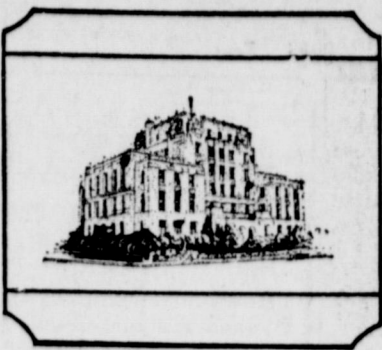

The Eastland Maverick Basketball team, coached by Coach Shirley Frazier, is at the present time sporting a 11-16 record at the mid-point of season play. Included in the winnings are two tournaments and a district 10-A game. The Eastland team has beaten such teams as Dublin Comanche, Baird, Albany, Olden Carbon, Gorman, and De Leon. Larry Wilson is on top in the scoring division, scoring 295 points this season. Larry averages 17 points per game. FORMER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS . . . A. M. Thurman, Former Official, Dies Wednesday

Funeral services for Almos Martin (Judge) Thurman, 76, were held at 2 p. m. Wednesday at the First Methodist Church in Gorman with Rev. S. A. Baker, pastor, and Rev. Marion Dennis, pastor of the Congregational Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was in Restland Cemetery in Carbon. Mr. Thurman, a former Eastland County Commissioner and a stock rancher, passed away at 9:05 a. m. Tuesday in Blackwell Hospital in Gorman after a two-week illness. He had been a resident of Gorman since 1939, moving there from Carbon, where he had resided for 20 years. He once served as a county commissioner for four terms from the Gorman precinct. Mr. Thurman was a prominent layman for more than 50 years, he was a steward and trustee at the First Methodist Church, Gorman. Survivors include his wife, the former Lydia Trimble; and several nephews and nieces.

New Hospital Facilities Are Nearing Completion

Under construction and near completion is a long awaited and much-needed wing at Eastland Memorial Hospital. The added space includes a dining area, conference and training room and storage room. The dining area has the capacity to serve 40 with an interior walled with ash paneling and fluorescent cool lighting. The acoustical ceiling and asbestos floor is done in white, the floor having gray designs. Mixed colored chairs and white round tables make up the dining sets. There is also a "serve-yourself" coffee bar for the personnels' convenience. The conference and training room will be used for holding business meetings and for training the personnel. The interior design is the same as the dining area. In the conference room

there is a storage room for beds and other equipment. Other, added features are a utility room and showers designed to aid those patients who are physically unable to help themselves. All windows have safety glass for safety purposes. This new wing has a separate unit for air conditioning and heating and the entire wing consists of 2500 sq. ft. of floor space. After the completion of this wing, construction will begin on a medical records room which will provide accommodations for the nurses staff. The room will be located on the north side of the hospital in the east wing and the four-foot entrance hallway will be between hospital rooms 22 and 23. Murice Coplen, head of the construction, said the room will contain 500 sq. ft. of floor space. Leon Musgrove, administrator of the hospital, said the additions to the hospital are being made to implement the new medicare system which goes into effect in July.
