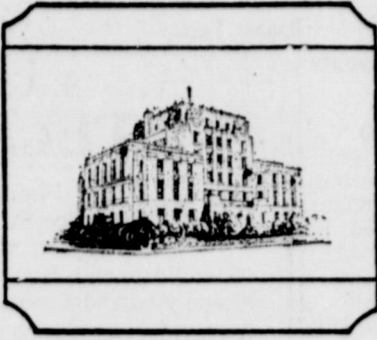

They were Lynne Pippen, 13-year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Irven Pippen, and Caddy Lee, 10-year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jimmie Lee.

Lynne's steer, named "Little'en," was named grand champion, and he weighed 850 pounds. The reserve champion steer was named "Rowdy." Both were Herefords.

Caddy also scored a victory with her crossbred lamb, which was named champion a pair of top ribbons to show of the show. This gave her her 4-H Club brothers, Tommie and Bobby, who usually are among the top winners.

Eddie Kincaid of Morton Valley, a 4-H Club member and son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kincaid, won first in the fine wool lamb show. Other winners with lambs included Bill Farnsworth, Cisco 4-H, son of Mr. and Mrs. Major Farnsworth, top animal in medium wool class; and Frank Kincaid, 12, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Kincaid and an Eastland 4-H Club member, top Southdown.

In the junior beef breeding show, as well as the open beef cattle show, the Hounsels of Rising Star 4-H took top honors in the Angus division.

Carter Hounsel, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. C. Hounsel, showed a Carter-bred Angus to the bull championship and overall breed title.

Sister Cynthia, 12, had the top Angus female and Carter, the reserve Angus heifer. In the junior Hereford division, the Williamson brothers, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Jasper Williamson, Ranger, had the top females.

Larry, 13, showed a Winston breed heifer to the championship of the Hereford class and to the overall championship. Larry's younger brother, Jerry, had the reserve Hereford female champion, which was also the overall female reserve champion.

## Joe Kilgore Key Speaker For Burleson Appreciation Event in Eastland Saturday

Cong. Omar Burleson will be guest of honor at an appreciation dinner Saturday, March 26, at the Eastland Elementary School when friends gather to honor their 17th Congressional District Representative.

Featured speaker will be the Honorable Joe W. Kilgore of Austin and dignitaries are expected from throughout the district, the state government and national scene.

Approximately 400 persons are expected and tickets are still available at several places in the county and district. Tickets are \$2.50 each and will include a catered buffet meal. Arrangements for the event are in charge of W. C. (Check) Smith of Gorman, assisted in that town by Ross Wilson, John Kimble and Dr. D. V. Rodgers.

## City 'Would' Sell Some Property In Airport Tract for Industrialization

A number of City Commissioners and four members of the Eastland County Industrial Foundation attended the City Commissioners meeting last Monday night at City Hall, according to City Manager Lewis Tiner.

Industrial Foundation mem-

bers Jack Arrington, Tom Wilson, Frank Sayre and M. H. Perry asked City Commissioners Tiner, Frank Deaton, Bill Hart, James Reid and Curtis Koon this question — "If an industrial prospect were found, what will the city take for the industrial site at the airport?"

Answer to this question was, "The city will try to extend utilities to this property and make it available to any industry at \$100 per acre, reserving 15 acres at the hanger and air strip." Also, for any industry that moves there, the city will make water available at city cost, plus ten percent, estimated to be about 32 cents per thousand gallons.

Commissioners stressed that the city will not take less than \$19,000, with city paying for utility improvement.

Also on the agenda, Commissioner Hart stated that he is making an investigation to see if J. P. Wells Dalton is eligible to serve as both corporation court judge and justice of peace at the same time. If eligible, he will be (Continued on page 7)

After receiving his law degree, he enlisted in July of 1941 in the Air Corps and served in the Mediterranean Theater as a combat pilot.
