If brown spots or holes appear in your dress when you iron it, it may be because a small battery was formed at the spot where the damp dress touched two different metals as you ironed it. Two metals in a zipper — usually aluminum in the teeth and copper or nickel-plated copper in the slide — can act as electrodes. The salt in liquid starch serves as carrier of electric current in the wet garment. Or it may be caused by the minerals in the water you use for dampening. The resulting combination forms a small amount of acid. Nothing happens until you apply a hot iron. Then you get the brown spots and holes. Zippers made of one metal, or nylon zippers, will eliminate this problem. So do wash-and-wear fabrics which don't require dampening. Many people fail to realize the importance of getting a daily requirement of vitamin

### UPGRADING IS PLANNED FOR LONGHORN CAVERN

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission announced plans for a concession-financed renovation and construction program for converting famed Longhorn Cavern near Burnet from "just a scenic hole in the ground" to a facility worthy of its rating as the nation's third largest underground attraction. The Commission awarded a projected 20-year contract to a group of Austin and Burnet, Texas, businessmen. The group would be committed, without cost or liability to the state, to immediately erect an

all-purpose \$75,000 headquarters building, including a modern restaurant. The original installations plus recurring property additions and refinements would revert to state ownership after twenty years and anytime during the interim should the operators default in any manner. The proposal was signed by two Burnet men, James L. Luther and W. Glen Anthony and two Austin men, Ed J. St. John and Vic Mathias. The agreement stipulates that appropriate advertising, publicity and promotion of the area will be provided.

The elaborate project would mark the first substantial work on the giant subterranean area since the original improvements more than 30 years ago. Plans call for a modern new surface installation and general overhaul of sub-surface fixtures to embellish the natural wonders. The Commission said construction work is expected to be timed so that the cavern site, ten miles from Burnet just off Highway 281, will be ready for the 1966 tourist season. The Commission noted that the historic area is on Park Road 4 leading to Inks Lake State Park, six miles away on a scenic drive connecting with Buchanan Dam and other Highland Lake showplaces. Peak cavern attendance was 64,155 reached two years ago. Last year's total was 53,615.

Room, Jacob's Wall and Frozen Waterfall. The cavern, rated only behind Carlsbad Cavern in New Mexico and Mammoth Cave in Kentucky, was formed an estimated 500 million years ago by a mighty earth movement that permanently sealed the hard granite formation. It has a constant year around temperature of 64 degrees. General stability has enhanced the natural ruggedness and particularly the delicate effects from stalactites, stalagmites, calcite crystals and massive flowstone deposits. Potholes, solution domes, channels and pits constitute the more common erosional features. Remains of prehistoric creatures have been found far underground but comparatively few types of plants and animals have been observed, beyond bats, cave crickets and algae. Flint and primitive tool definitely linked the stone-age man with this area.

In Austin to observe the special session himself, he said that he had asked a group headed by Jim Browning, also of Breckenridge, to "observe" the session which is drafting voter registration requirements. Musgrove said he is for a "strict registration plan." During the question and answer session, Virgil Moore, editor of the Breckenridge American and former Eastland Telegram editor, asked him if he planned to contest the eligibility of Morris Newnam, Ranger candidate. "No, I don't plan to," Musgrove said, "I understand he would like to have it challenged now, but I'm just running my own campaign."

Asked by the Telegram editor what provisions were being made in the proposed plan for the registration of the over-60 persons so that an accurate estimate of qualified voters might be available in the future, Musgrove indicated that there appeared to be no changes planned from the present system which does not require exemption certificates for the over-aged in counties of less than 100,000 population.

(Calling back after having checked drafts of the proposed legislation, Musgrove said that there are no changes being made in these provisions, and that the final bills are expected to be "swept" through both houses by Friday, and "no later than Monday.")

Other candidates in the representative races are Saul Pullman of Eastland, Pat McGough of Cisco, Morris Newnam of Ranger and John Muslemann of Albany. Editor Gene Baker of Gorman told Musgrove he wanted to talk to him about the right-to-work law and employment legislation. As mayor of Ranger, Newnam's eligibility as a candidate has been questioned in some quarters, because the Ranger City Charter provides that each Commissioner be paid \$10 per meeting. The Ranger commissioners have not accepted payment since 1957, it is reported.

