Commercial purchases of food in 1966 will again be supplemented by such food distribution activities as the National School Lunch, Special Milk, Direct Distribution and Food Stamp programs.

Export markets have become increasingly important outlets for farm products in past 15 years.

Exports during the 1965-66 fiscal year are expected to exceed the record shipments of the two previous years. In 63-64, exports amounted to \$5.9 billion and in 64-65 they amounted to \$6.3 billion. The value of exports may be up only moderately, but volume may total 4 to 5 per cent above 64-65.

Larger exports are expected

for such Texas crops as feed grains and wheat and smaller exports are expected for cotton.

Expanding economic activity and rising incomes in industrialized countries, especially Japan, Canada and Western Europe, have increased their demand for livestock products and stimulated U. S. Commercial exports of feed grains, soybeans and protein meals. Large amounts of food will be shipped abroad in 1966 under the Food for Peace Programs.

A continued uptrend in production expenses in '66 is again expected to offset much of the indicated gain in gross farm income.

Prices paid by farmers for commodities, interest, taxes and wage rates are expected to rise a little in 1966. However, the rise will not be as great as that indicated for 1965 over 1964.

Farmers are earning better incomes than at any other time in more than a decade. Greatly improved net farm income and declining farm numbers have contributed to a record level of net income per farm.

Net income per farm in the United States is estimated at above \$4,000 for 1965. This is 10 per cent higher than in '64 and 40 per cent higher 1960.

who had movie interests in various West Texas cities. At the University of Texas he was active in student politics, serving as a student assemblyman and as foreman of his student political party. He was chairman of the Campus Chest fund raising drive. He is a member of Silver Spurs, men's honor organization. tion to fill such vacancy shall be sufficient. An earlier article, No. 401, sets out that the governor shall order election by proclamation "of all elections for state and district officers, electors for president, and vice president of the United States, members of congress, members of the legislature, and all offices who are elective every two (2) years. Such notices shall be by proclamation by the governor ordering the election not less than thirty-five (35) days before the election, issued and mailed to the several counties."

In as much as the article spells out the reference to "session" of congress, it appears that this would not be applicable in this case. However, it is assumed if a special session were to be called, such an election could be called — with the added provision that the "35-day" notice stipulated altered to "20" days.

Rep. Gibbens, 29, was in the 1961, 1963, and 1965 legislatures and was a key member of the youthful house team that secured passage of much of Gov. Connally's legislative program.

He was a member of several very important legislative committees and chairman of some. Connally asked the legislature to set up the liaison post late in the session, saying that state officials too often are uninformed of legislation affecting Texas.

The post went vacant for months as Connally conducted the talent hunt. Many in this district and county have extended messages of congratulations to Rep. Gibbens for having been selected for the important position. His appointment has been labeled a fitting compliment for a capable and talented young man.

Gibbens, a graduate of Texas Tech, was elected to the legislature a year after his graduation. He attended the University of Texas law school between legislative sessions.

In Washington, Gibbens will be responsible for coordinating state-federal programs, informing state officials of federal programs that may be carried out in Texas and providing information to both the legislature and the federal government.

Feb. 7 is deadline for filing as candidates for the representative and other posts for the May 7 Democratic primary.

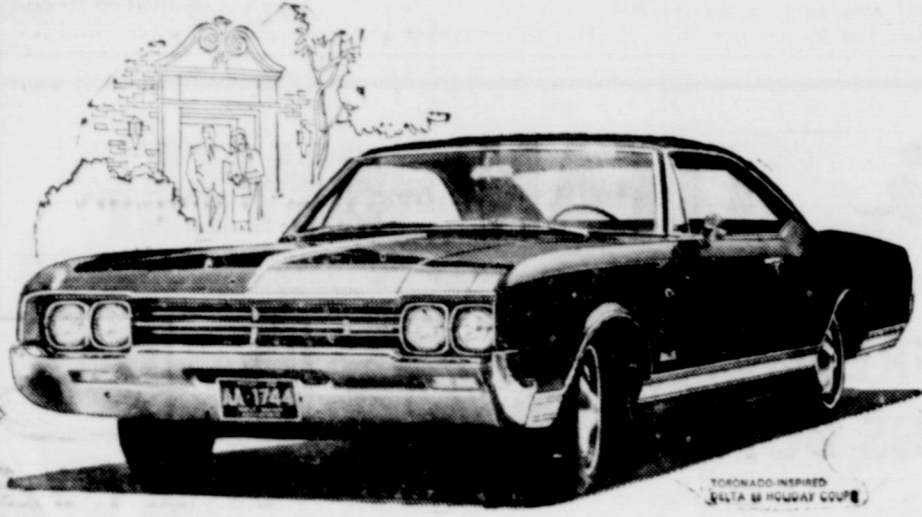

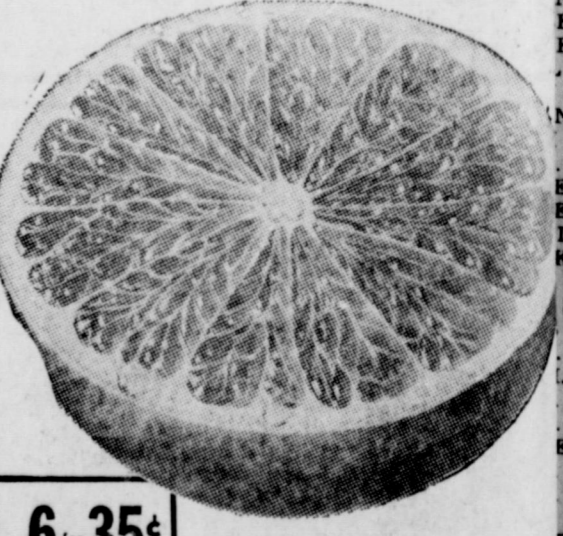
