The runoff, however, was expected to continue for several days and t was believed that at least a foot would flow into the lake. Several minor accidents were reported in Ranger Monday due to slippery streets during the rain storm. A minor ac cident was reported on Highway 80 seven miles west of ek Cisco.

The weekend rain was more than the county had received in the past three months. Temperatures that had been 100 degrees or more for several weeks were in the low 90's Monday and Tuesday.




