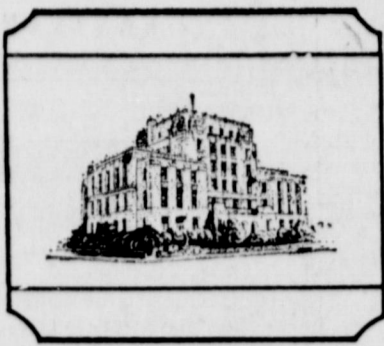

Taxi, Theft Trials Set Monday in 91st Court

A dramatic courtroom scene typical of television fare is expected in 91st District Court in Eastland Monday when two Georgia men are tried for robbery with firearms.

The two, Chester (Buddy) Breeden, 28, and Tommy Smith, 20, both of Canton, Ga., were indicted for the theft at gunpoint of a taxicab belonging to S. B. (Fritz) Jones, several months ago.

Answering a call, Jones reportedly picked the men up and was forced to head east. Jones was able to get away from the pair at River Bridge just east of Weatherford, and an all-night manhunt ensued, but was unsuccessful. The pair eluded officers and were picked up a few days later in Louisiana, from which they were retrieved and returned to the Eastland County Jail on Sept. 12. They have been there since — and according to Sheriff L. E. Sublett, have attempted four separate jail breaks.

Drama is possible in the appearance of Jones who has been under a physician's care since the incident, and was a patient at Eastland Memorial Hospital at week's end. He is the state's chief witness and might possibly make his appearance in the courtroom on a stretcher if he is able to do that, the sheriff said.

Judge E. H. Griffen will preside in the absence of Judge J. Frank Sparks who is recovering from recent surgery. (Continued on page 7)

Two Indicted For Murders With Malice

Four indictments were returned Thursday at 12:35 p. m. by a 91st District Court Grand Jury — two were for murder with malice and two were for burglary.

The grand jury indicted two persons for murder with malice, one of them the uncle of a Dallas physician who was shot to death near Ranger Nov. 6 and the other the wife of a Ranger man shot to death Nov. 13.

Ivan J. Allen, about 70, earlier was accused of murder without malice in the rifle death of Dr. Albert Reidel, 37, of Dallas. However the grand jury's indictment claimed malice, District Attorney Perry Brown reported.

The uncle was charged and was freed on \$5,000 bond. The bond was increased to \$10,000 after the indictment and he again went free on bond.

Mrs. Betty Sue Harvick of Ranger was indicted for murder with malice in the death of her husband, Melvin, who died in the Ranger hospital of four .22 caliber pistol wounds about midnight Nov. 13, received at the apartment house in Ranger.

She remained in Eastland County Jail Friday night in lieu of \$10,000 bond.

An indictment was returned against Stephen Otto Sanders of Gorman, who is now serving a term for auto theft, for two of several Gorman burglaries.

No formal report was issued by the grand jury and Presiding Judge E. H. Griffen of Olney excused the jury "until further notice." A new term of court begins Dec. 3, it was reported.

Eugene Baker of Gorman was foreman of the grand jury which went into session Monday morning.

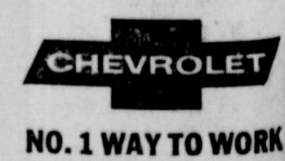

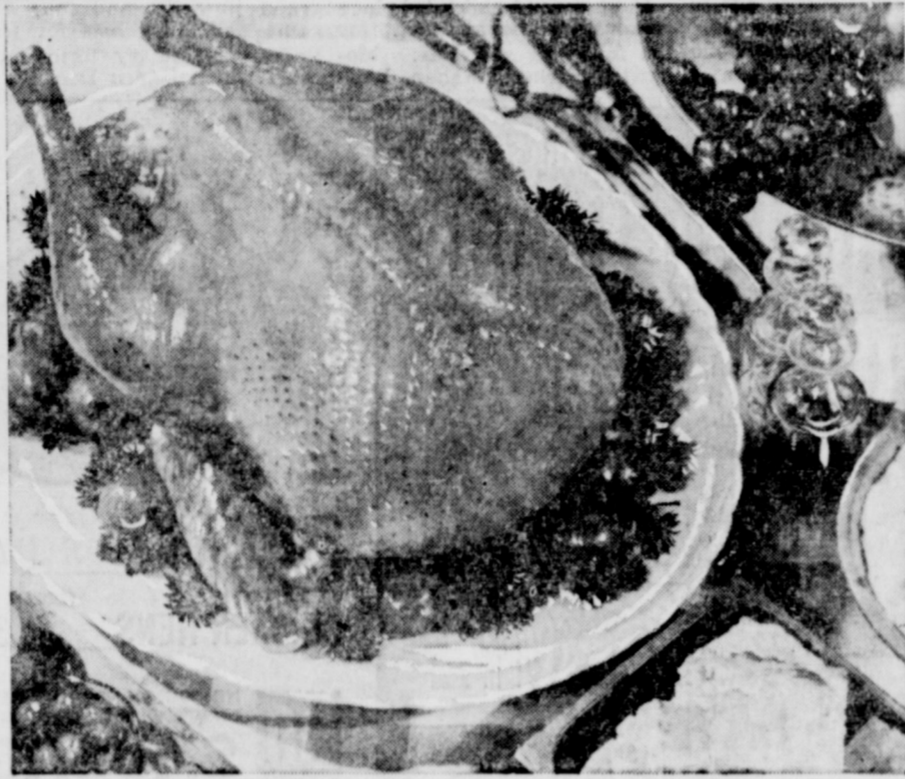

Marketing Quota Vote Scheduled For Tuesday

Peanut and cotton raisers Eastland County will vote on Tuesday, Nov. 21, to cast ballots in a marketing quota referendum for the next three crop years, according to a report by J. G. Meredith, county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service office manager.

