(Continued from page 1) Mr. Hansen, who retired some 15 years ago as the head of a statewide highway and bridge paving contractor, had gone to his ranch shortly before lunch to feed cattle and repair a fence. When he did not return home as planned, Mrs. Hansen went to the ranch. He had collapsed and died as he worked on a fence.

A doctor was summoned and pronounced Mr. Hansen dead of an apparent heart atteck. He had suffered a serious heart attack in 1950 and two others since that time, but had been in good health for several years. He had managed his ranching interests at Nimrod and north of Cisco.




