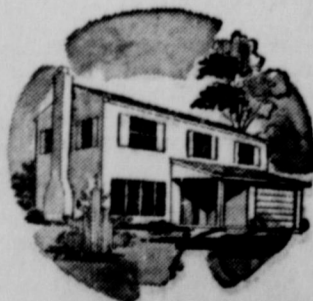

New Mail Schedules May Help Rush - Hour Congestion

One of the busiest places in Eastland has been the U. S. Post Office at 3 o'clock each morning when to-work, and to-school traffic has converged on the West Main St. location.

New postal schedules perhaps will help alleviate part of the congestion during the busy rush-hour period.

Postal patrons will generally be benefitted in the longrun by the revised schedules because mail will be consistently "in the boxes" day after day" even though it may be some 30 minutes later than it has in the past.

The post office will be receiving mail about an hour later than in the past because of the new scheduled Postmaster Mrs. Marene Johnson

has announced. "The change is a step in the direction of better and more dependable service for Eastlanders," she said.

Contract delivery is being stepped up to compensate for already reduced train service and further anticipated reductions.

And too, the post office department will be saving money with the new truck schedules, she said. By next July, some \$500,000 will have been saved in this region she pointed out. (The postal department has been paying 78 cents a mile for railway delivery, Mrs. Johnson said.)

"Any mail deposited in the street collection boxes around the square after 4 p. m. or in the courtesy box at the curb west of the post office after 6:15 p. m., or in the letter drop in the post office after 6:15 p. m. (Monday through Saturday) or 4:40 p. m. (Sundays and holidays) will be post marked the following morning. "In order to insure delivery

the next day on city and rural routes, city drops for local delivery should be deposited in the post office not later than 6 p. m. the afternoon before. Any large mailing consisting of several hundred pieces for local delivery the next day should be deposited in the post office before 5 p. m. the afternoon before," Mrs. Johnson said.

All collection boxes around the square will be collected at 4 p. m. Mrs. Johnson advises people to please read the schedule on boxes where mail is accepted.

If mail is deposited before 4:50 p. m. it will be on the Stephenville and Albany Star Route dispatch for statewide delivery the following day; but if mailed after 4:50 p. m. and before 6:15 p. m. (except on Sundays or holidays), it will be picked up by a second truck, she said.

Mail will come into the post office on the following schedule:

At 5:30 a. m. on the Stephenville and Albany Star Route Dispatch, (Sundays and holidays at 6:30 a. m.);

At 6:30 a. m. on the second Stephenville-Albany truck;

Due at 6:39 a. m. on the east bound train;

Due at 12:31 p. m. on the eastbound train (except Sundays); and

Due at 1:16 p. m. on the westbound train.