### Heavy General Election Ballot Due This Year

Texans will have a heavier general election ballot next November than usual with the appearance of 16 proposed Constitutional Amendments on the voting agenda. In a public drawing in Austin, Secretary of State Crawford C. Martin drew numbers from a hat to determine the sequence in which the amendments will appear on the November 8 ballot. At the top of the ballot, getting the Number One designation, is the amendments "To provide that all land owned by natural persons designated for agricultural use shall be

### Nursing Career Offers Rewards To Young People

Does a young person in your family want to become a nurse? Mostly aspiring nurses are young women, but sometimes young men also enter the profession.

Today's Health, the magazine of the American Medical Association, advises counselors, parents and prospective nursing school students of four approaches to entering the nursing profession—

- A four-year college or university program leading to a baccalaureate degree.
- A three-year diploma or hospital program leading to a diploma.
- A two-year community or junior college program leading to an associate in arts degree.
- A 12-to-18-month program for practical nursing.

The baccalaureate and diploma school graduates are eligible to take examinations for licensure as an R.N. (registered nurse). The two-year junior college graduate is eligible to take examinations to become an R.N. in many states. The practical nurse graduate is eligible to take examinations for licensure as a licensed practical nurse (L.P.N.). Since licensure laws vary from state to state, the State Board of Nurse Examiners should be contacted in each state for full information on the requirements for taking an examination.

In all cases, the schools must offer a program in which both theory and planned clinical practice with patients in hospital settings, public health agencies, and other institutions are provided for the students. These schools must meet the requirements of the State Board of Nurse Examiners.

The requirements include standards for theory, practice, faculty, preparation and other criteria related to the nursing profession. It is important that the school be approved by the National League for Nursing, the official accrediting agency for schools of nursing.

Providing encouragement to local people and giving help and leadership for the developing and growing of the conservation program, also, developing soil and water resources have been principal objectives of the District.

Great changes in soil and water resources have been made due to the leadership provided by the District.

Management practices such as proper range use, deferred grazing, pasture management and crop residue use, carried as non-cost share contract items have done much to insure the success of conservation programs.

More than 60 flood prevention structures are already planned for construction in this District. Approximately one-half of these are completed and 20 to 25 permanent or sediment pools have been stocked with fish.

During 1965, the organization worked with local sources and agencies concerned in developing an application for a Resource Conservation and Development Project. On this application, the District has pointed up the soil, water and plant problems, recreation and wildlife problems, upstream watershed possibilities and have listed project measures, activities and facilities believed to be needed in all parts of the Districts and counties concerned.

Future plans of the District include providing educational school systems; also, through work shops for teachers held by the Texas Education Agency, the State Soil Conservation Board, the local District and assisting agencies by furnishing books, lesson outlines and other teaching aids.

Expenses of four 4-H boys from Erath County to the state Round-up at College Station and one boy attending a special range school in Junction was paid this past year by the District.

