Brother Charged in Murder After Thursday Shooting

Robert Lee Hall, 25-year-old resident, was charged with murder in Justice of the Peace Wells Dalton's court after an investigation of a shooting death Thursday afternoon of his brother, Robert Lee Hall, 22.

Justice Dalton denied bond for Robert Lee Hall and ordered him returned to the jail where he had been shortly after the shooting.

Robert Lee Hall died from a .38 Smith & Wesson revolver wound sustained at 3 p. m. Thursday at the home of his brother, Robert Lee Hall, 22, at the intersection of East Street and East 10th Street, Eastland. Both brothers were employees of the firm, which is owned by J. D. George.

He is survived by his wife; his father, address unknown; his mother, Mrs. Rowena Hall of Eastland; one brother Robert; three sisters, Mrs. Sharon Seabourn of Roswell, New Mex., and Mary Beth Hall and Shirley Hall of Eastland; and his grandmother, Mrs. A. O. Cook of Eastland.

Eastland and Ranger Frontage Chances Considered Excellent

Eastland and Ranger delegations (two of 19 that made requests) got strong indications that the State Highway Commission will approve their pleas for frontage roads along Interstate 20 as it passes around the two Eastland County towns in Austin last Thursday.

Nine business, civic and professional leaders from Ranger appeared before the Commission at 10:30 a. m. and 19 from Eastland made their appearance before Chairman Herbert C. Petry Jr., Commissioners Hal Woodward and J. H. Kultgen, and State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer at shortly after 3 p. m.

Ranger asked for frontage roads on both sides of the expressway from where it departs from the present U.S. 80 route to where it rejoins U.S. 80 west of Ranger. Cost of the frontage roads is estimated at \$131,830. Ranger also asked for two additional interchanges instead of grade separations at Airport Road and a Bludell St. These would cost \$31,800 and \$30,000.

The Eastland group asked for an interchange at a county road which is an extension of Bassett St. which would cost \$35,000 and access roads on both sides of Interstate 20, estimated to cost \$167,780.

The Eastland group had the questionable task of following a 50-man delegation from Dallas that put on an aggressive, and at times, demanding demonstration for the Commission, asking that work be started immediately on what the Dallas group called their "No. One priority item."

After listening to the hour-long, highly-programmed presentations from Dallas County, city and suburban representatives, complete with charts and graphs, the Commission

appeared ready for a brief "to-the-point" appeal from the next group, and under the able spokesmanship of Attorney Virgil T. Seaberry that's what they got from Eastland. No speeches, no introductions and no time-consuming harrangs — just a simple outright request.

Mayor Morris Newham spoke for Ranger and pointed out that the additional interchanges and frontage roads are important to Ranger's economy. He said the interchanges would give safe access to Ranger Junior College and to the "best airport between Fort Worth and Abilene."

State Engineer Greer said that right-of-way is already being bought in the Ranger area and, in one case, a property owner has been paid \$12,000 for the loss of access because no frontage roads are planned. Greer said that if the commission should agree to frontage roads, that money would have to be refunded to the federal and state government.

Greer also said that there was not enough room — from an engineering standpoint — for the three planned interchanges plus the two proposed by the delegation.

Mayor Newham declined to choose which of the five interchanges should be dropped. The commission finally decided that after it reaches a decision, its local engineer will meet with city officials to work out the interchange question.

Chairman Petry said the philosophy of the federal government, which pays 90 percent of the cost of the expressway, is to leave out frontage roads where an interstate highway skirts a city. Thus, he said, there will not be business development along

the expressway to compete with downtown business. "But," he continued, "the commission feels that frontage roads are good for a city and in some cases the state has paid the full cost in situations similar to those in Ranger and Eastland."

He stressed at the Ranger hearing that the \$12,000 would have to be refunded "even if you have to put on a barbecue to raise the money."

The Ranger hearing closed with agreement that right-of-way buying would be held up temporarily until the highway commission and the City of Ranger decides what to do about interchanges and frontage roads.

Plans for IN 20 are to go south and east around the city of Eastland with an interchange on State N. W. 6, south of town. Seaberry explained that the Eastlanders had only recently learned that plans do not call for frontage roads.

He described the expressway area as "that in which Eastland will develop." He said the principal concern of his delegation is the frontage roads. — On questions from Greer as to plans for improving the county road, he said that there are local hopes that the Bassett St. county road will be improved very soon.

Greer said the state has not yet bought right-of-way as it has in the case of Ranger but he felt sure that frontage roads would have to be paid for from state funds.

Petry then lectured the Eastland County delegation about the failure to ask for frontage roads at the original hearing (held early in 1964), saying that it is now too late to get federal money for the frontage roads. Greer said he thought it would be a mistake to try to carry the frontage roads across the Leon River. He suggested that traffic move into the main expressway for the river crossing.

The hearing closed with Greer saying that if the commission did not grant all that the delegation asked, they could come back later for the interchange if development justified it.
