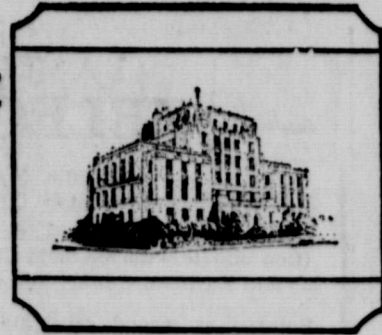
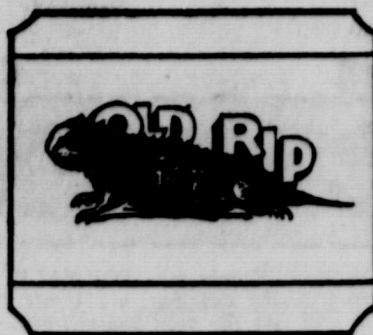

## Decorated Vietnam Veteran Will Be Rotary Speaker Monday

Daniel C. Prescott, a Distinguished Flying Cross and Bronze Star recipient for service in Vietnam, will be the principal speaker at the regular meeting of the Eastland Rotary Club on Monday.

Arrangements for the special, timely program were made by Program Chairman for the Day Henry Pullman. The club meets at the White Elephant Restaurant.

A graduate of the U. S. Military Academy at West Point in 1945, Col. Prescott joined the 11th Airborne Division that same year as a second lieutenant.

Following flight training at Waco, which he completed in 1949, he was an Army aviator in Korea when the Chinese entered the war in 1950 and 1951. For his service in Korea, he was awarded the Silver Star, two Distinguished Flying Crosses and 17 Air Medals.

He was commander of the 52nd Aviation Battalion in Viet Nam in 1964 and has recorded 900 combat flying hours. The helicopter is a key tool in the Viet Nam guerrilla war and Col. Prescott is well-versed on the Army's operations there, it is reported.

The colonel calls Hampton, Virginia, home, and his wife and three children were to join him in Mineral Wells from there after the close of school.

Pullman, a 25-year Rotarian, is known in Eastland for his important educational programs. Charles Freyschlag is president of the club.

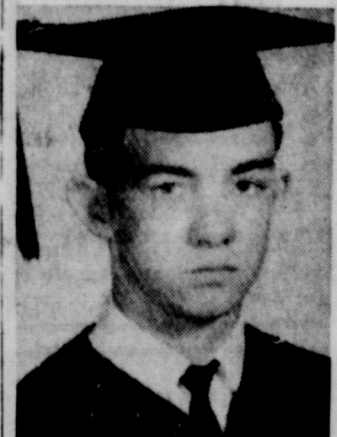

## Kelly Coats Is TV Technician For Eastland

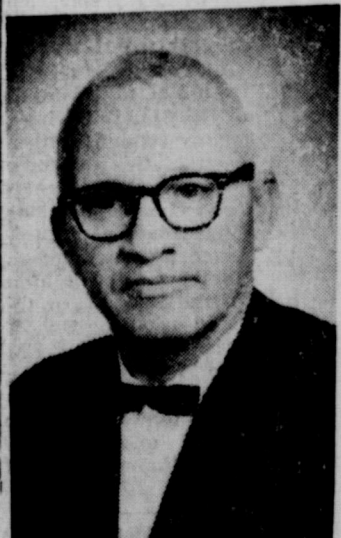

## Okayed Highway Work Includes Kokomo Road

The Texas Highway Commission this week has approved work on 50 miles of Farm-to-Market Roads in District 23, including the Kokomo road in Eastland County. From Loop 389 in Carbon, east to FM 2689 near Kokomo, 7.8 miles of base and surface on FM 2526, estimated to cost \$86,000, according to District Engineer E. M. Pritchard.

This work is included in the 1965 Texas Farm-to-Market Road Program. Approximately \$470,000 was allotted to the Brownwood district out of a statewide total of some \$23,000,000 that is made available annually under existing statutes for new farm-to-market road construction, Pritchard stated.

