He still is wearing a bandage as proof of the deadliness of the red dotted creature, and has had a rough time of it. But that wasn't enough, it seemed. "Years come and go, but Eastland keeps going."

So says Marvin Garrett, state editor of the Fort Worth Press. Garrett had a fine article concerning Eastland in his column, "The Westexan," in Tuesday's edition of the Press, under a headline which read, "Eastland is Growing, There's Plenty Water."

We're gonna write Garrett thanking him for the plug, and you will too if you think about it a second.

Here's the story, in case you missed it:

"Dry years come and go, but Eastland keeps going."

"Residents here don't claim dry weather isn't hurting, but they're not letting it stand in the way of progress."

"At least \$700,000 in construction projects are underway in Eastland."

"The five-story Petroleum Building, recently purchased by the Moody interests, is getting a complete remodeling job with air-conditioning."

"The steel framework already is up on a new factory being constructed by the Hollywood Building Co. of California, manufacturer of women's wear. The plant, when it goes into production, is expected to employ around 400 women with an annual payroll of about half a million dollars."

"A food store chain is spending about \$275,000 in making preparations to serve this area."

"Why all the growth in dry times? There's still plenty of water in Lake Leon, the new lake that serves the cities of Eastland and Ranger."

"The lake is nearly full and there seems to be no indication that there'll be any water rationing here in the near future."

"Now a third community, Olden, is getting water from the lake."

"The residents of Olden, who number about 600, formed the Olden Water Supply District, bought pipe and laid a line to the 14-inch main which brings water from Lake Leon to Eastland."

"Citizens of Olden were charged a connection fee and are billed by Eastland for their water each month. They pay the same rate the Eastland householders pay."

"Residents here have their eyes on the future of a deep strata of high-grade limestone rock that runs beneath the earth's surface here."

"Tests have shown the rock is highly suitable for cement. So they're hoping for a cement factory to boost the county's industrial potential."

Curtis Boase Is New Assistant County Agent

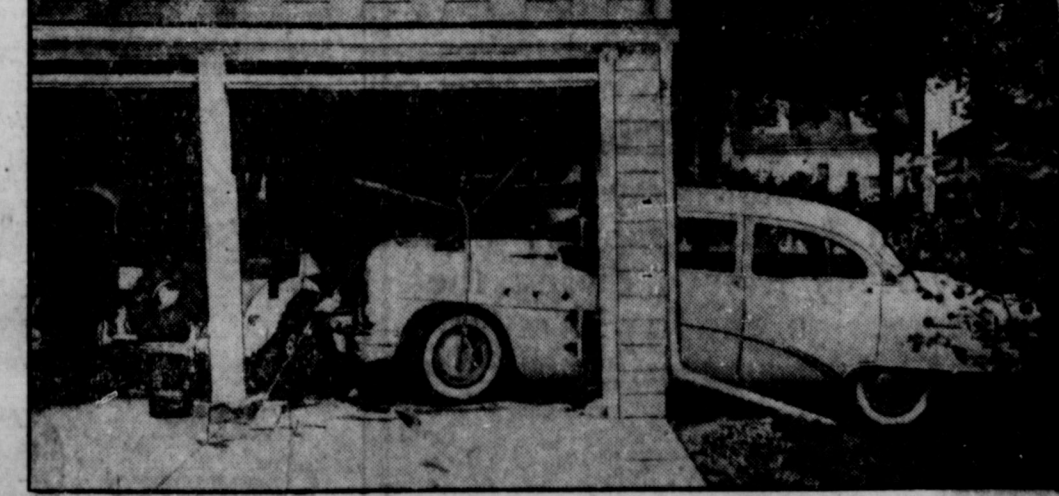
Curtis L. Boase, 27, has been named assistant county agricultural agent in Eastland county.

Four Ex-Convicts Face Charges Of Theft Here

Eastland County Added To Drouth Feed Program

Eastland County has been added to the list of Texas counties eligible to participate in the emergency drouth feed program, Cong. Omar Burleson advised in the Telegram by telegram from Washington today.

Eastland, Callahan, Comanche, Erath, Hamilton, Jones, Palo Pinto, Stephens and Taylor counties were included in the program, which permits farm operators to graze forage crops placed in the acreage reserve of the Soil Bank program.

The fact that these counties had not been included in the emergency drouth feed program left farmers who had placed some of their wheat land in the acreage reserve with the prospect of having to destroy some needed forage crops.

A number of farmers in the area had planted wheat land in maize and other grain sorghums after they failed to make a wheat crop. As soon as official word is received by the county ASC offices they will be permitted to turn livestock in to graze the sorghums.

Homer P. Cole, county supervisor of the Farmers Home Administration, said he received word of the program today. He said applications from farmers and ranchers would be taken through August 31 to provide feed for basic livestock herds through Sept. 30.

Negroes Admit Part In Theft Of Money

Four Fort Worth Negro ex-convicts were charged with "theft over \$50" in Eastland Monday following the arrest of three of the suspects in Fort Worth.

The four are charged with taking \$74 from the Eastland Piggy Wiggly Store two weeks ago. They were identified as Howard Carter, Lonell Robert Smith, Charles Lee Smith and John Earl Bogan.

Carter and L. R. Smith were returned to Eastland late Tuesday by Chief of Police Ray Laney. Sheriff J. B. Williams and Chief Deputy Sheriff Johnny Boyd. Charles Smith remains in the Tarrant County jail facing a felony complaint there and Bogan is still free.

