# Stock Show Set To Open Next Thursday at Eastland

A total of 391 entries were reported Friday morning for the 1966 Eastland County Livestock Show which will be staged at Eastland next Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 17, 18 and 19.

More entries are expected before the event opens Thursday at the new show grounds north of the haydite plant.

Officials of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Assn., sponsors of the annual event, reported that 35 fat steers have been entered, 29 head of junior breeding beef, six dairy cattle, 109 fat lambs, 63 breeding sheep, 26 breed-

ing hogs, 92 fat hogs and 31 junior goats.

The entries by units: Carbon 4-H Club, 10; Cisco 4-H, 62; Eastland 4-H, 29; Gorman 4-H, 8; Morton Valley 4-H, 19; Olden 4-H, 17; Ranger 4-H, 24; and Rising Star 4-H, 13.

**OVER IN** Missouri, a doctor addressed a letter to his patients as follows:  
**TO ALL MY PATIENTS**  
"I did not write the medicare bill.  
"I am not sure I understand it.  
"I am not a government official.  
"I was not trained in political economy.  
"If you are not satisfied with your present, (1) medical costs or services, (2) hospital availabilities or cost, or (3) the cost of your drugs, there isn't much reason to talk it over with me — I am probably as dissatisfied as you are and probably much more confused.  
"There isn't much point in discussing with me the problems you have as a result of getting a whole new system of laws (regarding your medical care) to live by, because I don't yet understand what it is all about either.  
"May I humbly suggest, if you have a problem (and I sincerely hope you do not) that you write your representative or senator in the United States Congress. Most of them knew enough about the law to vote for it, and perhaps since they knew so much about it when it was voted on, they can give you answers to all your questions now. I can't.  
"Since my profession... is coming more and more under the control of the elected and appointed public officials in Washington, D.C., please do not expect me to become less and less a doctor. I can't. I won't. Therefore, the economic - legal - political questions that are troubling you should be taken to the experts in those fields for an appropriate answer.  
"In the meantime, remember me as the one who treats your arthritis, your blood pressure, your aches and pains. The one who is concerned with your long and comfortable physical life and — I hope — your mental stability in these trying hours."

## Mrs. Jim Horton Writes About World Tour

The following is a letter from Mrs. Jim (Lillian) Horton who, with her granddaughter, Donna Horton, left Dallas about one month ago for a round-the-world cruise:

We flew from Calcutta to Singapore last Monday. It was a beautiful flight on a beautiful plane—a Qantas 707 on her maiden voyage to Australia. She could accommodate 160 passengers.

We loved Singapore. It is a beautiful island just off Malaya. Since there is only a bridge to cross we drove onto the mainland. Singapore people are very proud that their economy is firm without help from any nation. 96 per cent of their children are in school.

Singapore is the fifth largest port in the world. We took a boat ride around the harbor and it is not only busy but also a pretty harbor with many islands scattered about. Some of the Army officers live on these islands.

The hotel is the famous Raffles advertised in Holiday, etc. It is built around a courtyard. This courtyard was a flower garden of flowers and colored lights reflecting upwards in blooming shrubbery.

While we flew across India, our ship, the Victoria, was coming around and met us in Singapore. There were 12 of us and 13 members of the Four Winds Cruise, who came by ship. We had a delightful reunion and compared notes on what we had done.

But they were sad. Just as they were putting down the gangplank for landing, a cable broke and two members of the crew fell into the sea. One of them was rescued but the other body was not found.

The Victoria is a small ship and, as I told you, is very intimate. Its passengers told us that there wasn't a dry eye among them or the crew when the accident occurred. The man not found was 42 years old and was the father of two children. It was the captain's last voyage before his retirement.

We left Singapore at 8 p.m. by the wonderful air line. Since there were many American diplomats having a conference here, we didn't get rooms in Erawan Hotel last night. Again I must say the hotels are wonderful. A large beautiful courtyard with lighted fountain and swimming pool. It is very hot and humid here. I'm wearing my mid-summer clothes.

We toured the city today. There are three million people in Bangkok. It has very wide clean streets and canals where boats bring wares to sell. Temples such as I've never dreamed of. Pictures can't show them as they are so large. One is two blocks square. Buddha religion predominates everything and we've seen dozens of statues or sculptures of Buddha—one in solid gold and one 160 feet long and 36 feet high. This was reclining.

Tomorrow morning, we rise at 6 a.m. to see the market place on the canal.

I'll finish about Thailand

since we leave in the morning for Hong Kong. The mornings trip on the river and canal was thrilling and delightful. People live all along the banks. A most solid housing (mostly slacks) but people here are happy and healthy. We saw more naked babies and little boys—hundreds of them swimming in what we would consider polluted water. But this is their trading area. Their boats were loaded with fruits and vegetables, lumber was being floated to market, etc.

We had a traffic jam on the canal. Toured again this afternoon. I've seen the most beautiful temple in the world. It was the private property of King of Siam until ten years ago when it was opened to public. The government has King and Queen and runs by Parliament. The King has a yellow Rolls Royce. I must read "The King and I" when I return.

