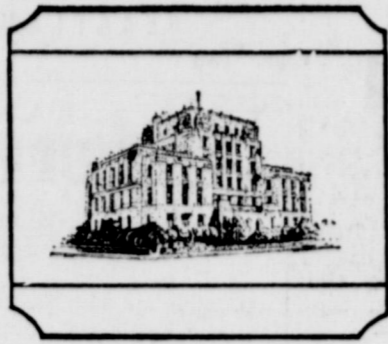

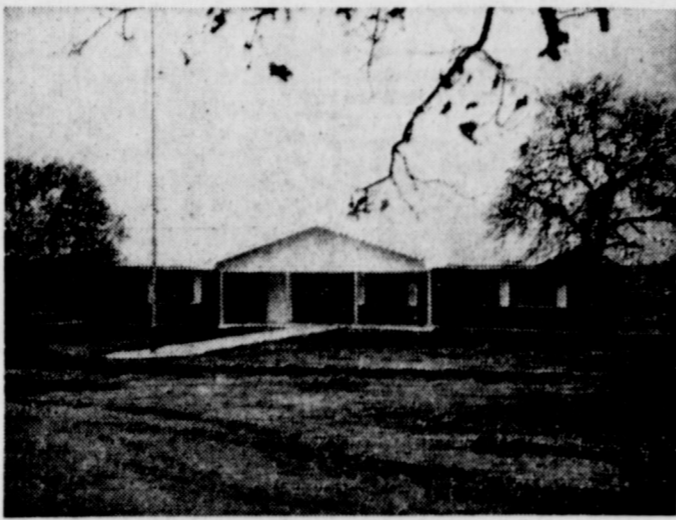

Open House At New VFW Post Until 5 Sunday Afternoon

Eastland's Karl and Boyd Tanner Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 4136 will celebrate the formal opening of its new \$60,000 club facilities on Lake Leon Road, Sunday with an open house for the public between the hours of 1 and 5 p.m. Post Commander John Roper of Ranger has announced.

The public is being invited to visit the elaborate post headquarters, located four miles east of Eastland, alongside FM 517.

The 20-year-old post, named for Karl and Boyd Tanner, brothers who were killed during World War II, was for most of its history located on the eastern edge of Eastland, alongside U. S. Highway 80. Purchase of the Post's original site (purchased in 1949 for \$6,000) by the Texas Co. necessitated the re-location. The Post bought

the M. G. Key 40-acre ranch on the Lake Road this past summer, and moved into the house there until the modern, new facility was completed.

Guests will find Sunday that the new facilities are really modern in every respect, featuring a 21 by 35 foot meeting room, a 22 by 40 foot game room, a 12 by 20 foot Auxiliary meeting room, and backed on the north by a 30 by 72 covered patio, and giant barbecue pit.

Organizer of the Post, which was chartered Aug. 6, 1945, with 46 members, was the late Karl K. White, who was the post's first commander from Nov. 23, 1945, until May 11, 1954. Sidney M. Fowler Jr. was the first commander of the post.

Of colonial architecture, the new post exterior is of antique brick, trimmed in white, with

four majestic columns. The interior is paneled in mahogany throughout, with terrazzo flooring. The ranchero pink brick work is repeated inside in the game area.

A native Eastland Countian, John Daniels, is manager of the Post, and he and his family will live in the original house on the site.

Other Post officers are W. N. Reese, Senior Vice Commander; Leo Brooks, Junior Vice Commander; Al Gaeto, Quartermaster; James Reid, Post Surgeon; Carl Timmons, Doyle Squires and James Young, Trustees; and J. M. Matthews, H. B. (Doc) O'Keefe and Roy Blair, Club Directors. Garland Brashier is Post Chaplain.

There are presently 104 members, with an active Auxiliary with 22 members. Mrs. Doug Garner is president of

the Auxiliary, with Mrs. E. Craven, senior vice-president; Mrs. Dodel Daniels, junior vice president; Ruth Astreaser; Modell Daniels, secretary; and Mrs. W. N. Reese, chaplain.

The Auxiliary, chartered August, 1961, is active in charity work, with a cancer driving program, and was the place winner with a float the Jaycees' recent Parade.

The entire membership of the Post is presently planning a barbecue for Dec. 11, Dan reports.

Highest membership of the Post was in 1953 when there were 275 active members roll, he said.

