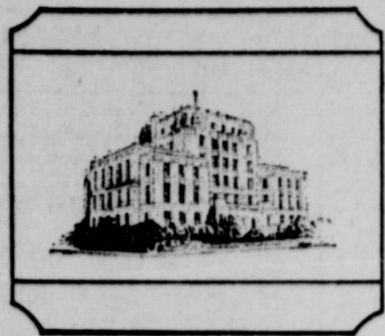

The petition brought by Mr. W. E. Hallenback carried several signatures. The road at the lake has been a matter of concern to many involved there for quite some time.

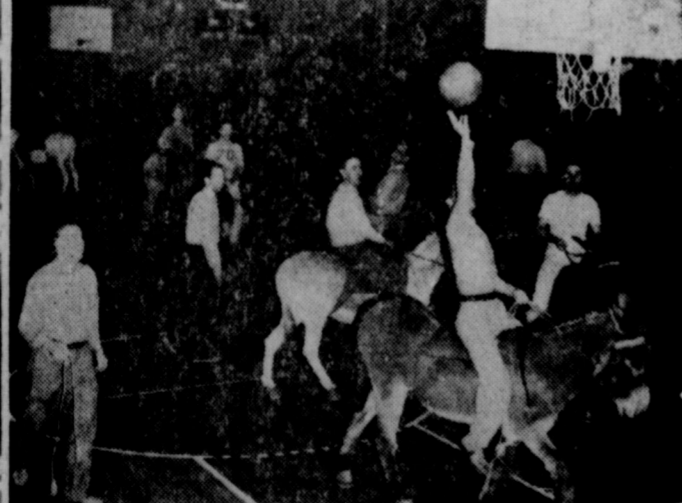

## Anglers Club Tournery Set At Lake Leon

The Fort Worth Anglers Club will hold its big annual spring tournament at Lake Leon on March 27-28, according to an announcement made in the March issue of "The Fisherman," official monthly magazine of that organization.

## 'Tell Your Neighbor' Is Theme for Cancer Crusade to Begin April 1

The American Cancer Society has stepped up plans for the April 1 launching of its annual Crusade to save more lives from cancer through research, education and service.

Mr. Sam Kimmell of Cisco, president of the Eastland County Unit of the American Cancer Society, explained that the 1965 Crusade "will emphasize a 'Tell Your Neighbor' theme." Volunteers, in their door-to-door bellingring, will hand out a leaflet containing

life-saving facts about cancer and information about the Society's effort to help conquer this dread disease.

Mrs. Ann Justice of Eastland was named Chairman of the American Cancer Society's April Crusade in Eastland County.

The announcement was made by Mr. Kimmell who said the Chairman's "long interest in cancer control will add vigor to the Crusade against Cancer."

"We can expect our most successful educational and fund-raising campaign ever," the president said. Last year the Society's goal was \$2719, and the Society raised \$4447.18, which is the largest amount raised in Eastland County.

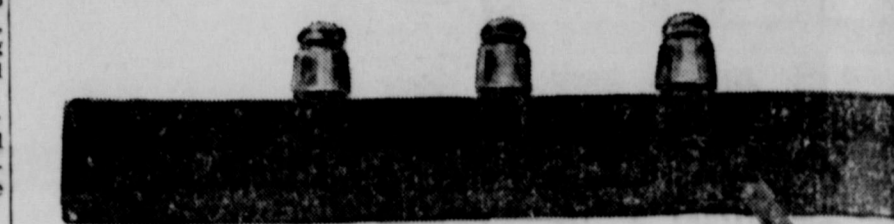

present and the Rev. Davenport, pastor.

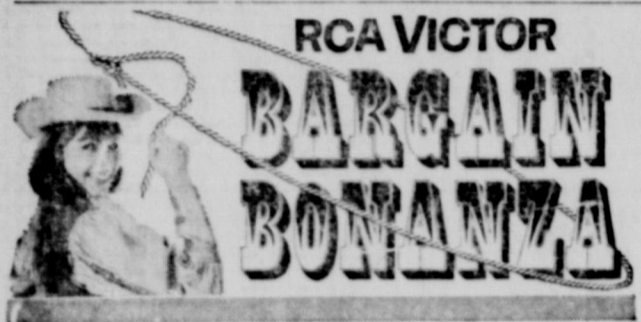
