Was Missing A Week, And Feared Dead

Reports At El Paso After Release; Captors Treated Him Well

APPARENTLY WAS HELD FOR RANSOM

Though Abductors Planned To Get Money From Scout Unit

EL PASO, Mar. 31 (IP)—Sher-iff Chris Fox, said today Robert Miller, Sanford, Ariz., boy scout executive, who had been missing since last Wednesday, had admit-ted his story of being kidnaped and held for ransom was a hear.

With tears in his eyes and a sob in his voice, Miller told the El Paso county sheriff he had "framed" the story so that he could "return to Safford without

He said he had hitch-biked to El Paso after abandoning his automobile near Duncan, Ariz, ad that he had "roamed around" there until his money gave out. Then, he said, he decided on the kidnap story.

EL PASO, Mar. 31 (AP)-Given up for dead, Robert M. Miller, Safford, Ariz., boy scout executive, walked into a control station of a natural gas company north of here today and told an amazing story of being abducted and held captive for a week in an adobe hut on the desert.

Held by Two Men Held by Two Men

His surprise return after relatives had given up hope of seeing
him alive again, brought to a sudden end the man hunt through
southcastern Arizona and southwestern New Mexico.

Taken immediately before Sher-iff Chris Fox, Miller told authorities he apparently had been held for tansom by two men. "I didn't ask the sidnerers," said Miller, "but I believe they were holding me with the idea of de-

manding ransom for my release from the national (Boy Scout) er-"The men did little talking ax-

cept to question me closely about the national Boy Scout organiza-tion, of its financial status and of my standing as an executive. They wanted to know if the organization could raise any large sum of cash on short notice."

Miller said he was stopped two miles west of Safford Wednesday morning and that he was released last night on a side road north of here after the kidnapers were satisfied he was a poor financial risk.