Farmers O.K. Peanut, Cotton Quotas; Nix Cotton Transfers

Eastland County peanut and cotton farmers voted in favor of quotas on those commodities for 1966, but declined by a small percentage, the "transfer" of cotton quota proposition in the Tuesday referendum balloting held at six polls in the county, Gilbert Meredith, County ASCS manager has reported.

Turn-out was considered good in view of the fact that the referendum was held early this year — and fell right in the middle of peanut harvesting time," Meredith said. Only about 200 of the some 800 eligible peanut farmers voted, and about 60 of the some 200 eligible cotton raisers turned out he said. Peanut harvest is considered to be about 60 per cent complete in the county, Meredith says.

The first of the three propositions, peanut quotas for 1966, carried almost unanimously, with 193 voting for and six against in county voting.

Cotton raisers voted 52 for, nine against, for the '66 quotas (carrying that proposition locally as well as nationally), but voted 39 for and 21 against the out-of-county cotton allotment transfer proposal. It was close in the county with 65 per cent voting for, but a 66 and two-thirds, (2-3) majority was necessary on the county-by-county basis, for passage.

Passage of the peanut quota measure means that quotas will be in effect for the 1966, 1967 and 1968 crops; marketing penalties will apply to "excess" peanuts; and price supports will be available

Proposition No. Three, aimed to sale or transfer cotton allotment outside county, meaning that this did not pass locally; raisers may not transfer allotments outside the county, but they can within county.

A total 62 votes were challenged (30 on peanuts, 16 cotton and 16 on sale transfers) with four of peanut votes disqualified, of the cotton votes disqualified, and two of the sale transfer votes disqualified cause of ineligibility.

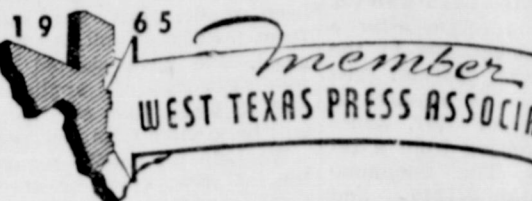

NASA's Spacemobile Visits Local Schools

Students and faculty of Eastland and County schools are participating in a demonstration program by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. The schools were visited by the Spacemobile last week.

Other audio-visual materials and experiments are a part of the Spacemobile demonstration equipment. These aids are used in demonstrating basic scientific principles and how these apply to the programs of NASA.

For instance, the lecturer traces the history of rocketry — from the early efforts of the Chinese in the 13th century, liquid fuel rocket research of America's Dr. Robert Goddard, and to the more recent success of the Germans and their V-2 missile.

The scientific principles of orbits and propulsion are discussed along with the men whose discoveries and vision paved the way to our present day exploration of outer space.

The students will learn about the various projects of the NASA as the lecturer explains them by utilizing authentic scale models of scientific payloads now exploring

outer space. They will explore together the benefits of communications and weather satellites, the scientific information derived from current scientific satellites, the hopes for those launched in the future, and the aims of international co-operation through space research.

The imagination of the students will respond to the lecturer's discussion of man's flight to the moon. He will explain not only the mechanics of the flights of Projects Gemini and Apollo but will provide an insight into the biological problems of man in a space environment.

Heretofore, almost any proof of age that was recorded five or more years before a claims application was filed would suffice. Now, the best and oldest evidence in existence must be secured.
 "First, we must find and use any evidence established before the claimant reached his 5th birthday, or be able to show that no such evidence exists," Tuley said. "Failing that, the same search is made for evidence recorded before the applicant reached age 11."
 "If there is no record as to age or birth prior to age 11, then the two oldest records made after that date will be used," he stated.
 Among sources that must be explored are city, county, or state birth records, infant baptismal records of certain churches, early school records, 1900 or 1910 census records, hospital or medical records dating back to early childhood, etc., according to Tuley.
 Prior to about 1920, only a small percentage of births were recorded promptly in Texas.
 He added that the study just completed indicated that about 5% of the aged applicants using recent proofs set up wrong ages, with about two out of every three such changes being to the benefit of the applicant. Applicants benefited when the early proof made them older than they now thought they were by either getting additional checks or higher amounts or both.
 "So, when you file for your social security from now on, bring the oldest possible proof; if you have no old proof, we'll help you try to locate some,"
