'Revised' Water Rates **Okayed Summer Months**

The City Commission has adopted another summer water rate for local citizens during June, July and August. It isn't as extensive as the one tried last year, but it is an incentive to residents to keep lawns and shrubs green and growing.

The new rate calls for a billing of 30 cents a thousand gallons for all water delivered over 10,000 gallons for June. July and August. There are no other changes, and a-mounts less than 10,000 will have no reduction. Last year the rate was 25 cents a thousand over 10,000, but the Commissioners agreed that five cents more a thousand would not penalize the city's revenue as it did last year, and at the same time, the new rate which is ten cents below the regular cost would be appreciated by Eastland resi-