Chief Laney credited quick thinking by Preston Crabtree, a Piggy Wiggly clerk, with the arrest of the four suspects. Crabtree became suspicious when the Negroes were in the store and jotted down their car's license number on his apron as they drove away.

Two Negroes, who police identified as Carter and Lonell Smith, went into Piggy Wiggly's, and Carter distracted Crabtree's attention by asking for a package of cigarettes while Smith reached in the cash register drawer and took the money.

They admitted to local officers that they took \$20. A check revealed that \$74 was missing from the cash drawer, however. Crabtree became suspicious and followed the Negroes, who were joined by a third man in the store, to the door. From there he saw them climb into a 1953 Oldsmobile driven by the fourth Negro. He took down their license number as they drove away. Then he returned and checked the money in his cash drawer. When he discovered some was actually missing, he notified Eastland police, who immediately set up road blocks. The suspects escaped, however.

Radio Operator Billy Jack Johnson then checked with Stephenville officers to find out who owned the car. A number mix-up started police.

Erath and Hamilton counties are in charge of the program, and entertainment will be provided by two Texas Highway Patrol sharpshooters.

Eastland Little League play will draw to a close here tonight when the Lions meet the Medics and the Comets play the Bulldogs.

Following the games, members of the all-star team will be named, and pens will be presented to each member. Two managers for the All-Stars will also be named.

The Lions will also be awarded the trophy annually presented the winning team by the Eastland Telegram.

An interesting angle to tonight's game will be the battle for second place honors. Presently the Medics have the lead, but in all likelihood the Comet-Lions game which was ruled no-contest earlier in the season will likely have to be replayed before second place honors can be determined.

City Asks Help In Preventing Trash Fires

A reminder that this is "the worst time possible for trash and rubbish fires" was issued today by City Manager James W. Young.

Young, urging help of Eastland citizens to keep down possible fire losses, said, "Dry grass, in this time of high temperatures and low humidity is at the most explosive stage. Please do not set grass fires even though there is no wind. A fire will create its own wind and scatter sparks great distances."

"During the first seven months of 1956, we have had 14 fires caused from burning trash and rubbish. The City is picking up trash twice weekly during June, July, August and September, so there is little reason for burning."

"The garbage collectors' job is had enough at best, but when they empty a trash can that has ashes left from burning, the ashes cover them from head to foot. Then, careful as they are, once in a while they will get a few sparks from a can that someone has burned trash in, and they then must dump the whole load right where they are. Many times the hydra-

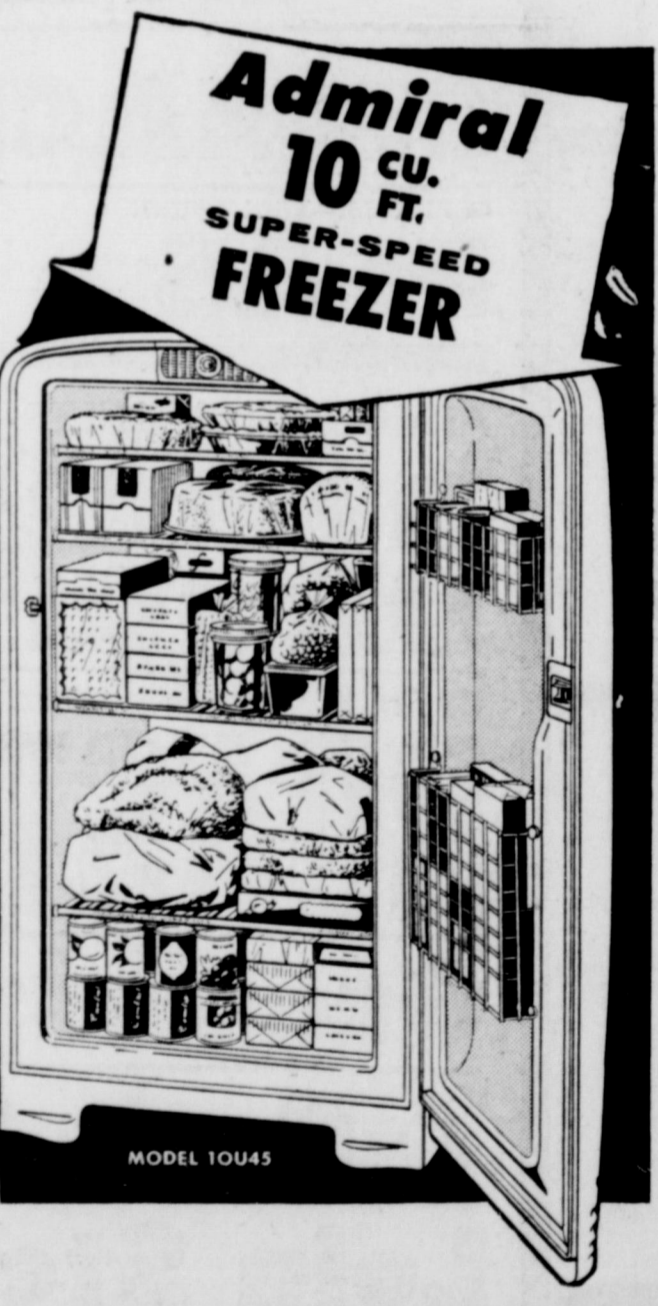