Voting will be from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Chamber of Commerce in Cisco, the ASC office in Eastland, the community club house in Nimrod, the Roach Motor Co. in Rising Star, the Carbon Trading Co. in Carbon and the Smith Chevrolet Co. in Gorman.

Eligible to vote are those who share in the 1965 crop peanuts on a farm on which the acreage harvested exceeded one acre. A landlord of a standing rent, cash rent, or fixed rent tenant is not eligible to vote.

At least two-thirds of the votes are favorable, quotas will be in effect for the 1966-1967 and 1968 crops; market penalties will apply to "excess" crops and price supports will be available to growers who plant within their allotments.

If more than one-third of the voters oppose, the quotas and penalties will not be in effect for the 1966 crop, and the level of price support available to eligible growers will drop to 50 per cent of parity.

In such a case another referendum would be held in 1966 for the following three years. Eastland County plants very little cotton and those participating in the election will be mostly peanut growers, Mr. Meredith said. Eligible voters were urged to cast ballots in the election.

The 13th annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held on Dec. 10-11 at the Victor Hotel in Cisco, with the Cisco Chamber of Commerce and the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association cooperating.

All entries of nuts must be entered by 12 noon on Friday, Dec. 10; however, they may be sent or left at either the County Agent's office in Eastland or at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce or at Ranger Chamber of Commerce prior to this time, according to County Agent J. M. Cooper.

Growers are limited to one entry of each improved or

papershell variety. There is no limit on the number of entries of seedling or natives. These nuts must be left on display until 4 p.m. on Dec. 11, Cooper stated.

Judges for the event will be from Texas A&M University Extension Service and the Texas A&M University Horticulture Dept. They will judge the classes on size, color, appearance, shell thickness, cracking quality, kernel quality, attractiveness and other factors.

First, second and third place ribbons will be awarded for the following varieties: Mohawks, Burkett, Mahan, West-

tern Schley, Eastern Schley, Texas Prolific, Kincaid, Stuart, Commanche, Success, Barton, Delmas, Curtis, Onliwon, San Saba Improved, McCollie, Williamson, Hybrid Pecans (Gov. Crosses), Sioux, Halbert, Aggie, Desirable, John Garner, Brake, Squirrel's Delight, Choctaw, Perique, Wichita, Apache, Aultman, Ranger, Humble, Caper No. 64, Money Maker, Seedlings of a named variety and Native Pecans.

Another Deputy Is Needed

(An Editorial)

Ordinary talk suggests, and statistics prove, that there has been an increase of crime in Eastland County. News accounts punctuate the increase.

Pleas have been heard from competent law enforcement officials for funds to update their forces and provide the tools to combat modern crime. The Eastland County sheriff's department has been provided with some new equipment, including a tear-gas gun, road-block signs and miniature two-way radios.

And these are ideal pieces of equipment, but neither of them can arrest a prowler take a prisoner to Huntsville or Wichita Falls, or patrol at night. It takes manpower to do that.

And that's what Sheriff L. E. Sublett has asked for repeatedly — another deputy. Another man to assist with the regular duties and so that more night-time patrolling, a major crime preventive, can be done. Right now the sheriff and one deputy handle all the "outside" work which includes investigations, transportation of prisoners, delivering of citations, etc., with precious little time for patrolling the individual towns in the county.

The sheriff has been told that the constables in the various towns should be called on to help as needed. That won't work because constables aren't under the sheriff's jurisdiction, and he has no authority to request or demand their assistance, although they are most cooperative. And, too, they have their local jobs to do.

It is significant that Sheriff Sublett is not asking for luxury for his men or his office but rather for what he considers to be the bare minimum needed to operate his department. In a way, it is a pity that an elected official of a county that can boast of so many good things practically has to beg for funds to provide an absolutely essential service for the people who pay for it.

Surely the people of Eastland County would be horrified at the thought that our county might someday become one of those where it is not safe to be out of our homes at night. It has happened in much larger areas and smaller areas, and it can happen here.

This discussion is intended more as an expression of our views than a criticism of the commissioners court. All of us appreciate the fact that they have a big job to do in managing the affairs of our county.



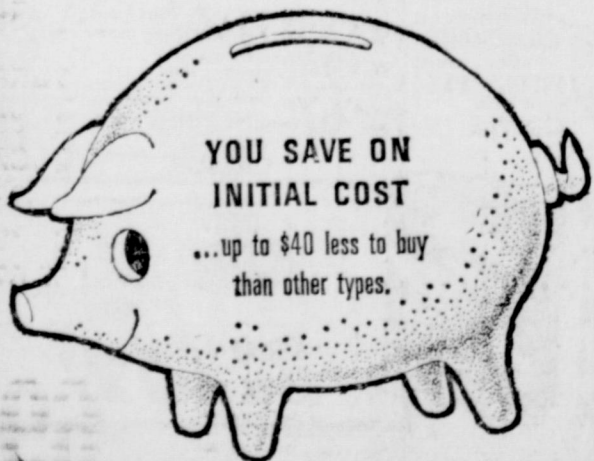
