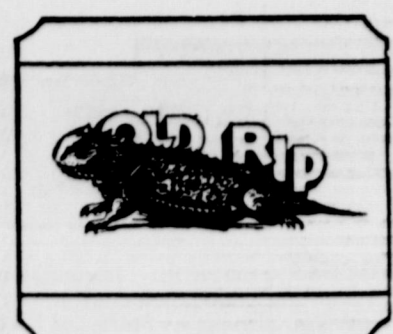

Pullmans Celebrate 40th Date At Eastland Iron & Metal Co.

Henry Pullman, owner of Eastland Iron and Metal, will be celebrating his 40 years of business here in Eastland this week and is doing a good deed for his many faithful customers and all the fine citizens of Eastland. He will be treating everyone to free coffee at any cafe or restaurant in town, from Monday morning until 6 p.m. Also during the day Monday, free cold drinks will be given at Eastland Iron and Metal. Henry founded his establishment in 1926, three years after moving to Eastland. The company was first located just across the tracks from the freight depot. In 1930, it was moved to its present location, Highway 80 east. During the many years of business here, Henry has strived to make a good citizen (which he has certainly

done). He has conducted an honest and fair business, "Shooting squarely with all men." In the beginning, he adopted the slogan "Square dealings — year round." He has been liberal in all matters of civic welfare and charities. A native of Lithuania Henry came to the United States in 1913 and joined the Army in 1917 and received his discharge in May of 1920 in Dallas. He and Mrs. Pullman were married in Dallas in 1921. They have one daughter Mrs. Jack (Mozelle) Katz of Hialeah, Fla. and one son, Saul who is now an Eastland lawyer. The Pullman family moved to Eastland in 1923. Mr. Pullman came with the thought of selling some land for his father-in-law. He bought the property himself and went into the grocery business. He remained with that occupation until 1926 when his present business was established. During his 40 years of business here, car load after car load of scrap has been shipped from Eastland. In 1945, he built the Pullman Supply store and operated a retail appliance store there until 1952 when he leased the building to Hollywood Corset Company. He now operates Pullman Supply from his Iron and Metal Co. building. Currently the company has six employees. Lee Garrett has been with the organization since it began and is now a part-time worker. Other workers are Luther Purdum, Joe Fox, Marlin McMull, Frank Ford and Homer Green. Pullman is a member of the Eastland Rotary Club, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Masonic Lodge and the Knights of Pythias. He is a 32nd degree Mason and a Shriner.

Convicts To Talk In Meetings In Eastland County This Week

"Operation Teenager" will be presented in Eastland County Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, June 21, 22 and 23, according to County Home Demonstration Agent Beverly Nicholson. The program is being sponsored by the Family Living Committee, a sub-committee of the Eastland County Program Building Committee. Advisors on this committee are Mrs. Nicholson and Assistant County Home Demonstration Agent Miss Wanda Watson. Students of his county had the privilege of hearing this program last fall and enjoyed it thoroughly. "Operation Teenager" resulted from the feeling of four inmates of the Texas Department of Correction, that serving a sentence doesn't repay a thing. Their aim through the program, is to steer others away from the errors they have made. The increasing number of young people involved is one of the most despairing features of the present crime explosion. About 40 percent of the population of the Texas Department of Corrections is between the ages of 17 and 24. This is only part of the tragic situation. It has been the goal of the Family Living Committee to help the youth of this county understand the responsibility of adulthood, marriage and job. Everyone is urged to make plans to attend this program. June 21 — 12:00 - 1:00 p.m., Eastland, White Elephant Restaurant, the Lions and Rotary Clubs will meet together for the program. June 22 — 12:00 - 1:00 p.m., Cisco, Victor Hotel. June 23 — 12:00 - 1:00 p.m., Ranger, Paramount Hotel. Due to limited space the attendance at the above meetings is being limited to club members and their invited guests. On Wednesday, June 22, the program will be presented, beginning at 7:30 p.m., at the First Methodist Church in Cisco. There will be no charge and everyone is cordially invited to attend.

Turbulent Weather Leaves Heavy Rainfall Throughout This County

Turbulent storm clouds swept across Eastland County and Central Texas Friday and early Saturday to leave up to six inches of rain and minor damage from high winds and lightning. Heaviest rainfall in the county was reported in Eastland where the two-day total measured six inches. The dark clouds were accompanied by an electrical storm during the noon hour Friday. Lightning hit a house in Cisco with minor damage and an oil field installation north of Eastland with damage to electric pumping equipment. Cisco reported 2.2 inches of rain early Saturday to go with 1.3 inches Friday for a total of 3.5 for the week. Cisco had received 3.3 inches a week before. No damages from high water were reported. Ranger got 1.5 inches Friday and 2.1 inches early Saturday for 3.6 total. The Lone Star Gas Company's pressure maintenance plant at Pueblo measured 3.5 inches Friday and some 2 inches early Saturday. Scranton, Nimrod, Carbon, Gorman, Rising Star and other areas in this section reported good rains. Farm leaders said the "peanut country got a good soaking," and planting will be resumed in full force as soon as the ground is dry enough. The good rain at this time was expected to result in all of the allotted peanut acres being planted—more than 35,000. Lake Leon, which serves Eastland, Olden and Ranger, was going over the spillway. Lake Cisco was at a modern high mark with some two feet of new water. Heavy rains to the north and west was expected to cause Lake Cisco to receive water for several days, and Lake Bernie was full and spilling into the creek connecting to Lake Cisco. The rain caused the postponement of the annual Lakeside Country Club golf tournament one week. The Eastland event was scheduled to begin Friday and to be played through Sunday.