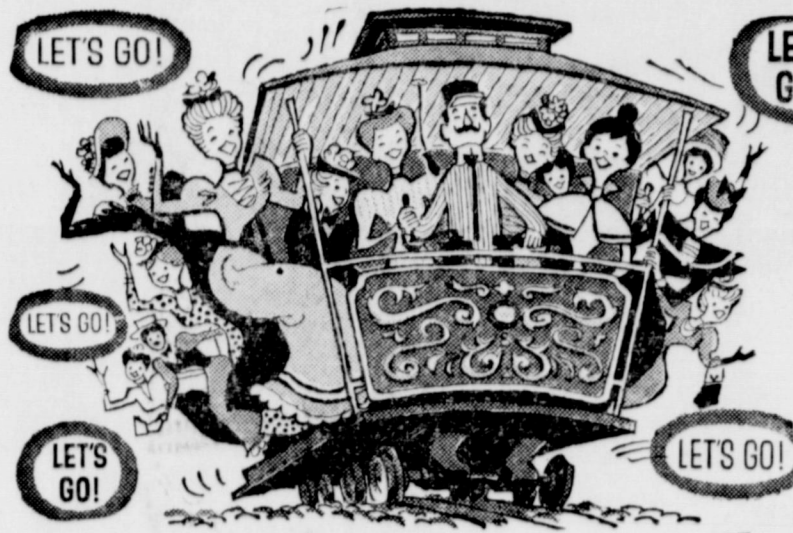

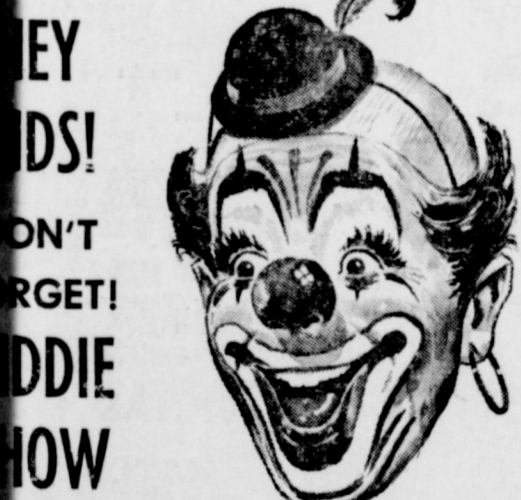

# APRIL 1 IS DEADLINE FOR BLACK BASS STOCK REQUEST

AUSTIN — Persons interested in obtaining black bass for stocking private waters are reminded by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that April 1 is the deadline for receiving applications for these fish with delivery to authorized places in the spring.

The deadline for catfish and other fish is August 1, with delivery in the fall.

Applications received after those dates are filed for consideration the next year.

The Department advised prospective recipients:

"Bass will not be delivered to ponds previously stocked unless the waters have dried up or have been chemically renovated and the out-of-balance fish population removed. Channel catfish may be requested, if needed, every three years because this species does not normally reproduce in small lakes. Recommendations for stocking by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department biologists will be honored."

Here is additional advisory data:

"A properly stocked farm tank, fish pond or small lake will provide fishing over a number of years. There is no need to restock with fish every year. Such a practice is not only wasteful of hatchery reared fish but results in an overcrowded condition and stunted, small fish. Overstocked waters produce poor quality fish just as overstocked land produces poor quality cattle.

"Small lakes and ponds should be stocked with a balanced ratio of forage fish and predators. The predators reared in State hatcheries are largemouth bass and channel catfish. The best forage fish produced in our hatcheries is the redear sunfish. This species also provides a good panfish in many parts of the State.

"In newly built or newly renovated waters, largemouth black bass, stocked at the rate of 200 fry or 100 fingerlings per surface acre, do extremely well and should produce a fishable population within a year.

"Crappie, or white perch, will not be stocked in ponds of less than ten (10) surface acres in size. This policy is part of an attempt to provide the best fishing possible to small pond and lake owners. Due to the inherent reproductive capacity of crappie, this species will quickly overpopulate and become stunted in small bodies of water. Such a condition normally results in poor fishing for all species of fish."

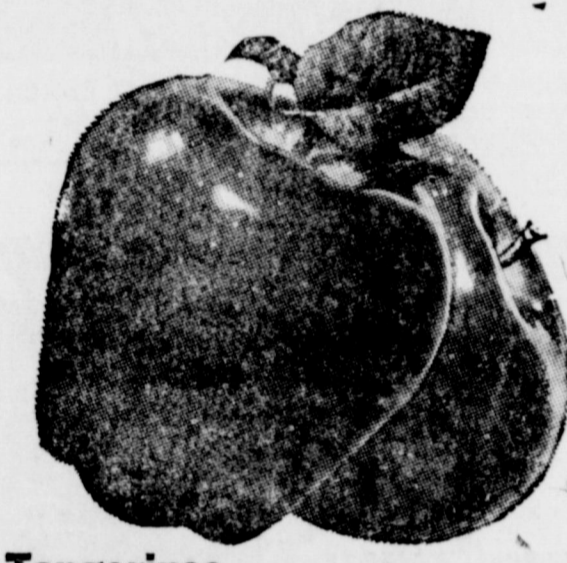
