

For the last two days the sea has been a bit rough, nothing violant but just a little more motion than we have had since leaving California. Late in the evening those on deck were treated to a view of great white clouds in the east illuminated by frequent bright flashes of beautiful lightning. No thunder was heard and the lightning could have been hundreds of miles

The ship's morning paper, The Polynesian, says that somewhere on our way between Rarotonga and Auckland we cross the International Date line, being at a point 180 degrees east and also west of the zero meridian at Greenwich, England. And as we are going in a westerly direction we will lose one day. However, as we again cross the date line between Australia and the United States we will regain the lost day so we will arrive in our homeland without loss or gain of time.

We are due to arrive at Auckland on Monday morning, April 6 and the ship will be there until late evening on Tuesday when it will leave for Sydney, Australia. We have been told that while in port we can place local and long distance telephone calls from our stateroom. There are telephone directories available for all of the cities where the ship calls. There is no charge for local calls from the ship. This ship is really being run for the pleasure and convenience of its passengers.