Survivors include his wife; one son, John Allen; one sister, Mrs. Bert Young of Ranger.

Grady Allison of Houston, Nelson Allison of Odessa and James Allison of Vigo Park; three sisters, Mrs. Weems Dykes of Irving, Mrs. Elmer Foster of Coleman and Mrs. Bill Beaty of Robert Lee; and several nieces and nephews. Rev. Allison was a salesman for a loan company that builds churches.

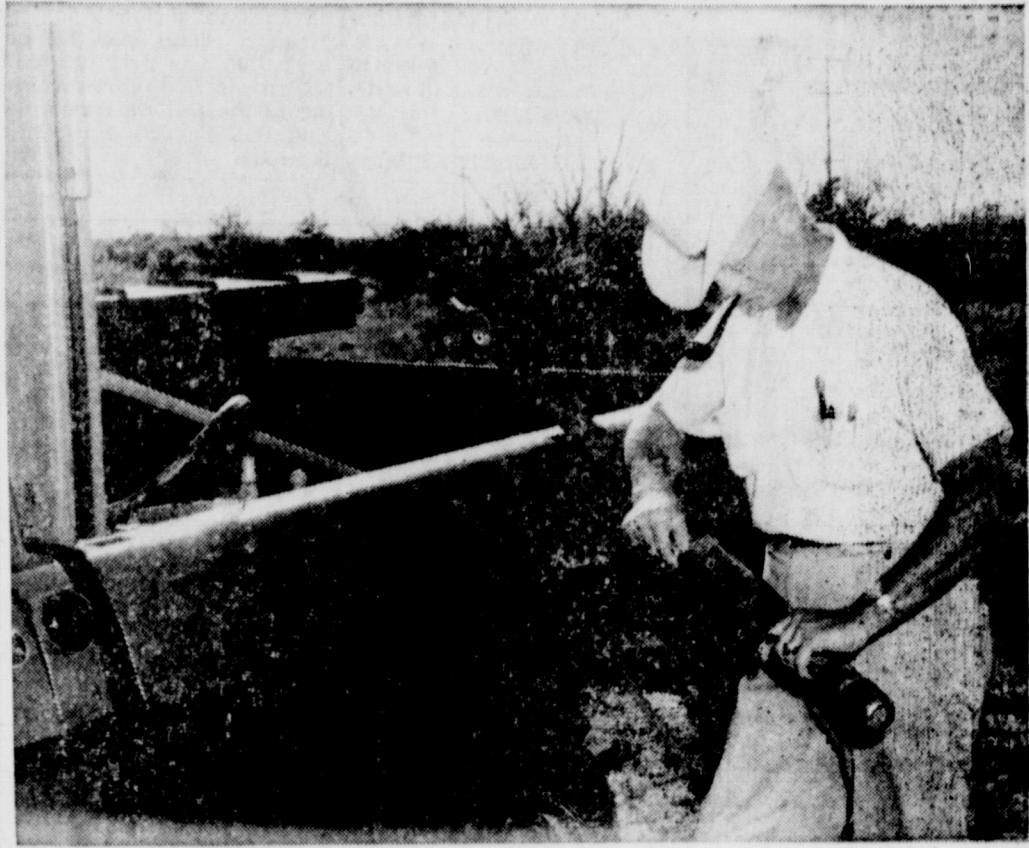

Inventory Of Land Resources Is Place To Start Improving

By SCS SERVICE
"What are you doing?" This is the question most often asked of a soil scientist. His usual reply is "Making a soil survey."
What is a soil survey?
A soil survey is an inventory of land resources. It tells us the kinds of soils, the acreage of each soil and where it is located.

Why are they made?
Soil is our most important natural resource. The more we know about it the better we can use and protect it. If your house burns or is blown away, you can build another and possibly better one.

But, if the soil is washed away or is blown away there is no more. The soil that we have now is all there is. No more is being made.

There are some fields that once produced one and one-half bales of cotton per acre. Some of these same fields now produce only a weak stand of

needle grass. Why is a soil survey being made? It is to help the land owner plan the use of each piece of ground so that it will produce as much for his grandchildren as it does for him.

How is a survey made?
Surveys are made by trained soil scientists. The soil scientist examines the soil by digging holes. He notes
