es, Rising Star had 1.75 inches and Moran got 1.8 inches. Stock tanks of the county benefitted most, according to Assistant County Agent Bill McCutchen. He toured the county Monday afternoon and found livestock water in good supply. Before the rain, many tanks were dry and stockmen were hauling water. Late peanuts also were expected to benefit considerably, Mr. McCutchen said. Only about 15 per cent of the county's peanut allotment acreage has been planted and most of this is in the late variety, he added.

The rain was due to result in widespread planting of late hay crops and preparation of land for fall seeding to cover crops. Area lakes also registered water gains. Lake Cisco reported a 14-inch rise. Lake Leon's gain showed only two inches when Supt. Jess White turned in his weekly report Monday — the level standing 72.2 feet at the dam. The runoff, however, was expected to continue for several days and it was believed that at least a foot would flow into the lake. Several minor accidents were reported in Ranger Monday due to slippery streets during the rain storm. A minor accident was reported on Highway 80 seven miles west of Cisco.

The weekend rain was more than the county had received in the past three months. Temperatures that had been 100 degrees or more for several weeks were in the low 90's Monday and Tuesday.

## Signs At City Limits To Inform Tourists Of Historical Site Here

The Texas State Historical Survey Committee has announced that two "Historical Markers in City" signs will soon be erected in Eastland.

Eastland is one of 125 Texas cities in which these new reflectorized signs will be placed. They are authorized by the State Building Commission, which recently signed the contract for their manufacture.

These markers designed to

inform tourists of historical sites in Eastland, will be placed in the city limit signs on State 6 North and State 6 South by the Texas Highway Department. They measure 24 by 24 inches and are made of steel with white reflective letters reading "Historical Markers in City" on a black background.

Eastland's one historical marker is to be erected on Corner Drug, the town's oldest standing building. Town selection was determined by the Texas State Historical Survey Committee according to Official Texas Historical Markers previously erected there.

## Summer Water Rates Extended For Month

Eastland water users are going to get an extra 30 days of lower water rates, thanks to action by the City Commission, sitting in new chairs, at its regular meeting Monday evening.

The special rate was extended for the month of September as a result of the success of the project during the three months of June, July and August, period for which it was originally approved by the

commission. The extended dry weather during these months and the resulting increase in the amount of water volume apparently prompted the official board to extend the saving.

(Last year when the lower rate was tried for the first time, the city's revenue from the sale of water dropped, but has been high this year, it is reported — due apparently from the increased use of wa-

ter during the dry months, and other steps including the billing to the school, at cost, for water used on the various athletic fields).

During other business Monday, the commission discussed briefly with members of the Eastland Memorial Hospital building committee, the possible sale to the hospital of city property on S. Daugherty St., opposite the hospital, for use as a parking lot.

The property in question, 150 by 234 feet, includes the site of the old city hall, which is presently being cleaned, two residences and the shop facilities and grounds. The city Commissioners agreed to sell the property for \$6,500. Attending the meeting for the hospital group was Jim Parks and Milton Fullen, both of the building committee, and Leon Musgrove, administrator of the hospital. Bernard Hanna is also a member of the hospital committee, was attending a County Hospital board meeting in Ranger Monday evening.

Parks said that the preliminary discussion will be reported to the membership of the hospital's directors when they meet next Tuesday evening. City Manager Lewis Tiner said that such a transaction would probably involve the demolition of one of the houses and the moving off of the other, as well as the metal shop building. This would leave the brick building, which the hospital spokesmen said would probably be used for storage if the transaction is consummated. Russell Hill is president of the hospital board.

The continued high occupancy at the hospital has resulted in the need for additional parking, it is reported, but there was indication that cost of developing such parking (Continued on Page Eight)

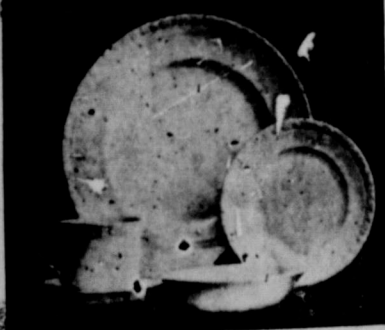

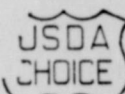

might be prohibitive at this time.  
Mayor Frank Deaton presided at the meeting during

which commissioners sat in brand-new upholstered chairs provided for the meeting room in the city manager's office. Commissioner James Reid, who is on vacation, was the only absentee.  
The city has spent \$86, thus far in the demolition of the old city hall, Tiner said, and this was for the rent of the crane and wrecking ball, rented from the firm that is tearing down West Ward. The

city waited, Tiner said, until that wrecking crew was in town in order to save the cost of transportation for such equipment.  
This year's summer water rate isn't as extensive as last year's but will provide relief for citizens in their efforts to keep yards and plants alive.  
The new rate calls for a billing of 30 cents a thousand gallons for all water delivered over 10,000 gallons. There are no other changes and amounts less than 10,000 will have no reduction. (Last year the special rate was 25 cents a thousand over 10,000, and a graduated scale of other reductions.)

**Now's Good Time To Check Social Security Record**

All persons who have not checked their social security earnings record since July 1961 are reminded that now would be a good time to do so, according to R. R. Tuley, Jr., district manager of social security in Abilene.

He went on that there is an initial accuracy of 98 per cent in crediting the wages and self-employment income each year of over 75,000,000 persons. Many of the remaining 2 per cent have their earnings credited as a result of correspondence, but Tuley feels the individual's being interested enough to check his own record every three years is a big help in reaching the current 99.6 per cent accuracy figures.  
The most common error that delays or prevents proper crediting is the omission of the social security account number on employers tax returns, followed closely by the error of entering the number incorrectly or incompletely on such tax returns. Some self-employed persons fail to re-

ply to letters requesting account numbers omitted from their individual tax returns. Tuley said that his office was at this time investigating some 300 errors in both types of tax returns for 1962 and 1963, ranging from items of small amounts to those of several hundred dollars.

Since all retirement, survivor, and disability benefits are computed from the individual's earnings record, uncredited earnings could lower, or even prevent, payments on claims, he added. A special post card designed for speedy checking of one's social security account will be sent to all inquirers who write or call Social Security Administration in Abilene.
