Turkey Hatchery on N. Seaman St. One of Eastland's Newest Industries

An interesting and fascinating business is the turkey hatchery business.

Here in Eastland there is a hatchery business located at the back of Buck Wheat's real estate building on Patterson and Seaman Streets.

The hatchery is owned by Mr. McKillip of Desdemona. He has been in the business for 12 years and grows approximately 70 thousand birds commercially a year.

The turkey industry here in Eastland has reached points in Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, Arizona, New Mexico, California, and points in Texas. Approximately 253,000 turkeys were shipped out of Eastland the past year.

Mr. McKillip, along with three other producers, raises 6,000 breeder hens per year, for the turkey industry here. The total capacity of the Eastland plant is 148,000 turkeys. Each week 36,000 eggs are used here.

The local manager of the hatchery is Jimmy Cowan. Mr. Cowan has been with the incubator sales and service for 30 years, serving cities over the southwest in hatchery business. Mr. Cowan stays at the local plant and keeps up to date facilities on all machines of the business.

He has just installed a new means for better hatching which is run by both manual and automatic means. The

device will turn the eggs for the necessary hatch automatically.

Mr. Cowan keeps four regular employees, and two days a week, has 11 employees working for him.

One of the chief helpers of Mr. Cowan is Bill Roney who sees after all the machines and makes the final check to see that each machine is working to its best ability for a good hatch.

All in all Mr. Cowan and his efficient staff of workers here in Eastland help other hatcheries by the Texas Poultry Improvement Plan. On this plan the hatchery in Eastland hatch turkeys for other hatcheries and in return other hatcheries hatch chicks for Eastland.

The turkey industry is very much needed, as it supplies many families around the world with a hearty Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner.

Next time you eat a juicy slice of turkey, you might say "thank you" to Mr. Co-

wan and the staff of workers at the Eastland Turkey Hatchery.

Who knows? You may be eating a turkey that first saw the break of dawn at the McKillip Hatchery in Eastland.

SS Law To Send More Cash To County

Most noticeable effect of the new Social Security Act, signed into law July 30 by President Kennedy, will be the receipt of \$136,986 in extra benefits, due about the end of September, according to R. H. Tulley, Jr., Director of Social Security Administration. The checks for October 3 will be in amounts, totalling \$289,592 for Eastland County.

The sum represents the net increase in benefits for the months of January, February, and March, and will be paid to 4,356 residents of Eastland County who are now receiving monthly social security checks by reason of disability, or the death of a spouse.

Tulley believes the next check will be the securing of applications on behalf of unmarried students between 18 and 22 years of age to be paid monthly be-

nefits on the records of a deceased, disabled, or aged parent, who was insured under social security. The new law provides that these benefits will also be retroactive to January of 1965, but a formal claim will be needed as will evidence of regular school attendance. The school may be high school or college; if college, it must be either state supported, accredited by a state or national body, or its credits must be acceptable by transfer to such an institution. Those students who previously received social security benefits to age 18, will not need to prove their age again.

The Health Insurance Benefits (Hospitalization and Medical) will go into effect in July of 1966, and will affect some 3668 residents of this county who are past age 65. They, too, need take no immediate action; in fact Tulley hopes they'll wait a few weeks so that the claims of students may be taken.

Wade received bruises about the body and Dennis received a crushed jaw and multiple lacerations about the face and head.

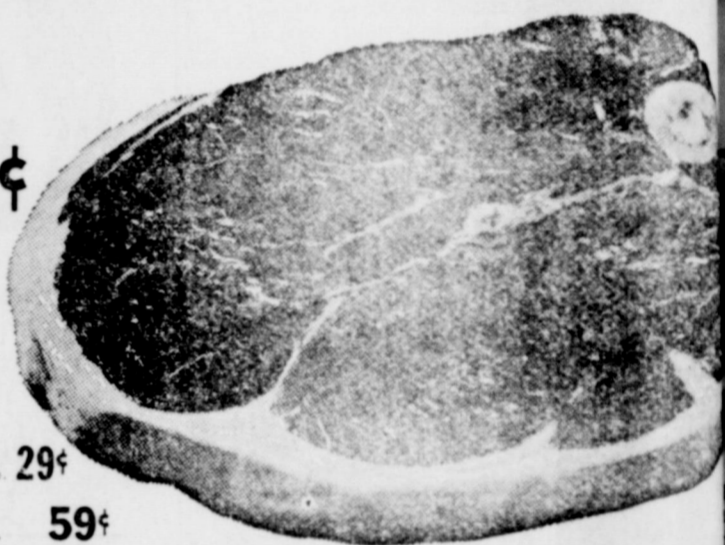
