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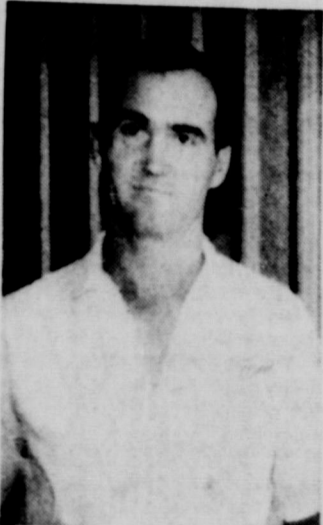

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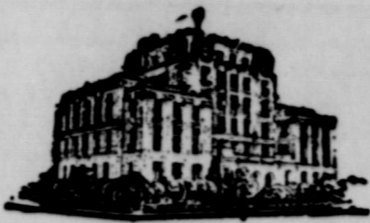

Without hesitation, he turned to Mr. C. L. Blakemore, crusher for men, in charge of operating the crushing operation just east of town on U.S. 80 and said, "Haul what they need, Blakemore." Well, "what they needed" was base material for a drive around the new elementary school out at the end of S. Madera St. The school is now in the process of erecting curbing and gutters for the area, watching the budget with an eagle eye, Supt. Wendell Siebert said. This work should be done in about ten days he said.
On a tight schedule, supply material for the important Int. 20 project, the trucks couldn't be taken off their rounds on a working day — but what about a Saturday. And so last Saturday, beginning about 1 p.m., 11 of the giant rock haulers began taking a new path, turning south off Main St. onto Ostrom St. and straight to the new school ground, where cleared and prepared beds were waiting for the rock.
In the some four hours of the marathon job of building a "school road," the trucks delivered approximately 2,000 ton of crushed rock. That involved two men on a big shovel at the crusher, 11 drivers, as many trucks and a blade man on the site, leveling the rock.
You may have seen school board members, coaches, highway department employees and others helping with the flagging operations — helping control traffic at the intersections at the heavily-loaded trucks made their way toward the school destination. (The little shower about 4 didn't even slow down the operation.)
After the curbing is finished the school will come back, eagle-eyed budget in hand, and hot-top the drive, which circles from Ostrom to Madera, with some paving to be done in the loading area at the east end (where the cafeteria is located) and where school buses will likely unload and take on passengers.
Figured at the highway contract price of \$1.72 a ton delivered, the amount of assistance provided by Mr. Ruby amounts to somewhere in the neighborhood of \$3,000 — any way you figure it.
The quite, slightly graying Mr. Ruby, who only comes to Eastland about once a month, might never know how much Eastland people appreciate his generosity — unless we tell him.
The odds are very good that the post office department could easily deliver a letter or postal to him, if addressed to "Cecil Ruby, Buda, Texas."