Some of the roads in this program have been previously designated under past farm-to-market road programs where only the grading and drainage structures were provided for and the base material and asphalt surfacing is being financed under this program. In these cases these roads may be placed under contract this year providing right of way will be acquired. Projects other than Eastland County in this category are as follows:

In Coleman County additional funds for grading and structures and base and surfacing in the amount of \$95,000 have been provided on FM 503 from US 67 at Valera, north to FM 53.

In Brown County at an estimated cost of \$55,000, six miles of base and surfacing on FM road 2940 from State Highway 279 in Cross Cut east to FM 583.

In Lampasas County at an estimated cost of \$52,000 6.6 miles of base and surfacing on FM 2942 from US 183 in Lometa east and north.

# County Labor Survey Would Ask Questions; Evaluate Work Force

ered by the Eastland Cham- ber of Commerce, executives of which are negotiating with counterparts in Cisco and Ran- ger, in an effort to conduct a joint, area-wide survey, with all parties sharing in the costs, and benefiting from the compiled information. A direct-mail approach is being considered, with questionnaires, explanatory letters and return envelopes included, to be sent to every household in the county.

The returned questionnaires would be carefully checked and the information tabulated for use by officials in each town in talking with industrial prospects. Then when Mr. Industrial Prospect asked "How many men between the ages of 18 and 25, who have high school educations, and who are available to go to work?" or some such question, a concrete answer could be given.

Such a survey was conducted recently in Midland, with 21,000 forms mailed out, and 2,539 returned, showing that 998 of these were employed and 1,541 were not.

Officials, who will want to make sure that everyone completely understands the purpose of the survey, will probably include paragraphs in the accompanying letter to this effect:

"Your assistance and cooperation in completing the enclosed form is urgently needed — THIS IS NOT A JOB APPLICATION — but a confidential survey questionnaire for information only.

"Your help in completing and returning the enclosed survey — AT ONCE — is very important in helping to determine the information which is necessary to interest future industrial prospects in locating their plant in Eastland County."

As soon as arrangements have been worked out between the various participating towns, forms printed, the questionnaires should be going into the mail.

**FORMS MIGHT ASK**  
Included in the forms will be such questions as: Name; Age; phone number; address; male; female; how far do you live from the county seat; how long have you lived in this area; married; single; engaged; widow(er); divorced; separated;

how tall are you; weight; right-handed; left-handed; how many children do you have at home; their ages; how many people are depending on you for their living; partially; totally; is your wife (or husband) working now; where; what kind of work; how long; approximate salary;

schooling completed; any special training; have you ever worked in a factory or plant; what kind; what was your job and what kind of machines did you operate; would you rather work full time or part time; could you work night shifts from 4 p.m. to 12:30 a.m.;

do you own your home; rent; other; do you wear glasses; do you have physical handicap; what is the nature of your handicap; are you presently employed; list different types of work you have done.

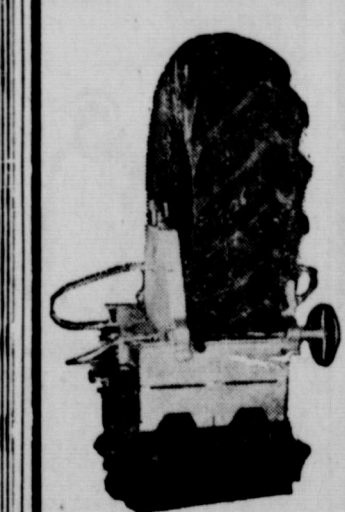
From this, as can be seen, accurate records can be compiled of the county's work force.

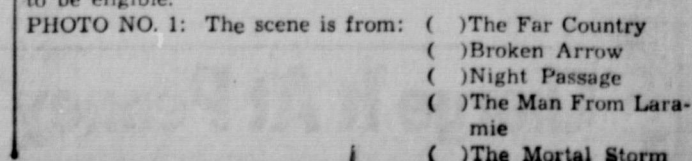