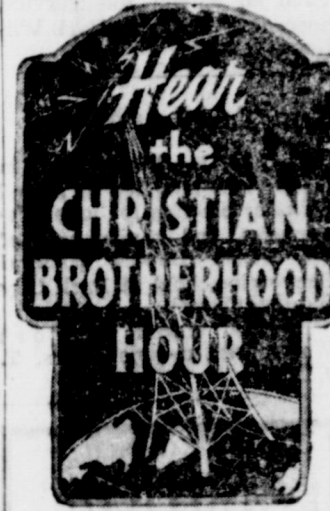

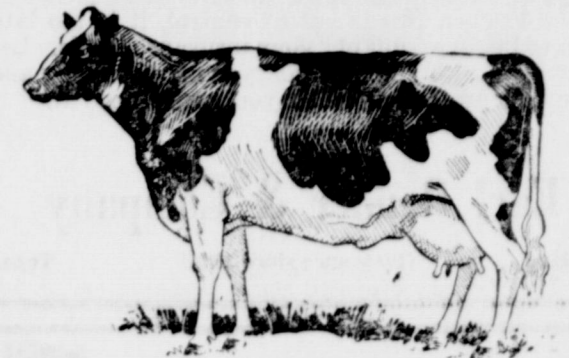

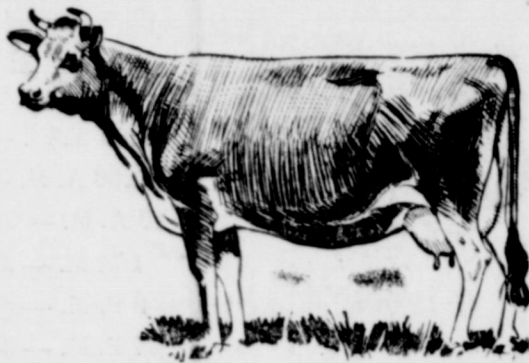

**Rules And Regulations For '66 Livestock Show**

1. All animals to be shown must be in their places by 10:00 P. M. Thursday, March 17, 1966.
2. No animals in breeding classes may be removed from the show until 4:00 P. M., Saturday, March 19. Animals in the fat classes that will be sold at auction may be removed any time after 2:00 P. M. Saturday, March 19.
3. Sick or injured animals must be removed as soon as possible upon discovery. Anyone taking animals out of the show before release time will be barred from future shows and all prize money will be forfeited.
3. Judges' decisions will be final.
4. The Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association shall not be liable in any manner for loss, injury and/or accident to any person, animal or equipment at or during the show, either exhibitor or spectator.
5. All exhibitors are expected to keep their part of the aisles clean and neat at all times.
6. All animals in the breeding classes must be representative of their breed but do not need to be either purebred or registered.
7. The open show will include adults in Eastland and adjoining counties as well as junior exhibitors from adjoining counties.
8. The Junior Show will be open to 4-H and FFA members of Eastland County only. They must attend a public school in Eastland County. They must have fed, fitted and cared for the animal under the supervision of a vocational agriculture teacher or county agent or assistant county agent to be eligible to show.
9. Breeding animals entered by junior exhibitors must have been owned by Jan. 15, 1966.
10. Lambs that will not grade at least good; steers that will not grade at least good; and fat barrows that will not grade at least U. S. No. 3 will be sifted.
11. All entries in the Junior Classes must be turned in to the General Superintendent by Jan. 15, 1966.
12. The fat animal division is open to Juniors only.
13. In classes with less than three entries the judge will decide what place the animal will get.
14. The superintendent and assistant superintendent of each division is responsible only for his particular division.
15. Entries are limited to 2 animals per class in both the breeding and fat divisions except for Chapter of 4-H Club. A Chapter or 4-H Club may show 5 animals.
16. Fat animals may not be shown in a breeding class.
17. All breeding classes of livestock in the open show will compete for ribbons only. Only the FFA and 4-H Club boys and girls are eligible to show in the Junior Division to receive any cash premiums in any breeding class.
18. Entry fees of 50 cents each for sheep, lambs, goats and hogs and \$1 for each cow and calf will be charged each exhibitor, either Junior or open.
19. No exhibitor, adult or junior, will be allowed to spend the night at the show grounds. Curfew starts at 11:00 P. M. on Thursday and Friday nights. Grounds will be policed by members of the Eastland County Sheriff's Posse.

each class will be placed.

12. Fat lambs must be shown in their wool. Customary blocking and trimming will be allowed.

13. Steers must be dry lot only. They must have been taken off dam or nurse cow on or before Nov. 1, 1965.

14. Steers must still have milk teeth at the time of classifying and sifting to be eligible to show.

15. Lambs must grade at least good. Steers must grade at least good and fat hogs must grade at least U. S. No. 3 or be sifted.

16. Each exhibitor is limited to 2 steers, 2 fat hogs and 2 fat lambs, except 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters may show 5 lambs, 5 fat hogs, and 2 steers.

17. Eligible fat stock can be sold at a special auction sale on Saturday night, March 19 at the Eastland Sales Barn at 7:00 P.M. Exhibitors do not have to sell unless they wish to do so. Only 4-H and FFA Junior exhibitors are eligible to sell.

18. After the lambs in each class are graded, the judge will place the top ten and pick a champion and reserve champion. These Champions will not be shown against Champions of other classes.

19. A fat yearling sheep class is for those exhibitors whose lambs have broken the gum tooth. Must not have useable permanent teeth.

20. In conjunction with the steer show a rate of gain contest is held. Each steer entered in this contest must have been weighed at the official weigh in Oct. 30, 1965, and the weight recorded by the show Superintendent. After the second weigh in held Friday, March 18th the Beef Cattle Superintendents will determine the placings in this contest.

21. Checks for all animals sold at auction will be mailed to exhibitors Monday or Tuesday following the sale Saturday night.
