Specifics Of Olden's Proposed Water Plan Outlined In Report

In the preliminary report or separation of the proposed system provided for in Design "A" from Eastland's system, the report said.

Design "B" consists of basically the same distribution system as Design "A" with an air gap, pumping station and elevated water storage tank added. This system has two advantages over the other system: (1) The air gap or separation of the proposed system from the Eastland's system is provided which will be necessary should Eastland not be agreeable to supervising health requirements for Design "A". (2) The pressures would be raised 20 psi above those in Design "A" or system pressure would be from 40 to 60 psi instead of 20 to 40 psi.

Any public water system should meet the requirements set out by the State Health Department. If financing is obtained through the Farmers Home Administration, the

plans must meet the State Health Department requirements for a public water system and be approved by them before a loan is made. The Texas State Health requirements have been considered in the two preliminary designs, the engineers said.

In making the preliminary design for the water distribution, the criteria required by the Farmers Home Administration has been used and is as follows: (1) Must be approved by the Texas State Health Department. (2) Each customer will receive not less than three gallons per minute per connection simultaneously at a minimum pressure of 20 pounds per square inch for any connection. (3) The system is to furnish a domestic water supply but not fire protection or in other words, some protection is gained but all of the State Board of Fire underwriters requirements, such as the requirement that all lines be 6" and larger in size, were not provided for.

If financing is through the Farmers Home Administration Water System loan program, the Federal Government will make a 40 year loan at 4 1/2 to 5 per cent interest to an association of farmers or a small town not exceeding 2,500 population for the purpose of constructing a domestic water system. A non-profit corporation, in this case the Olden Water Supply Corporation, must be formed and memberships sold (usually \$50 per membership) to each customer. Each member owns stock in the Corporation having one vote, etc. A board of directors is elected yearly to govern the corporation.

The Olden Water Corporation could then borrow the remainder of the cost of constructing the system from the FHA and the loan repayment, operating cost, etc., is paid entirely out of revenue from water sales, the report said.

There are no property taxes, property liens or other expenditures required of the members except agreement to pay water bill. Also the corporation could purchase from individuals now on the existing 3" Asbestos Cement and 2" Galvanized water lines and who wish to be included in the new system. The corporation could also purchase existing water meters that are in usable condition from those who wish on the new system and credit could be given toward their membership.

The minimum water rate will depend on the number of customers obtained. Construction cost for the system is very little different for 75 customers than it is for 120 customers (that is to say the lines must run down most town streets anyway and the construction cost for 10 customers on a block is very little more than 5 would be in that block).

Estimate of cost for Design "A" will be a total loan required of \$59,820.00 and for Design "B" a total of \$98,000.00.

Cancer Society Makes Year End Report On County's Activities

"Every year we seem to be making more progress in our efforts to control cancer" said Sam Kimmell, president of the Eastland County Unit of the American Cancer Society, "but every year we seem to realize more and more that we have a long way to go."

In a year end report of the

activities of the local Cancer Group, Mr. Kimmell pointed out the fact that at the close of 1964 thirty-eight per cent of the people who develop cancer were being saved while in 1935 only twenty per cent were being cured. "If we can enlarge our educational program of Cancer's Seven Danger Signals, we can save fifty per cent with the knowledge and treatment that science has developed so far; therefore, we hope to reach at last half the population of Eastland County with our educational films and materials in the coming year," continued Mr. Kimmell.

"The Dallas County Unit received a special National Cancer Society Award for an outstanding educational program on cancer of the colon and rectum. They reached 63,000 people with their open showing of 'Life Story', our Cancer Society film dealing with the second most deadly type of cancer. If we can get people to recognize the importance of the protoscopic examination, we can save twice as many people."

"And we must expand our attack on smoking. The mounting evidence shows that three-fourths of all lung cancer, the most deadly cancer, could be prevented if people would recognize the facts and stop smoking. We'll be showing our films on smoking more and more," said Mr. Kimmell.

Summarizing the Cancer research program, Mr. Kimmell pointed out that the American Cancer Society, through its voluntary contributions, is spending almost twelve million dollars on research with over \$700,000 being spent in Texas Research Institutions. Two very promising areas of research at this time are in chemotherapy, or drugs, and against leukemia. There are now some twenty four drugs which are effective in cancer treatment, and scientists are expecting a major breakthrough against leukemia in the next five to ten years.

"We hope to reach more and more people with our

Unit Service Program in the coming year, too," said Mr. Kimmell. "This past year we served a large number of people with dressings, beds, wheel chairs, and other equipment, but we are always afraid we are missing someone."

"We want everyone to make a New Year's resolution that they will have a complete physical examination early this year. And we want them to learn Cancer's Seven Danger Signals: unusual

bleeding or discharge, a lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere, a sore that does not heal, change in bowel or bladder habits, hoarseness or cough, indigestion or difficulty in swallowing and a change in a wart or a mole. If any of these symptoms lasts longer than two weeks the individual should consult his physician immediately. "We'll be hammering the message in 1965 and year until cancer is controlled," concluded Mr. Kimmell.

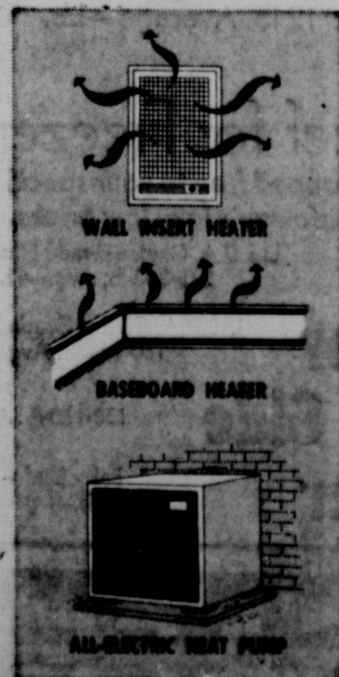

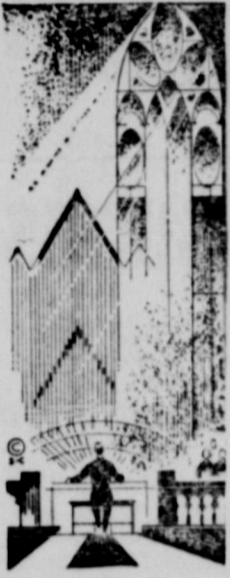
