cream pudding mix and frothy chocolate meringue.

**Coconut Pompadour Pudding**

1 package coconut cream pudding and pie filling mix  
3 cups milk  
2 egg yolks  
2 egg whites, stiffly beaten  
1 square unsweetened chocolate  
6 tablespoons sugar  
2 tablespoons milk  
Combine pudding mix and 1/4 cup of the milk in a saucepan. Add egg yolks and blend well. Then add remaining 2 3/4 cups milk. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a full boil. Remove from heat. Pour into greased custard cups.  
Melt chocolate over hot water. Add sugar and 2 tablespoons milk. Fold into egg whites. Pour onto puddings. Place custard cups in pan of hot water and bake in moderate oven (375°F.) 25 to 30 minutes. Then, serve warm. Makes 4 servings.

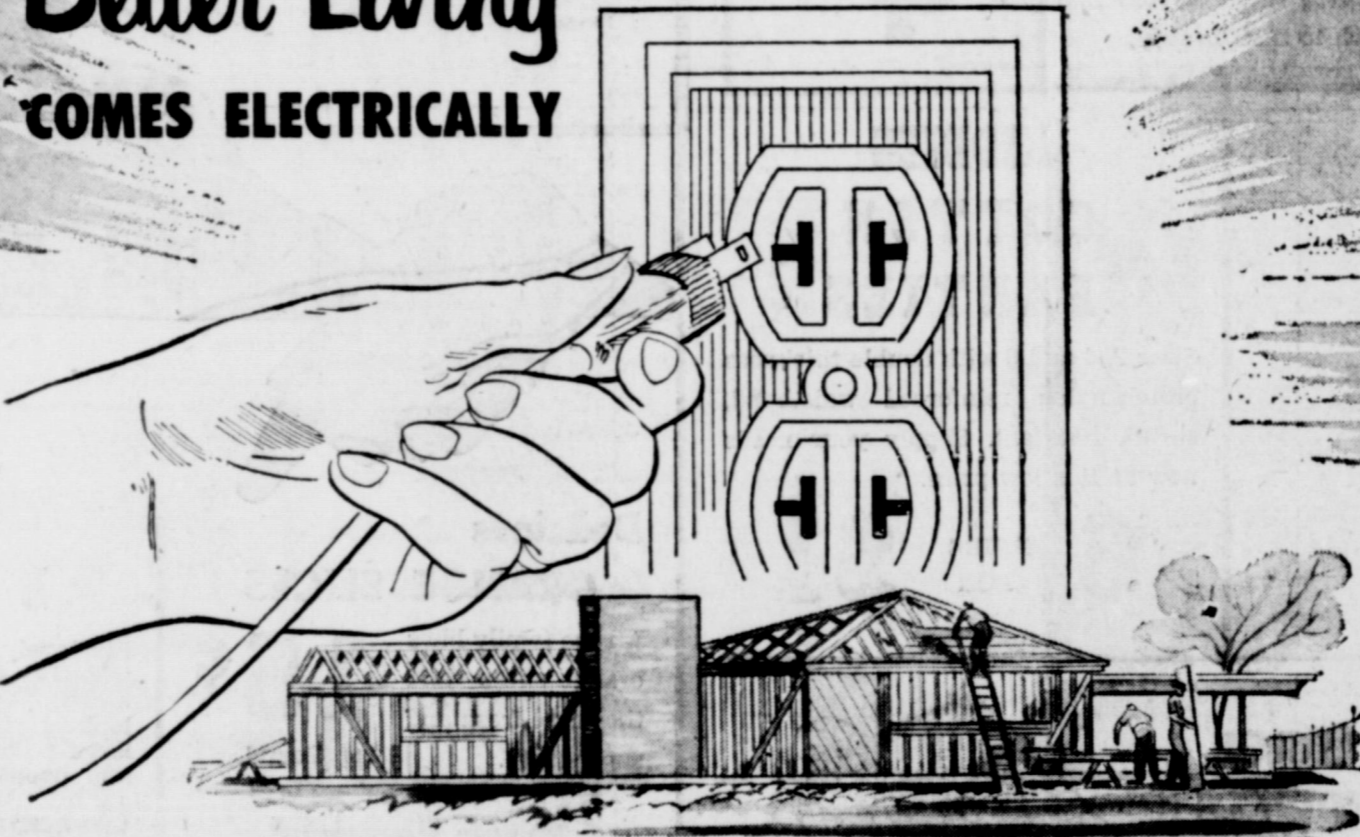
